- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 20.1-03-12 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to a fee for a nonresident landowner trapping license; and to
- 3 amend and reenact section 20.1-03-07 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to trapping
- 4 by nonresidents who own land in North Dakota.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 20.1-03-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 20.1-03-07. Licenses to hunt, trap, or fish required of nonresidentsRestrictions on

9 <u>hunting, trapping, and fishing by nonresidents - Required licenses</u>.

- 11 <u>1. Except</u> as provided in sections 20.1-02-05, 20.1-03-07.3, and 20.1-03-08, <u>a</u>
- 12 <u>nonresident</u> may not:
- 13 Hunt, catch, take, or kill any small game without a nonresident small game 1. а. 14 license. The nonresident small game license entitles the nonresident to hunt 15 small game for any period of fourteen consecutive days or any two periods of 16 seven consecutive days each. The hunting period for which the license is valid 17 must be designated on the license. A nonresident small game license is not 18 required to hunt waterfowl under section 20.1-03-07.1 or wild turkeys under 19 section 20.1-04-07. A nonresident may purchase more than one nonresident 20 small game license per year.
- 21 2. <u>b.</u> Trap, catch, attempt to catch, take, or kill any protected fur-bearing animal,
 22 except that nonresidents:
- 23 (1) <u>A nonresident holding a valid nonresident fur-bearer and nongame hunting</u>
 24 license may hunt only fox and coyote and except that residents;
