1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 50-24.1 and a new subsection to

2 section 54-44.3-12 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to medical assistance coverage

3 of services provided by marriage and family therapists and the state job classification index; to

4 amend and reenact subsection 10 of section 25-03.1-02, subdivision d of subsection 2 of

5 section 26.1-36-08, and paragraph 1 of subdivision f of subsection 2 of section 26.1-36-09 of

6 the North Dakota Century Code, relating to commitment procedures and insurance coverage for

7 substance abuse and mental health; and to direct the department of human services to submit a

8 plan.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

10 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 10 of section 25-03.1-02 of the North Dakota

11 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- 12 10. "Mental health professional" means:
- a. A psychologist with at least a master's degree who has been either licensed or
 approved for exemption by the North Dakota board of psychology examiners.
- b. A social worker with a master's degree in social work from an accredited
 program.
- 17 c. A registered nurse with a master's degree in psychiatric and mental health
 18 nursing from an accredited program.
- 19d. A registered nurse with a minimum of two years of psychiatric clinical experience20under the supervision of a registered nurse as defined by subdivision c or of an21expert examiner.
- 22 e. A licensed addiction counselor.
- f. A licensed professional counselor with a master's degree in counseling from an
 accredited program who has either successfully completed the advanced training

beyond the master's degree as required by the national academy of mental
 health counselors or a minimum of two years of clinical experience in a mental
 health agency or setting under the supervision of a psychiatrist or psychologist.
 <u>A licensed marriage and family therapist with a master's degree.</u>

5 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subdivision d of subsection 2 of section 26.1-36-08 of the
6 North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

7 In the case of benefits provided for outpatient treatment, the benefits must be d. 8 provided for a minimum of twenty visits for services covered under this section in 9 any calendar year, provided the diagnosis, evaluation, and treatment services are 10 provided within the scope of licensure by a licensed physician, or a licensed 11 psychologist who is eligible for listing on the national register of health service 12 providers in psychology, or the treatment services are provided within the scope 13 of licensure by a licensed addiction counselor or a licensed marriage and family 14 therapist. The insurance company, nonprofit health service corporation, or health 15 maintenance organization may not establish a deductible or a copayment for the 16 first five visits in any calendar year, and may not establish a copayment greater 17 than twenty percent for the remaining visits. The deductible limitation of this 18 subdivision does not apply to a high-deductible health plan used to establish a 19 health savings account pursuant to and as defined in section 223 of the Internal 20 Revenue Code [26 U.S.C. 223].

SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Paragraph 1 of subdivision f of subsection 2 of section
 26.1-36-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

23 In the case of benefits provided for outpatient treatment, the benefits must f. (1) 24 be provided for a minimum of thirty hours for services covered under this 25 section in any calendar year if the treatment services are provided within the 26 scope of licensure by a nurse who holds advanced licensure with a scope of 27 practice within mental health or if the diagnosis, evaluation, and treatment 28 services are provided within the scope of licensure by a licensed physician, 29 a licensed psychologist who is eligible for listing on the national register of 30 health service providers in psychology, a licensed professional clinical 31 counselor who is gualified in the clinical mental health counseling specialty

1	in this state, a licensed marriage and family therapist, or a licensed
2	independent clinical social worker.
3	SECTION 4. A new section to chapter 50-24.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
4	and enacted as follows:
5	Medical assistance - Services provided by marriage and family therapists.
6	The department of human services shall provide medical assistance to eligible recipients for
7	services provided by marriage and family therapists licensed under chapter 43-53.
8	SECTION 5. A new subsection to section 54-44.3-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is
9	created and enacted as follows:
10	Include the profession licensed marriage and family therapist in the North Dakota job
11	classification index classification for advanced clinical specialist.
12	SECTION 6. DEPARTMENT TO SUBMIT AMENDED PLAN. Within thirty days of the
13	effective date of section 4 of this Act, the department of human services shall submit for
14	approval an amended plan to implement section 4 of this Act.
