- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to appropriations; to appropriate funds for
- 2 child care.
- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. The Federal Funds appropriated in sections 2 to 17 of
- 2 this act are from the funds allocated to the State of Nebraska from the
- 3 federal Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund pursuant to the federal
- 4 American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, Public Law 117-2, Subtitle M, Sec.
- 5 9901.
- 6 Sec. 2. There is hereby appropriated \$5,000,000 from Federal Funds
- 7 for FY2022-23 to the Department of Health and Human Services to assist
- 8 <u>families</u> and waive copayments for child care subsidy and cover lost
- 9 income of child care providers.
- 10 Sec. 3. There is hereby appropriated \$2,900,000 from Federal Funds
- 11 <u>for FY2022-23 to the Department of Health and Human Services to support</u>
- 12 <u>the Nebraska Early Childhood Collaborative's Teen and Young Parent</u>
- 13 <u>Program.</u>
- Sec. 4. There is hereby appropriated \$500,000 from Federal Funds
- 15 for FY2022-23 to the Department of Health and Human Services to contract
- 16 <u>with an outside entity to help sustain the Child Care Referral Network</u>
- 17 for an additional three years.
- Sec. 5. There is hereby appropriated \$250,000 from Federal Funds
- 19 for FY2022-23 to the Department of Health and Human Services to contract
- 20 with an outside entity to provide child care licensing materials,
- 21 guidance, and support to help unlicensed and potential child care
- 22 providers fulfill state licensing requirements.
- Sec. 6. <u>There is hereby appropriated \$150,000 from Federal Funds</u>
- 24 for FY2022-23 to the Department of Health and Human Services to contract
- 25 with an outside entity to help family child care home providers achieve
- 26 <u>National Association for Family Child Care Accreditation, including, but</u>
- 27 <u>not limited to, training, mentoring, a peer learning network, self-study</u>
- 28 materials, and application assistance.
- 29 Sec. 7. There is hereby appropriated \$300,000 from Federal Funds
- 30 for FY2022-23 to the Department of Health and Human Services to contract
- 31 with an outside entity to increase statewide access to All Our Kin, a

- 1 business course for family child care providers.
- 2 Sec. 8. There is hereby appropriated \$400,000 from Federal Funds
- 3 for FY2022-23 to the State Department of Education to support the
- 4 Nebraska Early Childhood Professional Record System.
- 5 Sec. 9. There is hereby appropriated \$480,000 from Federal Funds
- 6 for FY2022-23 to the State Department of Education to contract with an
- 7 outside entity for an early childhood mental health and education
- 8 <u>consultation service developed to address the diverse behavioral health</u>
- 9 <u>issues of young children and the environmental and educational needs of</u>
- 10 child care and early childhood educational facilities.
- 11 Sec. 10. There is hereby appropriated \$19,000,000 from Federal
- 12 Funds for FY2022-23 to the Department of Health and Human Services to
- 13 <u>contract with an outside entity to increase child care capacity in areas</u>
- of need, by increasing local community infrastructure, including, but not
- 15 limited to, conducting a child care landscape study, development of
- 16 capacity building plans, business planning, quality models, social
- 17 emotional support and training, funds for planning and implementation of
- 18 expansion and start-up for child care for children from birth through
- 19 <u>five years of age.</u>
- 20 Sec. 11. There is hereby appropriated \$12,518,000 from Federal
- 21 Funds for FY2022-23 to the Department of Health and Human Services to
- 22 extend the preschool development grant.
- 23 Sec. 12. There is hereby appropriated \$750,000 from Federal Funds
- 24 for FY2022-23 to the State Department of Education to coordinate with the
- 25 Department of Health and Human Services to translate licensing materials,
- 26 <u>basic educational materials</u>, and <u>information regarding the Step Up to</u>
- 27 Quality Child Care Act into Spanish.
- Sec. 13. There is hereby appropriated \$3,580,000 from Federal Funds
- 29 for FY2022-23 to the State Department of Education to support the Child
- 30 Care WAGE\$ Nebraska program which provides eduction-based salary
- 31 supplements for child care workers in licensed family child care

- 1 settings.
- 2 Sec. 14. There is hereby appropriated \$1,000,000 from Federal Funds
- 3 for FY2022-23 to the Department of Health and Human Services to extend
- 4 state funding for fingerprinting and background checks for license-exempt
- 5 providers, child care providers, staff, volunteers, and household members
- 6 <u>in licensed child care programs.</u>
- 7 Sec. 15. There is hereby appropriated \$165,000 from Federal Funds
- 8 for FY2022-23 to the State Department of Education to support the
- 9 department's scholarship project to help child care providers cover the
- 10 costs of professional development requirements.
- Sec. 16. There is hereby appropriated \$3,500,000 from Federal Funds
- 12 for FY2022-23 to the State Department of Education to contract with an
- 13 <u>outside entity to support the T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood Nebraska program</u>
- 14 that provides scholarships to help early care and education professionals
- 15 <u>complete coursework at a local college and work toward a degree in early</u>
- 16 childhood education.
- 17 Sec. 17. There is hereby appropriated \$50,000,000 from Federal
- 18 Funds for FY2022-23 to the Department of Health and Human Services for
- 19 retention and recruitment allowances for early childhood professionals.
- 20 Currently employed child care professionals shall receive a monthly
- 21 allowance of \$350 for one year if they remain in the workforce. Newly
- 22 recruited or re-engaged child care professionals shall receive the \$350
- 23 monthly allowance 60 days after active employment with a program,
- 24 including retroactive payments for the initial two months. They will also
- 25 be eligible to receive this monthly allowance for one year.
