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Section 1. Section 23-1701.01, Reissue Revised Statutes
 of Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 23-1701.01 (1) Any candidate for the office of sheriff 4 who does not have a law enforcement officer certificate or diploma 5 issued by the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal 6 Justice shall submit with the candidate filing form required by 7 section 32-607 a standardized letter issued by the director of the 8 Nebraska Law Enforcement Training Center certifying that the 9 candidate has:

(a) Within one calendar year prior to the deadline for 10 filing the candidate filing form, passed a background investigation 11 12 performed by the Nebraska Law Enforcement Training Center based on a 13 check of his or her criminal history record information maintained by 14 the Federal Bureau of Investigation through the Nebraska State 15 Patrol. The candidate who has not passed a background investigation shall apply for the background investigation at least thirty days 16 prior to the filing deadline for the candidate filing form; and 17

(b) Received a minimum combined score on the reading
comprehension and English language portions of an adult basic
education examination designated by the Nebraska Law Enforcement
Training Center.

(2) Each sheriff shall attend the Nebraska Law
Enforcement Training Center and receive a certificate attesting to
satisfactory completion of the Sheriff's Certification Course within
eight months of after taking office unless such sheriff has already

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been awarded a certificate by the Nebraska Commission on Law 1 2 Enforcement and Criminal Justice attesting to satisfactory completion 3 of such course or unless such sheriff can demonstrate to the Nebraska Police Standards Advisory Council that his or her previous training 4 5 and education is such that he or she will professionally discharge the duties of the office. Any sheriff in office prior to July 19, 6 7 1980, shall not be required to obtain a certificate attesting to 8 satisfactory completion of the Sheriff's Certification Course but 9 shall otherwise be subject to this section. Each Notwithstanding sections 81-1401 to 81-1414.06 and sections 10 to 13 of this act, 10 each sheriff shall attend twenty hours of continuing education in 11 12 criminal justice and law enforcement courses approved by the council 13 each year following the first year of such sheriff's term of office. Such continuing education shall be offered through seminars, advanced 14 15 education which may include college or university classes, or conferences, instruction conducted within the sheriff's office, or 16 instruction conducted over the Internet, except that instruction 17 conducted over the Internet shall be limited to ten hours annually, 18 19 and shall be of a type which has application to and seeks to maintain 20 and improve the skills of the sheriffs in carrying out the responsibilities of their office. 21

(3) Unless Notwithstanding section 81-1403, unless a
sheriff is able to show good cause for not complying with subsection
(2) of this section or obtains a waiver of the training requirements
from the council, any sheriff who violates subsection (2) of this

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section shall be punished by a fine equal to such sheriff's monthly 1 2 salary. Each month in which such violation occurs shall constitute a 3 separate offense. 4 Sec. 2. Section 81-1401, Reissue Revised Statutes of 5 Nebraska, is amended to read: б 81-1401 For purposes of sections 81-1401 to 81-1414, 7 81-1414.06 and sections 10 to 13 of this act, unless the context 8 otherwise requires: 9 (1) Commission means the Nebraska Commission on Law 10 Enforcement and Criminal Justice; 11 (2) Council means the Nebraska Police Standards Advisory 12 Council; 13 (3) Director means the director of the Nebraska Law Enforcement Training Center; 14 15 (3) (4) Handgun means any firearm with a barrel less than 16 sixteen inches in length or any firearm designed to be held and fired by the use of a single hand; 17 (4) (5) Law enforcement agency means the police 18 department or the town marshal in incorporated municipalities, the 19 20 office of sheriff in unincorporated areas, and the Nebraska State 21 Patrol; (5)(a) <u>(6)(a)</u> Law enforcement officer means any person 22 23 who is responsible for the prevention or detection of crime or the enforcement of the penal, traffic, or highway laws of the state or 24

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2 but is not limited to: 3 (i) A full-time or part-time member of the Nebraska State 4 Patrol; 5 (ii) A county sheriff; б (iii) A full-time, or part-time, or reserve employee of a 7 county sheriff's office; 8 (iv) A full-time, or part-time, or reserve employee of a 9 municipal or village police agency; or 10 (v) A full-time or part-time Game and Parks Commission 11 conservation officer; 12 (vi) A full-time or part-time deputy state sheriff; or 13 (v) (vii) A full-time employee of an organized and paid fire department of any city of the metropolitan class who is an 14 15 authorized arson investigator and whose duties consist of determining 16 the cause, origin, and circumstances of fires or explosions while on duty in the course of an investigation; 17 (b) Law enforcement officer does not include employees of 18 the Department of Correctional Services, probation officers under the 19

20 Nebraska Probation System, parole officers appointed by the Parole Administrator, or employees of the Department of Revenue under 21 section 77-366; and 22

23 (c) A law enforcement officer shall possess a valid law enforcement officer certificate or diploma, as established by the 24 council, in order to be vested with the authority of this section, 25

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but this subdivision does not prohibit an individual from receiving a conditional appointment as an officer pursuant to subsection (2) of section 81-1414;

5 Enforcement Training Center;

6 (7) Training academy means the training center or such 7 other council-approved law enforcement training facility operated and 8 maintained by a law enforcement agency which offers certification 9 training that meets or exceeds the certification training curriculum 10 of the training center;

(8) Training center means the Nebraska Law Enforcement
 Training Center; and

(9) Training school means a public or private institution of higher education, including the University of Nebraska, the Nebraska state colleges, and the community colleges of this state, that offers training in a council-approved pre-certification course.

Sec. 3. Section 81-1403, Revised Statutes Supplement,2011, is amended to read:

19 81-1403 Subject to review and approval by the commission,20 the council shall:

(1) Adopt and promulgate rules and regulations for law enforcement pre-certification, certification, continuing education, and training requirements. Such rules and regulations may include the authority to impose a fine on any individual, political subdivision, or agency who or which violates <u>sections 81-1401 to 81-1414.06 and</u>

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sections 10 to 13 of this act or any of such rules and regulations. 1 2 The fine for each separate violation of sections 81-1401 to 3 81-1414.06 and sections 10 to 13 of this act or of any rule or regulation adopted and promulgated by the council pursuant to such 4 5 sections shall not exceed either (a) a one-time maximum fine of five 6 hundred dollars or (b) a maximum fine of one hundred dollars per day 7 until the individual, political subdivision, or agency complies with 8 such rules or regulations. All fines collected pursuant to this subdivision shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for distribution 9 in accordance with Article VII, section 5, of the Constitution of 10 11 Nebraska;

12 (2) Adopt and promulgate rules and regulations for the13 operation of the training center;

14 (3) Recommend to the executive director of the commission 15 the names of persons to be appointed to the position of director of 16 the training center;

17 (4) Establish requirements for satisfactory completion of 18 pre-certification programs, certification programs, and advanced 19 training programs;

20 (5) Issue certificates or diplomas attesting satisfactory 21 completion of pre-certification programs, certification programs, and 22 advanced training programs;

23 (6) Revoke or suspend such certificates or diplomas
24 according to rules and regulations established adopted and

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and sections 10 to 13 of this act for reasons which shall include, 1 2 but not be limited to, (a) incompetence, (b) neglect of duty, (c) 3 physical, mental, or emotional incapacity, and (d) final conviction of or pleading guilty or nolo contendere to a felony. The rules and 4 5 regulations shall provide for revocation of a certificate holder's certificate without a hearing upon his or her the certificate 6 7 holder's final conviction of or pleading guilty or nolo contendere to 8 a felony. For purposes of this subdivision, felony means a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term of more than one year or a 9 crime committed outside of Nebraska which would be punishable by 10 11 imprisonment for a term of more than one year if committed in 12 Nebraska. The rules and regulations shall include a procedure for 13 hearing appeals of any person who feels that the revocation or 14 suspension of his or her certificate or diploma was in error;

(7) Set the tuition and fees for the training center and 15 all officers of other training academies not employed by that 16 training academy's agency. The tuition and fees set for the training 17 center pursuant to this subdivision shall be adjusted annually 18 19 pursuant to the training center budget approved by the Legislature. 20 All other tuition and fees shall be set in order to cover the costs of administering sections 81-1401 to 81-1414. 81-1414.06 and sections 21 10 to 13 of this act. All tuition and fees shall be remitted to the 22 23 State Treasurer for credit to the Nebraska Law Enforcement Training Center Cash Fund; 24

25 (8) Annually certify any training academies providing a

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basic course of law enforcement training which complies with the 1 2 qualifications and standards promulgated by the council and offering training that meets or exceeds training that is offered by the 3 training center. The council shall set the maximum and minimum 4 5 applicant enrollment figures for training academies training non-6 agency officers; 7 (9) Extend the programs of the training center throughout 8 the state on a regional basis; 9 (10) Establish the qualifications, and standards, and 10 continuing education requirements and provide the training required 11 by section 81-1439; and 12 (11) Do all things necessary to carry out the purpose of 13 the training center, except that functional authority for budget and personnel matters shall remain with the commission. 14 Any administrative fine imposed under this section shall 15 constitute a debt to the State of Nebraska which may be collected by 16 17 lien foreclosure or sued for and recovered in any proper form of action by the office of the Attorney General in the name of the State 18 of Nebraska in the district court of the county where the final 19 20 agency action was taken. All fines imposed by the council shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for distribution in accordance with 21 Article VII, section 5, of the Constitution of Nebraska. 22 23 Sec. 4. 24 2011, is amended to read:

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81-1404 The director of the Nebraska Law Enforcement

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1 Training Center shall devote full time to the duties of the office 2 and shall not engage in any other business or profession or hold any 3 other state public office. The director shall be responsible to the 4 executive director of the commission for the operation of the 5 training center and the conducting of training programs. The director 6 of the training center shall:

7 (1) Appoint and remove for cause such employees as may be
8 necessary for the operation of the training center and delegate
9 appropriate powers and duties to them;

10 (2) Conduct research for the purpose of evaluating and
 11 improving the effectiveness of law enforcement training programs;

12 (3) Consult with the council on all matters pertaining to
13 training schools, and training academies, and continuing education;

14 (4) Supervise the administration of the pre-certification15 competency test;

Sec. 5. Section 81-1406, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

81-1406 There is hereby created the Nebraska Police б 7 Standards Advisory Council. The council shall be a special standing 8 committee of the commission with the express purpose of overseeing all training schools and training academies and the operation of the 9 training center and ensuring that all rules, regulations, and 10 policies with respect to pre-certification, certification, continuing 11 12 education, and training requirements are implemented and complied 13 with. The council shall act for the commission in all matters relating to law enforcement training, and the training center, and 14 15 continuing education but shall not have any other powers and duties 16 with respect to the commission or any of its duties. The council shall conduct regular meetings in order to carry out its statutory 17 duties. 18

19 Sec. 6. Section 81-1412.02, Reissue Revised Statutes of 20 Nebraska, is amended to read:

21 81-1412.02 The person in charge of any agency employing 22 law enforcement officers as defined in section 81-1401 shall submit 23 to the council a register of full-time, part-time, and reserve law 24 enforcement officers employed by his or her agency and whether each 25 law enforcement officer passed or failed the handgun qualification.

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council shall adopt and promulgate rules and regulations 1 The 2 governing the submission of agency registers. The register shall 3 include the name of each law enforcement officer, whether the law enforcement officer passed or failed the handgun qualification, the 4 5 name of the instructor who administered the course, the date of 6 handgun qualification, and the type of handgun used in handgun 7 qualification. An agency that fails to submit a handgun qualification 8 register pursuant to this section shall be subject to a fine of one hundred dollars for each day of noncompliance. All fines collected 9 under this section shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for 10 11 credit to the Law Enforcement Improvement Fund.

Sec. 7. Section 81-1414, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

14 81-1414 (1) On and after January 1, 1972, law enforcement 15 officers already serving under permanent appointment shall not be 16 required to meet any requirement of subsection (2) of this section as 17 a condition of tenure or continued employment.

(2) On and after January 1, 1972, no person shall receive 18 appointment as a law enforcement officer unless he or she has been 19 20 awarded a certificate or diploma by the commission attesting to satisfactory completion of the minimum curriculum of the training 21 center as established by the council or has been awarded a 22 23 certificate or diploma attesting to satisfactory completion of a 24 training program which the council finds equivalent thereto. Any person who has not been awarded such a certificate or diploma may 25

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receive an appointment conditioned on satisfactory completion of such 1 2 training if he or she immediately applies for admission to the 3 training center or any training academy and enrolls in the next available basic training class. If such training is not completed 4 5 within one year after the appointment, the person's employment shall not be renewed by a political subdivision appointment or otherwise 6 7 and such person shall no longer be recognized as a law enforcement 8 officer, as defined in section 81-1401, except that in cases of extreme hardship, upon application by the officer, the council may 9 grant a waiver to allow the officer to complete the basic training 10 program as soon as is practicable after the one-year time allowance. 11 12 Any individual who is not certified in accordance with this section 13 and has worked as a law enforcement officer for multiple law enforcement agencies or political subdivisions shall have his or her 14 15 time of employment aggregated in order to determine if he or she has worked for more than one year. If that law enforcement officer's 16 aggregate time of employment exceeds one year, that officer shall not 17 be recognized as a law enforcement officer for any political 18 subdivision until he or she has satisfactorily completed such 19 20 certification training. For purposes of this section, the council shall deem the successful completion of the federal Bureau of Indian 21 Affairs basic police training program as administered by the Federal 22 23 Law Enforcement Training Center to constitute such equivalent training, and officers certified by virtue of such equivalent 24 25 training may exercise full law enforcement authority exclusively on

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1 tribal lands.

2 (3) Law enforcement officers who are promoted in rank
3 shall satisfactorily complete such council-approved training within
4 one year of such promotion.

5 (4) At the direction of the council, the director shall 6 issue a certificate or diploma attesting to a compliance with the 7 requirements of subsection (2) or (3) of this section to any 8 applicant who presents evidence of satisfactory completion of a 9 council-approved training program.

Sec. 8. Section 81-1414.04, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read:

12 81-1414.04 There is hereby created, for the use of the 13 Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice, commission, a fund to be known as the Nebraska Law Enforcement 14 Training Center Fund, to consist of such money as appropriated to 15 such fund by the Legislature. Any money in the fund available for 16 investment shall be invested by the state investment officer pursuant 17 18 to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds 19 Investment Act.

20 Sec. 9. Section 81-1414.05, Reissue Revised Statutes of 21 Nebraska, is amended to read:

22 81-1414.05 The proceeds of the Nebraska Law Enforcement 23 Training Center Fund created by section 81-1414.04 shall be expended 24 by the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice, 25 <u>commission</u> as and when appropriated by the Legislature, to be used

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for the costs and payments to be made by the State of Nebraska to the city of Grand Island for the use by the state of such building or facility or portion thereof, and equipping the same.

4 Sec. 10. (1) In order to maintain his or her professional 5 status and serve the law enforcement profession, the community, and 6 the residents of Nebraska, each law enforcement officer shall attend 7 at least twenty hours of continuing education courses in the areas of 8 criminal justice and law enforcement during each calendar year 9 beginning on January 1 and ending on December 31. A law enforcement 10 officer is not required to meet the continuing education requirements in the year in which he or she first becomes fully certified. 11

12 (2) Continuing education courses may be offered in the 13 form of seminars, advanced education which may include college or 14 university classes, conferences, instruction conducted within the law 15 enforcement officer's law enforcement agency, or instruction 16 conducted over the Internet, except that instruction conducted over 17 the Internet shall be limited to ten hours annually, and shall be of a type which has application to and seeks to maintain and improve the 18 19 skills of the law enforcement officer in carrying out his or her 20 duties and responsibilities.

21 Sec. 11. Every law enforcement agency of the state or any 22 of its political subdivisions shall send the director certified 23 reports, on a form designed by the director, of the completion of the 24 continuing education requirements by its law enforcement officers at 25 such time and in such manner and detail as the director may

1 prescribe. The director shall maintain a record of the reports in a 2 central registry. 3 Sec. 12. (1) Failure to complete the continuing education 4 requirements of sections 11 and 12 of this act shall result in the 5 suspension of a law enforcement officer's certificate or diploma from 6 the Nebraska Law Enforcement Training Center and a fine under section 7 81-1403 until the continuing education is completed, unless the 8 officer is able to show good cause for not completing the continuing 9 education requirements or unless a waiver has been granted. 10 (2) Any law enforcement officer who fails to fulfill his or her continuing education requirements for two consecutive 11 12 reporting periods may have his or her certificate or diploma from the 13 Nebraska Law Enforcement Training Center revoked and a fine incurred under section 81-1403, unless the officer is able to show good cause 14 15 for not completing the continuing education requirements or unless a 16 waiver has been granted. 17 Sec. 13. The continuing education requirements of sections 10 to 12 of this act shall be suspended for any law 18 enforcement officer while he or she is on active duty with the armed 19 20 forces of the United States. Sec. 14. Section 81-1439, Reissue Revised Statutes of 21 Nebraska, is amended to read: 22 23 81-1439 (1) The Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice shall establish minimum physical, mental, 24 educational, and moral qualifications for all members of any law 25

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1 enforcement reserve force. The commission shall also establish 2 <u>minimum</u> training <u>and continuing education</u> standards and be 3 responsible for providing such training for all members. The 4 commission shall delegate its responsibilities pursuant to this 5 section to the Nebraska Police Standards Advisory Council.

6 (2) Individuals appointed to a law enforcement reserve 7 force shall receive training through or under the supervision of the 8 Nebraska Law Enforcement Training Center and shall achieve the 9 minimum training standards within one year <u>from after</u> the date of 10 appointment. Such training may be provided by the training center 11 through regional workshops, training sessions, or similar means of 12 instruction anywhere in the state.

13 (3) Members of the law enforcement reserve force shall be 14 subject to the same continuing education requirements as all other 15 law enforcement officers pursuant to sections 81-1401 to 81-1414.06 16 and sections 10 to 13 of this act.

17 (3) (4) The governing body establishing a law enforcement 18 reserve force shall adopt and publish a reserve force manual setting 19 forth the minimum qualifications, training standards, and standard 20 operating procedures, and continuing education requirements for such 21 force and such higher qualifications, standards, and operating 22 procedures as may actually be used.
