4	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 39-01-01 of the North Dakota Century							
5	Code is amended and reenacted as follows:							
6	2. "Authorized emergency vehicles":							
7		a.	"Cla	ass A" authorized emergency vehicles means:				
8			(1)	Vehicles of a governmentally owned fire department.				
9			(2)	Vehicles when operated by or under the control of a police officer having				
10				authority to enforce the provisions of this title or by a salaried employee of a				
11				municipal police department within the municipality or by a sheriff or deputy				
12				sheriff not including special deputy sheriffs, or by the director of the				
13				department of corrections and rehabilitation and the director's authorized				
14				agents who have successfully completed training in the operation of class A				
15				authorized emergency vehicles.				
16			(3)	Vehicles clearly identifiable as property of the department of corrections and				
17				rehabilitation when operated or under the control of the director of the				
18				department of corrections and rehabilitation.				
19			(4)	Ambulances and other vehicles authorized by licensure granted under				
20				chapter 23-27.				
21			(5)	Vehicles operated by or under the control of the director, district deputy				
22				director, or a district deputy game warden of the game and fish department.

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1		(7)	Vehicles designated for the use of the adjutant general or assistant adjutant
2			general in cases of emergency.
3		(8)	Vehicles operated by or under the control of the director of the parks and
4			recreation department.
5		(9)	Vehicles operated by or under the control of a licensed railroad police officer
6			and used for law enforcement purposes.
7		(10)	Vehicles operated by or under the control of the state forester.
8		(11)	Vehicles operated by or under the control of the bureau of criminal
9			investigation and used for law enforcement purposes.
0		(12)	Vehicles operated by or under the state department of health in cases of
11			emergencies.
2		<u>(13)</u>	Vehicles used or operated by governmental search and rescue personnel
3			while performing emergency operations or duties. As used in this paragraph,
4			"search and rescue" means deployment, coordination, and use of available
5			resources and personnel in locating, relieving the distress, and preserving
6			the life of and removing an individual who is missing, trapped, or lost in the
7			backcountry, remote areas, or waters of the state. The term includes water
8			and dive rescue.
9	b.	"Cla	ss B" authorized emergency vehicles means wreckers and such other
20		eme	ergency vehicles as are authorized by the local authorities.
21	C.	"Cla	ss C" authorized emergency vehicles means:
22		(1)	Vehicles used by the state division of homeland security or local division of
23			emergency management organizations.
24		(2)	Vehicles used by volunteer firefighters while performing their assigned
25			disaster and emergency responsibilities.
26		(3)	Vehicles, other than ambulances, used by emergency medical services
27			personnel.
28		<u>(4)</u>	Vehicles used by volunteer search and rescue personnel if performing an
29			emergency operation or duty upon the request of a state entity, political
30			subdivision, or volunteer fire department. A volunteer organization may
31			classify a personal vehicle as a class C emergency vehicle if needed to

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1	assist in a search and rescue operation in accordance with this paragraph.
2	As used in this paragraph, "search and rescue" means deployment,
3	coordination, and use of available resources and personnel in locating,
4	relieving the distress, and preserving the life of and removing an individual
5	who is missing, trapped, or lost in the backcountry, remote areas, or waters
6	of the state. The term includes water and dive rescue.
