Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB1306 amends several sections relating to the Professional Practices Commission (PPC) & the Nebraska Department of Education (NDE).

The PPC will be eliminated & the State Treasurer will transfer any remaining money within the Professional Practices Commission Fund to the Certification Fund.

The maximum fee that can be collected for each teaching certificate or permit issued by the Commissioner & is valid for all Nebraska schools will be lowered from \$75 to \$65.

NDE will now handle rules & regulations for the standards of ethics & competency for Nebraska public school educators, promoting understanding of the adherence to the standards, & providing an orderly method of resolving disputes arising over alleged failure of an educator to adhere to the standards.

The ending balance of the Professional Practices Commission Fund as of 12/31/23 was approximately \$820,000. Any remaining balance in the fund on the effective date of the act will be transferred to the Certification Fund.

Explanation of Estimate:

LB1306 eliminates the Professional Practices Commission and would have a hearing officer carry out the duties currently assigned to the PPC. The bill also transfers cash funds paid by applicants for a certificate or permit back to the Certification Fund from the PPC Funds.

The fees for applications are currently set by the Commissioner and statute sets the maximum amount of any fee at \$75. The bill reduces the maximum amount to \$65.

Here is the spending for PPC for fiscal years 2022 and 2023 and what they have expended through December of fiscal year 2024. The "Operations" costs include the lawyer and court reporter which by statute (being repealed in the bill) has been up to \$15,000 per year and the NDE may continue to have that costs with the bill being enacted.

Currently, there is approximately \$820,000 of cash funds in the PPC Fund which would revert back to the Certification Fund, and permit fees of applicants could then be lowered by the Commissioner.

The fees are set by the Commissioner and not by statute anymore. The \$10 dollar reduction in the maximum amount in statute for a fee that the Commissioner could charge is being reduced since \$13 dollars of every application goes into the PPC Fund and not the Certification Fund.

NDE estimates the State will see \$90,000 in savings with the elimination of the PPC.
