- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to city airport authorities; to amend sections
- 2 3-504 and 32-547, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section
- 3 3-502, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2020; to provide for
- 4 election of members of an airport authority board in a city of the
- 5 metropolitan class; to change provisions relating to powers; to
- 6 harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original sections.
- 7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 3-502, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 2 2020, is amended to read:
- 3 3-502 (1) Any city may create an airport authority to be managed and
- 4 controlled by a board. <u>Such The</u> board, when and if appointed, shall have
- 5 full and exclusive jurisdiction and control over all facilities owned or
- 6 thereafter acquired by such city for the purpose of aviation operation,
- 7 air navigation, and air safety operation.
- 8 (2) The Cities Airport Authorities Act shall not become operative as
- 9 to any city unless the mayor and city council in their discretion
- 10 activate the airport authority by the mayor appointing and the city
- 11 council approving the board members as provided in this section. Each
- 12 such board shall be a body corporate and politic, constituting a public
- 13 corporation and an agency of the city for which such board is
- 14 established.
- 15 (3) Each board in cities of the primary class, first class, and
- 16 second <u>class</u> elasses and in villages shall consist of five members to be
- 17 appointed by the mayor with the approval of the city council to serve
- 18 until their successors elected pursuant to section 32-547 take office.
- 19 Members of such board shall be residents of the city for which such
- 20 authority is created. Any vacancy on such board shall be filled by
- 21 appointment by the mayor, with the approval of the city council, to serve
- 22 the unexpired portion of the term. A member of such board may be removed
- 23 from office for incompetence, neglect of duty, or malfeasance in office.
- 24 An action for the removal of such officer may be brought, upon resolution
- 25 of the city council, in the district court of the county in which such
- 26 city is located.
- 27 (4) Each board in cities of the metropolitan class shall consist of
- 28 five members who shall be nominated by the mayor and approved by the city
- 29 council and shall serve for terms of five years or until their successors
- 30 elected pursuant to section 32-547 take office, whichever occurs first.
- 31 Members of the board shall be residents of the city for which such

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- 1 authority is created. Any vacancy on such board shall be filled, not 2 later than six months after the date of such vacancy, by appointment by the mayor with the approval of the city council, and such appointee shall 3 4 serve the unexpired portion of the term of the member whose office was vacated. Except for members of such board elected pursuant to section 5 32-547 or thereafter appointed to fill any vacancy as provided in this 6 subsection, any Any member of such board may be removed from office by 7 the mayor, for incompetence, neglect of duty, or malfeasance in office, 8 9 with the consent and approval of the city council. A member of such board 10 elected pursuant to section 32-547 or thereafter appointed to fill any vacancy as provided in this subsection may be removed from office for 11 incompetence, neglect of duty, or malfeasance in office. An action for 12 13 the removal of such officer may be brought, upon resolution of the city
- 16 (5) The members of the board hereby created shall not be entitled to 17 compensation for their services but shall be entitled to reimbursement of expenses paid or incurred in the performance of the duties imposed upon 18 them by the Cities Airport Authorities Act, to be paid as provided in 19 section 23-1112 for county officers and employees. A majority of the 20 members of the board then in office shall constitute a quorum. The board 21 may delegate to one or more of the members, or to its officers, agents, 22 23 and employees, such powers and duties as the board deems it may deem 24 proper.

(6) The board and its corporate existence shall continue only for a period of twenty years from the date of appointment of the members of such board thereof and thereafter until all its liabilities have been met and its bonds have been paid in full or such liabilities and bonds have otherwise been discharged. When all liabilities incurred by the authority of every kind and character have been met and all its bonds have been paid in full or such liabilities and bonds have otherwise been

- 1 discharged, all rights and properties of the authority shall pass to and
- 2 be vested in the city. The authority shall have and retain full and
- 3 exclusive jurisdiction and control over all projects under its
- 4 jurisdiction, with the right and duty to charge and collect revenue from
- 5 such projects therefrom, for the benefit of the holders of any of its
- 6 bonds or other liabilities. Upon the authority's ceasing of the authority
- 7 to exist, all its remaining rights and properties shall pass to and vest
- 8 in the city.
- 9 Sec. 2. Section 3-504, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 10 amended to read:
- 11 3-504 Any authority established under the Cities Airport Authorities
- 12 Act shall have <u>the power to</u>:
- 13 (1) <u>Sue</u> To sue and be sued;
- 14 (2) <u>Have</u> To have a seal and alter the same at pleasure;
- 15 (3) Acquire To acquire, hold, and dispose of personal property for
- 16 its corporate purposes;
- 17 (4) <u>Acquire</u> To acquire in the name of the city, by purchase or
- 18 condemnation, real property or rights or easements in such property
- 19 therein necessary or convenient for its corporate purposes and, except
- 20 (a) as may otherwise be provided in the <u>Cities Airport Authorities Act</u>
- 21 act and (b) that if property is to be acquired outside the
- 22 <u>extraterritorial</u> zoning jurisdiction of the city when such city is a city
- 23 of the metropolitan class, approval must be obtained from the county
- 24 board of the county where the property is located before the right of
- 25 eminent domain may be exercised, to use <u>such right the same</u> so long as
- 26 its corporate existence continues. Such power shall not be exercised by
- 27 authorities of cities of the primary_class, first_class, and second class
- 28 classes and of villages created after September 2, 1973, without further
- 29 approval until such time as at least three members of the authority have
- 30 been elected. If the exercise of such power is necessary while three or
- 31 more appointed members remain on the authority of cities of the primary

- 1 <u>class</u>, first<u>class</u>, and second <u>class</u> classes and of villages, the
- 2 appointing body shall approve all proceedings under this subdivision;
- 3 (5) Make To make bylaws for the management and regulation of its
- 4 affairs and, subject to agreements with bondholders, to make rules and
- 5 regulations for the use of projects and the establishment and collection
- 6 of rentals, fees, and all other charges for services or commodities sold,
- 7 furnished, or supplied by such authority. Any person violating such rules
- 8 <u>and regulations</u> shall be guilty of a Class III misdemeanor;
- 9 (6) With the consent of the city, to use the services of agents,
- 10 employees, and facilities of the city, for which the authority may
- 11 reimburse the city a proper proportion of the compensation or cost of
- 12 <u>such services</u> thereof, and also to use the services of the city attorney
- 13 as legal advisor to the authority;
- 14 (7) Appoint To appoint officers, agents, and employees and fix their
- 15 compensation;
- 16 (8) <u>Make</u> To make contracts, leases, and all other instruments
- 17 necessary or convenient to the corporate purposes of the authority;
- 18 (9) <u>Design</u> To design, construct, maintain, operate, improve, and
- 19 reconstruct, so long as its corporate existence continues, such projects
- 20 as are necessary and convenient to the maintenance and development of
- 21 aviation services to and for the city in which such authority is
- 22 established, including landing fields, heliports, hangars, shops,
- 23 passenger and freight terminals, control towers, and all facilities
- 24 necessary or convenient in connection with any such project, to contract
- 25 for the construction, operation, or maintenance of any parts thereof or
- 26 for services to be performed on such project thereon, and to rent parts
- 27 of thereof and grant concessions on such project thereon, all on such
- 28 terms and conditions as the authority may determine. This subdivision
- 29 shall not be construed to affect the obligation of a lessee to pay taxes
- 30 if taxes are due under sections 77-202, 77-202.11, and 77-202.12;
- 31 (10) Include To include in such project, subject to zoning

- 1 restrictions, space and facilities for any or all of the following:
- 2 Public recreation; business, trade, or other exhibitions; sporting or
- 3 athletic events; public meetings; conventions; and all other kinds of
- 4 assemblages and, in order to obtain additional revenue, space and
- 5 facilities for business and commercial purposes. Whenever the authority
- 6 deems it to be in the public interest, the authority may lease any such
- 7 project or any part or parts of such project thereof or contract for the
- 8 management and operation of such project thereof or any part or parts of
- 9 <u>such project</u> thereof. Any such lease or contract may be for such period
- 10 of years as the authority shall determine. This subdivision shall not be
- 11 construed to affect the obligation of a lessee to pay taxes if taxes are
- 12 due under sections 77-202, 77-202.11, and 77-202.12;
- 13 (11) Charge To charge fees, rentals, and all other charges for the
- 14 use of projects under the jurisdiction of such authority subject to and
- 15 in accordance with <u>any</u> such agreement with bondholders as may be made as
- 16 hereinafter provided. Subject to contracts with bondholders, all fees,
- 17 rentals, charges, and other revenue derived from any project shall be
- 18 applied to the payment of operating, administration, and other necessary
- 19 expenses of the authority properly chargeable to such project and to the
- 20 payment of the interest on and principal of bonds or for making sinking-
- 21 fund payments therefor. Subject to contracts with bondholders, the
- 22 authority may treat one or more projects as a single enterprise with
- 23 respect to revenue, expenses, the issuance of bonds, maintenance,
- 24 operation, or other purposes;
- 25 (12) Certify To certify annually to the governing body of the city
- 26 the amount of tax to be levied for airport purposes which the authority
- 27 requires under its adopted budget statement to be received from taxation,
- 28 not to exceed three and five-tenths cents on each one hundred dollars of
- 29 taxable valuation of all the taxable property in such city subject to
- 30 section 77-3443. The governing body may levy and collect the taxes so
- 31 certified at the same time and in the same manner as other taxes are

- 1 levied and collected, and the proceeds of such taxes when due and as 2 collected shall be set aside and deposited in the special account or accounts in which other revenue of the authority is deposited. An 3 4 authority in a city of the first class, a city of the or second class, or a village shall have power to certify annually to the governing body of 5 such a city or village an additional amount of tax to be levied for 6 7 airport purposes, not to exceed three and five-tenths cents on each one hundred dollars of taxable value, to be levied, collected, set aside, and 8 9 deposited as specified in this subdivision, and if negotiable bonds of the authority are thereafter issued, this power shall continue until such 10 bonds are paid in full. When such additional amount of tax is first 11 certified, the governing body may then require, but not thereafter, 12 13 approval of the same by a majority vote of the governing body or by a majority vote of the electors voting on the same at a general or special 14 election. The additional levy shall be subject to section 77-3443. The 15 provisions of this subdivision shall not apply to cities of the 16 17 metropolitan class;
- (13) Construct To construct and maintain under, along, over, or 18 across a project, telephone, telegraph, or electric wires and cables, 19 fuel lines, gas mains, water mains, and other mechanical equipment not 20 inconsistent with the appropriate use of such project, to contract for 21 22 such construction, and to lease the right to construct and use such wires, cables, lines, mains, and other equipment the same, or to use such 23 wires, cables, lines, mains, and other equipment the same on such terms 24 25 for such periods of time and for such consideration as the authority shall determine; 26
- 27 (14) Accept To accept grants, loans, or contributions from the
 28 United States, the State of Nebraska, any agency or instrumentality of
 29 either of them, or the city in which such authority is established and to
 30 expend the proceeds of such grants, loans, or contributions thereof for
 31 any corporate purposes;

- 1 (15) <u>Incur</u> To <u>incur</u> debt and issue negotiable bonds and to provide
- 2 for the rights of the holders of such bonds thereof;
- 3 (16) Enter To enter on any lands, waters, and premises for the
- 4 purposes of making surveys, soundings, and examinations; and
- 5 (17) Do To do all things necessary or convenient to carry out the
- 6 powers expressly conferred on such authorities <u>under</u> by the <u>Cities</u>
- 7 Airport Authorities Act act.
- 8 Sec. 3. Section 32-547, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 9 amended to read:
- 10 32-547 (1) Each airport authority board created pursuant to the
- 11 Cities Airport Authorities Act in cities of the primary, first, and
- 12 second classes and in villages shall consist of five members. Except for
- 13 members initially appointed pursuant to section 3-502, members of the
- 14 board shall serve for terms of six years and shall be nominated and
- 15 elected in the manner provided by law for the election of officers of the
- 16 city concerned and shall take office at the same time as the officers of
- 17 such city. One member shall be elected at the first general city election
- 18 after creation of the authority, two members at the second general city
- 19 election after creation of the authority, and two members at the third
- 20 general city election after the creation of the authority. The members
- 21 shall meet the qualifications <u>required under</u> found in such section.
- 22 (2) Each airport authority board created pursuant to the Cities
- 23 Airport Authorities Act in cities of the metropolitan class shall consist
- 24 of five members. Except for members serving on the effective date of this
- 25 act and members initially appointed pursuant to section 3-502, members of
- 26 the board shall serve for terms of four years and shall be nominated and
- 27 elected in the manner provided by law for the election of officers of the
- 28 city concerned beginning with the city election held in 2025. The terms
- 29 of members serving on the effective date of this act shall end when their
- 30 successors take office. The members shall take office at the same time as
- 31 the officers of such city and shall meet the qualifications required
