11 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 32-101, Revised Statutes Cumulative 2 Supplement, 2012, is amended to read: 3 32-101 Sections 32-101 to 32-1551 and section 11 of this act shall be known and may be cited as the Election Act. 4 5 Sec. 2. Section 32-301, Reissue Revised Statutes of 6 Nebraska, is amended to read: 7 32-301 (1) The Secretary of State shall implement, in a 8 uniform and nondiscriminatory manner, a single, uniform, official, centralized, interactive computerized statewide voter registration 9 list defined, maintained, and administered at the office of the 10 11 Secretary of State that contains the name and registration 12 information of every legally registered voter in the state and 13 assigns a unique identifier to each legally registered voter in the 14 state. The computerized list shall serve as the single system for storing and managing the official list of registered voters 15 throughout the state and shall comprise the voter registration 16 17 register. The computerized list shall be coordinated with other agency data bases within the state and shall be available for 18 electronic access by election commissioners and county clerks. The 19 20 computerized list shall serve as the official voter registration list for the conduct of all elections under the Election Act. The 21 Secretary of State shall provide such support as may be required so 22 23 election commissioners and county clerks that are able to electronically enter voter registration information obtained by such 24 officials on an expedited basis at the time the information is 25

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received. The Secretary of State shall provide adequate technological
 security measures to prevent unauthorized access to the computerized
 list. No General Funds shall be appropriated for purposes of this
 list, and funds available in the Election Administration Fund may be
 used for such purposes.

б (2) The election commissioner or county clerk shall 7 provide for the registration of the electors of the county. Upon 8 receipt of a voter registration application in his or her office from 9 an eligible elector, the election commissioner or county clerk shall enter the information from the application in the voter registration 10 electronic 11 register and may create an image, photograph, 12 microphotograph, or reproduction in an electronic digital format to 13 be used as the voter registration record. The election commissioner or county clerk shall provide a precinct list of registered voters 14 15 for each precinct for the use of judges and clerks of election in 16 their respective precincts on election day. An electronically prepared list of registered voters in a form prescribed by the 17 18 Secretary of State shall meet the requirements for a precinct list of 19 registered voters.

20 (3) As part of the system of registration of electors, 21 the Secretary of State shall design and beginning January 1, 2014, 22 implement a process of preregistration for persons who are sixteen 23 years of age or who are seventeen years of age and will not attain 24 the age of eighteen years on or before the first Tuesday after the 25 first Monday in November of the then current calendar year and who

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are otherwise qualified to register to vote. The process shall 1 2 include use of the system of registration of electors to allow such 3 persons to submit a preregistration application and updates of relevant information, receive a confirmation of registration upon 4 5 reaching the age of eligibility in order to provide verification of his or her qualifications and address under section 11 of this act, 6 7 and after verification of his or her qualifications and address, 8 obtain an acknowledgment of registration under section 32-322.

9 Sec. 3. Section 32-308, Reissue Revised Statutes of
10 Nebraska, is amended to read:

32-308 (1) The Secretary of State and the Director of 11 12 Motor Vehicles shall enter into an agreement to match information in 13 the computerized statewide voter registration list with information in the data base of the Department of Motor Vehicles to the extent 14 15 required to enable each such official to verify the accuracy of the information provided on applications for voter registration and 16 preregistration. The Director of Motor Vehicles shall enter into an 17 agreement with the Commissioner of Social Security under section 18 205(r)(8) of the federal Social Security Act, 42 U.S.C. 405(r)(8), as 19 20 such section existed on April 17, 2003, for purposes of the Election Act. 21

(2) The Department of Motor Vehicles, with the assistance
of the Secretary of State, shall prescribe a voter registration
application which may be used to register to vote, preregister to
vote, or change his or her address for voting purposes at the same

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time an elector or a person eligible to preregister under section 11 1 2 of this act applies for an original or renewal motor vehicle 3 operator's license, an original or renewal state identification card, or a replacement or duplicate thereof. The voter registration 4 5 application shall contain the information required pursuant to section 32-312 and shall be designed so that it does not require the 6 7 duplication of information in the application for the motor vehicle 8 operator's license or state identification card, except that it may require a second signature of the applicant. The department and the 9 Secretary of State shall make the voter registration application 10 available to the county treasurer, the license examiners of the 11 12 department, and any other person who issues operators' licenses or 13 state identification cards. The application shall be completed at the office of the county treasurer or department by the close of business 14 15 on the third Friday preceding any election to be registered to vote at such election. A registration application received after the 16 17 deadline shall not be processed by the election commissioner or county clerk until after the election. 18

19 (3) State agency personnel and county treasurers involved 20 in the voter registration process pursuant to this section and 21 section 32-309 shall not be considered deputy registrars or agents or 22 employees of the election commissioner or county clerk.

23 Sec. 4. Section 32-310, Revised Statutes Cumulative
24 Supplement, 2012, is amended to read:

25 32-310 (1) The State Department of Education and the

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Department of Health and Human Services shall provide the opportunity to register <u>or preregister</u> to vote at the time of application, review, or change of address for the following programs, as applicable: (a) The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program; (b) the medicaid program; (c) the WIC program as defined in section 71-2225; (d) the aid to dependent children program; (e) the vocational rehabilitation program; and (f) any other public assistance program or program primarily for the purpose of providing services to persons with disabilities. If the application, review, or change of address is accomplished through an agent or contractor of the department, the agent or contractor shall provide the opportunity to register <u>or preregister</u> to vote. Any information on whether an applicant registers or declines to register and the agency at which

14 he or she registers shall be confidential and shall only be used for 15 voter registration purposes.

16 (2) The department, agent, or contractor shall make the 17 mail-in registration application described in section 32-320 18 available at the time of application, review, or change of address 19 and shall provide assistance, if necessary, to the applicant in 20 completing the application to register to vote. The department shall 21 retain records indicating whether an applicant accepted or declined 22 the opportunity to register to vote.

23 (3) Department personnel, agents, and contractors
24 involved in the voter registration process pursuant to this section
25 shall not be considered deputy registrars or agents or employees of

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1 the election commissioner or county clerk.

2 The applicant may return the completed voter (4) 3 registration application to the department, agent, or contractor or may personally mail or deliver the application to the election 4 5 commissioner or county clerk as provided in section 32-321. If the 6 applicant returns the completed application to the department, agent, 7 or contractor, the department, agent, or contractor shall deliver the 8 application to the election commissioner or county clerk of the county in which the office of the department, agent, or contractor is 9 located not later than ten days after receipt by the department, 10 agent, or contractor, except that if the application is returned to 11 12 the department, agent, or contractor within five days prior to the 13 third Friday preceding any election, it shall be delivered not later 14 than five days after the date it is returned. The election 15 commissioner or county clerk shall, if necessary, forward the application to the election commissioner or county clerk of the 16 county in which the applicant resides within such prescribed time 17 limits. The application shall be completed and returned to the 18 department, agency, or contractor by the close of business on the 19 20 third Friday preceding any election to be registered to vote at such 21 election. A registration application received after the deadline shall not be processed by the election commissioner or county clerk 22 23 until after the election.

(5) The departments shall adopt and promulgate rules andregulations to ensure compliance with this section.

 Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 32-311 (1) Any elector may personally apply to register to vote at (1) the office of the election commissioner or county 4 5 clerk,  $\frac{(2)-(b)}{(b)}$  a registration site at which a deputy registrar is in б attendance, (3) (c) a department listed in section 32-310 at the time 7 of an application, review, or change of address as provided in such 8 section, or (4) the office of the county treasurer or Department 9 of Motor Vehicles while applying for a motor vehicle operator's 10 license or state identification card as provided in section 32-308.

11 (2) A person who is sixteen years of age or who is 12 seventeen years of age and will not attain the age of eighteen years 13 on or before the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of 14 the then current calendar year and who is otherwise qualified to 15 register to vote may personally apply to preregister to vote by the 16 same methods provided in subsection (1) of this section.

Sec. 6. Section 32-311.01, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

19 32-311.01 (1) The Secretary of State shall prescribe and 20 distribute a registration application which may be used statewide to 21 register to vote, preregister to vote, and update voter registration 22 records. An applicant may use the application to register to vote, to 23 preregister to vote, or to update his or her voter registration 24 record with changes in his or her personal information or other 25 information related to his or her eligibility to vote. An applicant

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may submit the application in person, through a personal messenger or 1 2 personal agent, or by mail. Every election commissioner or county 3 clerk shall accept such an application for registration. If an applicant who is eligible to register or preregister to vote submits 4 5 the application in person at the office of the election commissioner or county clerk, the information from the application shall be 6 7 entered into the voter registration register in the presence of the 8 applicant if possible.

9 (2) The application shall contain substantially all the 10 information provided in section 32-312 and the following 11 informational statements:

12 (a) An applicant who is unable to sign his or her name 13 may affix his or her mark next to his or her name written on the 14 signature line by some other person;

(b) If the application is submitted by mail and the 15 applicant is registering or preregistering in the state for the first 16 time and has not previously voted within the state, the applicant 17 must submit with the application a copy of a photo identification 18 which is current and valid or a copy of a utility bill, bank 19 20 statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document that is current and that shows the name and address of the applicant 21 as they appear on the application in order to avoid additional 22 23 identification requirements when voting for the first time;

24 (c) An applicant may deliver the application to the 25 office of the election commissioner or county clerk in person,

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1 through a personal messenger or personal agent, or by mail; 2 (d) To vote at the polling place on election day, the an 3 elector's completed application must be: (i) Delivered by the applicant in person to the office of 4 5 the election commissioner or county clerk on or before the deadline prescribed in section 32-302; 6 7 (ii) Delivered by the applicant's personal messenger or personal agent to the office of the election commissioner or county 8 clerk on or before the third Friday before the election; or 9 10 (iii) Postmarked on or before the third Friday before the election if the application is submitted by mail; and 11 12 (e) The election commissioner or county clerk will, upon 13 receipt of an application for preregistration, send a confirmation of registration to the applicant upon reaching the age of eligibility in 14 order to provide verification of his or her qualifications and 15 16 address under section 11 of this act, and after verification of his or her qualifications and address, send an acknowledgement of 17 registration under section 32-322; and 18 19 (e) (f) The election commissioner or county clerk will, 20 upon receipt of the application for registration from an elector, 21 send an acknowledgment of registration to the applicant indicating whether the application is proper or not. 22 23 Sec. 7. Section 32-312, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2012, is amended to read: 24 25 32-312 The registration application prescribed by the

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Secretary of State pursuant to section 32-311.01 shall provide the
 instructional statements and request the information from the
 applicant as provided in this section.

4 CITIZENSHIP-"Are you a citizen of the United States of 5 America?" with boxes to check to indicate whether the applicant is or 6 is not a citizen of the United States.

7 WARNING—"If you checked 'no' in response to this
8 question, do not complete this application.".

9 AGE-"Are you at least eighteen years of age or will you 10 be eighteen years of age on or before the first Tuesday following the 11 first Monday of November of this year?" with boxes to check to 12 indicate whether or not the applicant will be eighteen years of age 13 or older on election day.

14 <u>"Are you at least sixteen years of age and understand</u>
15 that you must be eighteen years of age on or before election day to
16 vote?" with boxes to check to indicate whether or not the applicant
17 will be sixteen years of age and understands that the applicant must
18 be eighteen years of age or older on election day to be eligible to
19 vote.

20 WARNING—"If you checked 'no' in response to <u>either both</u> 21 of these questions, do not complete this application.".

NAME-the name of the applicant giving the first and last name in full, the middle name in full or the middle initial, and the maiden name of the applicant, if applicable.

25 RESIDENCE-the name and number of the street, avenue, or

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other location of the dwelling where the applicant resides if there 1 2 is a number. If the registrant resides in a hotel, apartment, 3 tenement house, or institution, such additional information shall be included as will give the exact location of such registrant's place 4 5 of residence. If the registrant lives in an incorporated or unincorporated area not identified by the use of roads, road names, 6 7 or house numbers, the registrant shall state the section, township, 8 and range of his or her residence and the corporate name of the school district as described in section 79-405 in which he or she is 9 10 located.

POSTAL ADDRESS—the address at which the applicant receives mail if different from the residence address.

ADDRESS OF LAST REGISTRATION-the name and number of the street, avenue, or other location of the dwelling from which the applicant last registered.

16 TELEPHONE NUMBERS-the telephone number of the applicant 17 at work and at home. At the request of the applicant, a designation 18 shall be made that the telephone number is an unlisted number, and 19 such designation shall preclude the listing of the applicant's 20 telephone number on any list of voter registrations.

EMAIL ADDRESS—an email address of the applicant. At the request of the applicant, a designation shall be made that the email address is private, and such designation shall preclude the listing of the applicant's email address on any list of voter registrations.

DRIVER'S LICENSE NUMBER OR LAST FOUR DIGITS OF SOCIAL

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SECURITY NUMBER-if the applicant has a Nebraska driver's license, the license number, and if the applicant does not have a Nebraska driver's license, the last four digits of the applicant's social security number.

5 DATE OF APPLICATION FOR REGISTRATION—the month, day, and 6 year when the applicant presented himself or herself for registration 7 or when the applicant completed and signed the registration 8 application if the application was submitted by mail or delivered to 9 the election official by the applicant's personal messenger or 10 personal agent.

PLACE OF BIRTH-show the state, country, kingdom, empire,
 or dominion where the applicant was born.

DATE OF BIRTH-show the date of the applicant's birth. The applicant shall be at least eighteen years of age or attain eighteen years of age on or before the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November to have the right to register and vote in any election in the present calendar year.

18 REGISTRATION TAKEN BY-show the signature of the 19 authorized official or staff member accepting the application 20 pursuant to section 32-309 or 32-310 or at least one of the deputy 21 registrars taking the application pursuant to section 32-306, if 22 applicable.

23 PARTY AFFILIATION—show the party affiliation of the 24 applicant as Democrat, Republican, or Other ..... or show no party 25 affiliation as Nonpartisan. (Note: If you wish to vote in both

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partisan and nonpartisan primary elections for state and local offices, you must indicate a political party affiliation on the registration application. If you register without a political party affiliation (nonpartisan), you will receive only the nonpartisan ballots for state and local offices at primary elections. If you register without a political party affiliation, you may vote in partisan primary elections for congressional offices.)

8 OTHER-information the Secretary of State determines will 9 assist in the proper and accurate registration of the voter.

10 Immediately following the spaces for inserting 11 information as provided in this section, the following statement 12 shall be printed:

13 To the best of my knowledge and belief, I declare under 14 penalty of election falsification that:

15 (1) I live in the State of Nebraska at the address16 provided in this application;

17 (2) I have not been convicted of a felony or, if 18 convicted, it has been at least two years since I completed my 19 sentence for the felony, including any parole term;

20 (3) I have not been officially found to be non compos21 mentis (mentally incompetent); and

(4) I am a citizen of the United States.

Any registrant who signs this application knowing that any of the information in the application is false shall be guilty of a Class IV felony under section 32-1502 of the statutes of Nebraska.

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The penalty for a Class IV felony is up to five years imprisonment, a
 fine of up to ten thousand dollars, or both.

3 APPLICANT'S SIGNATURE-require the applicant to affix his4 or her signature to the application.

7 32-312.05 (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection 8 (2) of this section, the The date that a person's voter registration record or an update of his or her voter registration record becomes 9 10 effective is the date the person presented himself or herself in person to register, the date the registration application was 11 12 delivered to the election commissioner or county clerk, or the date 13 the registration application was received by the election commissioner or county clerk if the person submitted the registration 14 15 application by mail.

16 (2) For a person who preregisters to vote pursuant to section 11 of this act, the date that such person's voter 17 registration record, or any update of his or her voter registration 18 record prior to becoming eligible to vote, becomes effective is (a) 19 20 January 1 of the year during which such person is seventeen years old 21 and will attain the age of eighteen years on or before the first 22 Tuesday after the first Monday in November of such year if he or she 23 verifies his or her qualifications and address as provided in such preregistration pursuant to section 11 of this act or (b) his or her 24 eighteenth birthday for any such person who attains the age of 25

5 Sec. 9. Section 32-318.01, Reissue Revised Statutes of
6 Nebraska, is amended to read:

7 32-318.01 (1)(a) Except as provided by subsection (2) of 8 this section, a person who registers or preregisters to vote by mail after January 1, 2003, and has not previously voted in an election 9 within the state shall present a photographic identification which is 10 current and valid or a copy of a utility bill, bank statement, 11 12 government check, paycheck, or other government document which is 13 dated within the sixty days immediately prior to the date of presentation and which shows the same name and residence address of 14 15 the person provided on the registration application in order to avoid 16 identification requirements at the time of voting pursuant to section 17 32-914 or 32-947.

(b) Such documentation may be presented at the time of 18 application for registration, after submission of the application for 19 20 registration, or at the time of voting. The documentation must be received by the election commissioner or county clerk not later than 21 6 p.m. on the second Friday preceding the election to avoid 22 23 additional identification requirements at the time of voting at the polling place if the voter votes in person. If the voter is voting 24 using a ballot for early voting, the documentation must be received 25

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1 by the election commissioner or county clerk prior to the date on 2 which the ballot is mailed to the voter to avoid additional 3 identification requirements at the time of voting. Documentation 4 received after the ballot has been mailed to the voter but not later 5 than 8 p.m. on election day will be considered timely for purposes of 6 determining the applicant's eligibility to vote in the election.

7 (c) Such documentation may be presented in person, by8 mail, or by facsimile transmission.

9 (d) Failure to present such documentation may result in 10 the ballot not being counted pursuant to verification procedures 11 prescribed in sections 32-1002 and 32-1027.

12 (2) A person who registers <u>or preregisters</u> to vote by 13 mail after January 1, 2003, and has not previously voted in an 14 election within the state shall not be required to present 15 identification if he or she:

16 (a) Has provided his or her Nebraska driver's license 17 number or the last four digits of his or her social security number 18 and the election commissioner or county clerk verifies the number 19 provided pursuant to subsection (2) of section 32-312.03;

20 (b) Is a member of the armed forces of the United States 21 who by reason of active duty is absent from his or her place of 22 residence where the member is otherwise eligible to vote;

(c) Is a member of the United States Merchant Marine who by reason of service is away from his or her place of residence where the member is otherwise eligible to vote;

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1 (d) Is a spouse or dependent of a member of the armed 2 forces of the United States or United States Merchant Marine who is 3 absent from his or her place of residence due to the service of that 4 member;

5 (e) Resides outside the United States and but for such 6 residence would be qualified to vote in the state if the state was 7 the last place in which the person was domiciled before leaving the 8 United States; or

9 (f) Is elderly or handicapped and has requested to vote 10 by alternative means other than by casting a ballot at his or her 11 polling place on election day.

Sec. 10. Section 32-320, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

14 32-320 The only mail-in forms which may be used to register or preregister to vote shall be the official registration 15 application prescribed by the Secretary of State or the national mail 16 voter registration application prescribed by the federal Election 17 Assistance Commission. The Secretary of State shall provide such 18 19 official registration applications to all recruitment offices of the 20 United States Armed Forces in the State of Nebraska. The counties and state agencies listed in section 32-310 shall purchase such official 21 registration applications from the Secretary of State. The Secretary 22 23 of State shall remit proceeds from the sale of such applications to the State Treasurer for credit to the Election Administration Fund. 24

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Sec. 11. (1) A person who is sixteen years of age or who

1	is seventeen years of age and will not attain the age of eighteen
2	years on or before the first Tuesday after the first Monday in
3	November of the then current calendar year and who is otherwise
4	qualified to register to vote may preregister to vote and shall be
5	automatically registered to vote upon reaching the age of eligibility
б	after verification of his or her qualifications and address as
7	provided in this section.
8	(2) Any person described in subsection (1) of this
9	section may request a voter registration application from the office
10	of the Secretary of State or the election commissioner or county
11	clerk. The Secretary of State and the election commissioner or county
12	clerk shall make registration applications prescribed by the
13	Secretary of State available and may place the applications in public
14	places. The Secretary of State and the election commissioner or
15	county clerk may require that all unused applications be returned to

6	(6)(a) A registration application completed and signed by

8	update his or her voter registration record shall be completed in
9	person at or delivered or mailed to the office of the election
10	commissioner or county clerk. To avoid additional requirements at the
11	polling place pursuant to section 32-914.01, 32-914.02, or 32-915, an
12	application to update a voter registration record must be:
13	(i) Completed or delivered by the applicant in person at
14	the office of the election commissioner or county clerk on or before
15	the deadline prescribed in section 32-302; or
16	(ii) Delivered by a personal messenger or personal agent
17	or mailed so that it is received by the election commissioner or
18	county clerk on or before the deadline prescribed in section 32-321.
