LEGISLATIVE BILL 1082

Committee:

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to immigration; to require law enforcement 2 agencies, jails, and the Nebraska State Patrol to provide notice 3 prior to entering into agreements to enforce federal immigration 4 law; to require law enforcement agencies and jails to provide 5 information to the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and 6 Criminal Justice; to provide the Auditor of Public Accounts with 7 authority to conduct audits of noncomplying law enforcement 8 agencies, jails, political subdivisions, and the patrol; and to 9 provide an operative date.
- 10 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. For purposes of sections 1 to 3 of this act:
- 2 <u>(1) Commission means the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and</u>
- 3 Criminal Justice;
- 4 (2) Jail includes a jail as defined in sections 47-117 and 47-207;
- 5 (3) Law enforcement agency means a police department, a town
- 6 marshal, or the office of sheriff, but does not include the Nebraska
- 7 State Patrol;
- 8 (4) Meeting has the same meaning as in section 84-1409; and
- 9 (5) Public agency means the United States, any state, county, or
- 10 municipality and any branch, subdivision, board, commission, department,
- 11 <u>agency</u>, or other instrumentality of such entities.
- Sec. 2. (1)(a) Beginning August 1, 2018, a law enforcement agency
- 13 or jail shall, before becoming a party to an agreement with any other
- 14 public agency to enforce immigration law or to investigate, interrogate,
- 15 <u>detain</u>, <u>detect</u>, <u>or arrest persons for immigration enforcement purposes</u>
- 16 pursuant to such agreement, notify the governing body of any political
- 17 subdivision overseeing such law enforcement agency or jail, in writing,
- 18 at least thirty days prior to entering into such agreement. The notice
- 19 shall be filed with the governing body and the governing body shall
- 20 include the notice in the agenda of subjects of the next regularly
- 21 <u>scheduled public meeting of the governing body.</u>
- 22 (b) If a law enforcement agency or jail entered into an agreement
- 23 <u>described in subdivision (1)(a) of this section prior to August 1, 2018,</u>
- 24 such law enforcement agency or jail shall notify the governing body of
- 25 any political subdivision overseeing such law enforcement agency or jail,
- 26 in writing, on or before September 1, 2018. The notice shall be filed
- 27 <u>with the governing body and the governing body shall include the notice</u>
- 28 in the agenda of subjects of the next regularly scheduled public meeting
- 29 of the governing body.
- 30 (2) Within sixty days after entering into an agreement described in
- 31 <u>subdivision (1)(a) of this section or, for an agreement described in</u>

- 1 subdivision (1)(b) of this section, on or before November 1, 2018, a law
- 2 enforcement agency or jail shall provide the following information to the
- 3 commission:
- 4 (a) A written copy of any such agreement;
- 5 (b) A written copy of the notice delivered under subsection (1) of
- 6 this section; and
- 7 (c) A record of any public meeting held by the governing body
- 8 concerning the agreement, including, but not limited to, any exhibits,
- 9 transcripts of testimony, statements of members of the governing body, or
- 10 <u>recordings of votes of the members of the governing body.</u>
- 11 (3) If a law enforcement agency or jail fails to provide the
- 12 information required by this section, the Auditor of Public Accounts may,
- 13 at his or her discretion, conduct an audit of such law enforcement agency
- 14 or jail or the political subdivision overseeing such law enforcement
- 15 agency or jail. The expense of such audit shall be paid by the political
- 16 subdivision.
- 17 Sec. 3. (1)(a) Beginning August 1, 2018, the Nebraska State Patrol
- 18 shall, before becoming a party to an agreement with any other public
- 19 agency to enforce immigration law or to investigate, interrogate, detain,
- 20 <u>detect, or arrest persons for immigration enforcement purposes pursuant</u>
- 21 to such agreement, notify the Judiciary Committee of the Legislature and
- 22 the commission, in writing, at least thirty days prior to entering into
- 23 such agreement. The notification to the Legislature shall be submitted
- 24 electronically. The notice shall be filed with the commission, which
- 25 shall include the notice in the agenda of subjects of the next regularly
- 26 scheduled public meeting of the commission.
- 27 (b) If the Nebraska State Patrol entered into an agreement described
- 28 in subdivision (1)(a) of this section prior to August 1, 2018, the patrol
- 29 shall, on or before September 1, 2018, notify the Judiciary Committee of
- 30 <u>the Legislature and the commission, in writing. The notification to the</u>
- 31 Legislature shall be submitted electronically. The notice shall be filed

- 1 with the commission which shall include the notice in the agenda of
- 2 <u>subjects</u> of the next regularly scheduled public meeting of the
- 3 <u>commission</u>.
- 4 (2) If the Nebraska State Patrol fails to provide the information
- 5 required by this section, the Auditor of Public Accounts may, at his or
- 6 <u>her discretion</u>, conduct an audit of the patrol. The expense of such audit
- 7 <u>shall be paid by the patrol.</u>
- 8 Sec. 4. This act becomes operative on August 1, 2018.
