## **LEGISLATIVE BILL 1215**

Introduced by Geist, 25. Read first time January 20, 2022 Committee:

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to economic development; to adopt the Small
- 2 Business Assistance Act.
- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1	Section 1. <u>Sections 1 to 6 of this act shall be known and may be</u>
2	cited as the Small Business Assistance Act.
3	Sec. 2. For purposes of the Small Business Assistance Act:
4	(1) Department means the Department of Economic Development; and
5	(2) Small business means a business with five or fewer employees.
6	Sec. 3. <u>(1) The department shall create and administer a grant</u>
7	program to:
8	<u>(a) Provide grants of up to twenty-five thousand dollars to</u>
9	<u>individuals looking to start a small business. An individual shall be</u>
10	eligible for a grant under this subdivision if the following requirements
11	<u>are met:</u>
12	<u>(i) The individual earned no more than fifty-five thousand dollars</u>
13	in the most recently completed calendar year;
14	<u>(ii) The individual has a personal net worth of no more than two</u>
15	hundred thousand dollars, excluding the individual's primary residence;
16	and
17	<u>(iii) The individual does not have an ownership interest in any</u>
18	other business; and
19	<u>(b) Provide grants of up to twelve thousand five hundred dollars to</u>
20	<u>individuals who own a small business that has been in existence for no</u>
21	more than five years. An individual shall be eligible for a grant under
22	this subdivision if the following requirements are met:
23	<u>(i) The gross revenue of the small business has grown by no more</u>
24	than twenty-five percent over the most recently completed calendar year;
25	<u>(ii) The individual has a personal net worth of no more than two</u>
26	hundred thousand dollars, excluding the individual's primary residence;
27	and
28	<u>(iii) The individual does not have an ownership interest in any</u>
29	<u>other business.</u>
30	(2) The department shall contract with a private entity to provide
31	professional counseling services to individuals who are looking to start

- 1 <u>a small business or who have started a small business within the previous</u>
- 2 <u>five years. Such counseling services shall be in the following areas:</u>
- 3 (i) Accounting and budgeting;
- 4 <u>(ii) Tax return preparation;</u>
- 5 <u>(iii) Human resources;</u>
- 6 (iv) How to write a business plan;
- 7 <u>(v) Payroll processes;</u>
- 8 (vi) Financial planning and investments;
- 9 <u>(vii) Debt management;</u>
- 10 <u>(viii) Strategic planning;</u>
- 11 <u>(ix) Technology coaching; and</u>
- 12 <u>(x) Financial statement review.</u>

(3) The private entity with which the department contracts under
 subsection (2) of this section shall not have any other contracts with
 the state that involve the provision of services described in subsection
 (2) of this section.

- 17 Sec. 4. <u>(1) On or before October 1, 2024, and on or before October</u> 18 <u>1 of each even-numbered year thereafter, the department shall submit a</u> 19 <u>report to the Governor and the Legislature that includes, but is not</u> 20 limited to:
- (a) A description of the demand for grants and counseling services
  under the Small Business Assistance Act from all geographic regions in
  Nebraska;

(b) A listing of the grant recipients and the amounts of grants
 awarded pursuant to the act in the previous two fiscal years;

26 (c) A listing of the recipients of counseling services under the act

- 27 <u>in the previous two fiscal years;</u>
- 28 (d) The impact of the grants provided under the act, including
  29 information on:

30 (i) The number of jobs created;

31 (ii) The economic impact on the area where the grant recipient is

1	<u>located;</u>
2	(iii) The impact on state and local tax revenues; and
3	(iv) The types of businesses created, listed by industry.
4	<u>(2) The report submitted to the Legislature shall be submitted</u>
5	<u>electronically.</u>
6	<u>(3) The department may require the private entity described in</u>
7	section 3 of this act and any recipients of grants or counseling services
8	to provide periodic reports and information to enable the department to
9	fulfill the requirements of this section.
10	(4) The report shall contain no information that is protected by
11	<u>state or federal confidentiality laws.</u>
12	Sec. 5. <u>The department may adopt and promulgate rules and</u>
13	regulations to carry out the Small Business Assistance Act.
14	Sec. 6. It is the intent of the Legislature to appropriate five
15	million dollars to the department each fiscal year to carry out the Small
16	Business Assistance Act.
