1 Section 1. Section 37-201, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2010, is amended to read:
- 3 37-201 Sections 37-201 to 37-811 <u>and sections 3 to 12 of</u>
- 4 this act shall be known and may be cited as the Game Law.
- 5 Sec. 2. Section 37-448, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 6 Supplement, 2010, is amended to read:
- 7 37-448 (1) Subject to rules and regulations adopted and
- 8 promulgated by the commission, the secretary of the commission may
- 9 designate special deer depredation seasons or extensions of existing
- 10 deer hunting seasons by executive order. The secretary may designate
- 11 a depredation season or an extension of an existing deer hunting
- 12 season whenever he or she determines that deer are causing excessive
- 13 property damage. The secretary shall specify the number of permits to
- 14 be issued, the species of deer allowed to be taken, the bag limit for
- 15 such species <u>including deer for donation in accordance with sections</u>
- 16 3 to 12 of this act, the beginning and ending dates for the
- 17 depredation season or hunting season extension, shooting hours, the
- 18 length of the depredation season or hunting season extension, and the
- 19 geographic area in which hunting will be permitted. Hunting during a
- 20 special depredation season or hunting season extension shall be
- 21 limited to residents, and the rules and regulations shall allow use
- 22 of any weapon permissible for use during the regular deer season.
- 23 (2) The depredation season may commence not less than
- 24 five days after the first public announcement that the depredation
- 25 season has been established. Permits shall be issued in an impartial

manner at a location determined by the secretary. The commission 1 2 shall, pursuant to section 37-327, establish and charge a fee of not 3 more than twenty-five dollars for a special depredation season 4 permit. The commission shall use the income from the sale of special 5 depredation season permits for abatement of damage caused by deer. The commission shall also provide for an unlimited number of free 6 7 permits for the taking of antlerless deer upon request to any person 8 owning or operating at least twenty acres of farm or ranch land 9 within the geographic area in which hunting will be permitted and to any member of the immediate family of any such person as defined in 10 subdivision (2)(a) of section 37-455. A free permit shall be valid 11 12 only within such area and only during the designated deer depredation 13 season. Receipt of a depredation season permit shall not in any way affect a person's eligibility for a regular season permit. 14 15 Sec. 3. The purpose of sections 3 to 12 of this act is to 16 establish procedures for the administration of a deer donation 17 program and to encourage hunters to harvest deer to donate to a program to feed inmates in Nebraska and residents of Nebraska who are 18 19 in need. 20 Sec. 4. For purposes of sections 3 to 12 of this act: 21 (1) Deer means any wild deer legally taken in Nebraska

(2) Field dressed means properly bled and cleaned of the

considered by a conservation officer to be in good condition for

- 2 (3) Meat processor means any business that is licensed to
- 3 process meat for retail customers by the Department of Agriculture,
- 4 the United States Department of Agriculture, or a neighboring state's
- 5 <u>department that is similar to Nebraska's.</u>
- 6 Sec. 5. <u>Deer is the only species of wildlife covered by</u>
- 7 sections 3 to 12 of this act. To be accepted, the entire deer carcass
- 8 shall be donated, but the hunter may keep the antlers, head, and
- 9 cape.
- 10 Sec. 6. The commission shall provide each applicant the
- 11 option on the application for any type of hunting permit authorizing
- 12 the taking of deer to indicate that a portion of the permit fee will
- 13 be credited to the Hunters Helping the Hungry Cash Fund. The
- 14 commission shall annually determine what portion of each fee will be
- 15 <u>credited to the fund if an applicant makes such indication on the</u>
- 16 <u>application</u>.
- 17 Sec. 7. (1) The commission shall set a fair market price
- 18 for the processing cost of deer donated to the deer donation program.
- 19 To set a fair market price, the commission shall consider prices for
- 20 similar deer processing services paid by retail customers in Nebraska
- 21 and nearby states and shall establish an annual per-deer processing
- 22 payment to be made to meat processors to the extent that money is
- 23 <u>available in the Hunters Helping the Hungry Cash Fund.</u>
- 24 (2) The commission shall adopt and promulgate rules and
- 25 regulations establishing standards for participating meat processors

- 1 relating to deer processing.
- 2 Sec. 8. The commission shall promote the harvesting of
- 3 <u>deer</u> by hunters and the donation of deer at meat processors
- 4 participating in the deer donation program established pursuant to
- 5 sections 3 to 12 of this act to the extent that money is available in
- 6 the Hunters Helping the Hungry Cash Fund.
- 7 Sec. 9. The commission may enlist as many meat processors
- 8 <u>as available to participate in the deer donation program established</u>
- 9 pursuant to sections 3 to 12 of this act and shall enter into
- 10 contracts with meat processors as described in section 10 of this act
- 11 subject to available funding in the Hunters Helping the Hungry Cash
- 12 Fund. The commission shall provide forms for donation of deer by
- 13 hunters and posters for meat processors to advertise their
- 14 participation. The commission shall provide informational and
- 15 promotional materials to meat processors regarding the deer donation
- 16 program.
- 17 Sec. 10. (1) To participate in the deer donation program
- 18 established pursuant to sections 3 to 12 of this act, each meat
- 19 processor shall enter into an annual contract with the commission
- 20 which details the meat processor's participation.
- 21 (2) Meat processors shall accept the entire field-dressed
- 22 carcass of a donated deer and shall not assess any fees or costs to
- 23 donors. Information from the donor is required for each donated deer
- 24 and shall be submitted on forms provided by the commission. Payment
- 25 <u>shall not be made to a meat processor without this information.</u>

1 (3) Meat processors shall accept a donated deer if the

- 2 <u>meat processor determines the venison is in acceptable condition.</u>
- 4 required to provide to the commission a record of each donated deer

(4) Prior to receiving payment, a meat processor shall be

- 5 that includes information required by the commission. If funding is
- 6 available from the Hunters Helping the Hungry Cash Fund, payments
- 7 shall be made to meat processors within thirty days after submittal
- 8 of a complete and accurate record.

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- 9 Sec. 11. The commission, at its own discretion, may enter
- 10 into contracts with other organizations for the purpose of expanding
- 11 the deer donation program. The commission may include the offer of
- 12 matching grants to pay for deer processing to organizations that
- 13 acquire funding from sources other than the state.
- 14 Sec. 12. The Hunters Helping the Hungry Cash Fund is
- 15 created. The fund shall include amounts designated for the fund
- 16 pursuant to section 6 of this act and revenue received from gifts,
- 17 grants, bequests, donations, other similar donation arrangements, or
- 18 other contributions from public or private sources. The fund shall be
- 19 administered by the commission to carry out the deer donation program
- 20 established by sections 3 to 12 of this act. If the money in the fund
- 21 is not sufficient to carry out the deer donation program, the
- 22 commission shall continue existing contracts and activities before
- 23 entering into new contracts or activities. Any money in the fund
- 24 available for investment shall be invested by the state investment
- 25 officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the
