- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to state government; to amend sections 2 60-1404, 72-723, 72-2210, 72-2213, 80-401.11, 81-1108.36, and 3 81-1108.38, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section 3-106, 4 Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2016; to change provisions 5 regarding office space and state property; to provide and change 6 duties for the Nebraska Capitol Commission and the Office of the 7 Nebraska Capitol Commission; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal 8 the original sections.
- 9 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 3-106, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 2 2016, is amended to read:
- 3 3-106 (1) The department Suitable offices shall be provided for the
- 4 department in the State Capitol. It may maintain offices at such other
- 5 places in the state as it may designate subject to subsection (2) of
- 6 <u>section 81-1108.22</u> and may incur the necessary expense for office <u>rent,</u>
- 7 furniture, stationery, printing, and other incidental or necessary
- 8 expenses for the enforcement of the State Aeronautics Department Act and
- 9 the general promotion of aeronautics within the state.
- 10 (2) The department may purchase aircraft for the use of state
- 11 government and may sell any state aircraft that is not needed or suitable
- 12 for state uses. State aircraft shall be subject at all times to the
- 13 written orders of the Governor for use and service in any branch of the
- 14 state government. The department shall establish an hourly rate for use
- of a state aircraft by a state official or agency. The hourly rate shall
- 16 not include an amount to recover the cost of acquisition by purchase, but
- 17 shall include amounts for items such as variable fuel and oil costs,
- 18 routine maintenance costs, landing fees, and preventive maintenance
- 19 reserves.
- 20 (3) The department may employ such clerical and other employees and
- 21 assistants as it may deem necessary for the proper transaction of its
- 22 business.
- 23 (4) It is the intent of the Legislature that the use of state-owned,
- 24 chartered, or rented aircraft by the department shall be for the sole
- 25 purpose of state business. The department shall electronically file with
- 26 the Clerk of the Legislature a quarterly report on the department's use
- 27 of all state-owned, chartered, or rented aircraft that includes the
- 28 following information for each trip: The name of the agency or other
- 29 entity traveling; the name of each individual passenger; all purposes of
- 30 the trip; the destination and intermediate stops; the miles flown; and
- 31 the duration of the trip.

- 3 60-1404 <u>(1)</u> The board shall have the authority to employ an
- 4 executive director. The executive director who shall direct and
- 5 administer the affairs of the board and who shall keep a record of all
- 6 proceedings, transactions, communications, and official acts of the
- 7 board. He or she shall be custodian of all records of the board and
- 8 perform such other duties as the board may require.
- 9 (2) The executive director shall call a meeting of the board at the
- 10 direction of the chairperson thereof or upon a written request of two or
- 11 more members thereof.
- 12 (3) The executive director, with the approval of the board, is
- 13 authorized to employ an attorney at a minimum salary of six hundred
- 14 dollars per month together with such other employees, including staff for
- its attorney, as may be necessary to properly carry out the Motor Vehicle
- 16 Industry Regulation Act, to fix the salaries of such employees, and to
- 17 make such other expenditures as are necessary to properly carry out the
- 18 act.
- 19 (4) The office of the board shall be maintained in the State Capitol
- 20 at Lincoln, and all files, records, and property of the board shall at
- 21 all times be and remain at the office. The executive director, with the
- 22 approval of the board, may make expenditures for rent for office space
- 23 <u>subject to subsection (2) of section 81-1108.22</u> therein.
- 24 (5) The executive director shall be the board's representative in
- 25 the administration of the act, and he or she shall insure that the
- 26 policies and directives of the board are carried out.

- 6 amended to read:
- 7 72-2210 (1) The office shall have the primary functions and
- 8 responsibilities of facilities planning, facilities construction, and
- 9 facilities administration for the State Capitol and capitol grounds and
- 10 may adopt and promulgate rules and regulations to carry out the
- 11 provisions of this section and subsection (1) of section 81-1108.38.
- 12 (2) Facilities planning includes the following responsibilities and
- 13 duties:
- 14 (a) To maintain utilization records of the State Capitol and capitol
- 15 grounds;
- 16 (b) To define and review program statements based on space
- 17 utilization standards;
- (c) To prepare and review planning and construction documents;
- 19 (d) To develop and maintain time-cost schedules for capital
- 20 construction projects;
- 21 (e) To prepare annually a long-range plan for the commission,
- 22 listing the maintenance needed for the interior and exterior of the State
- 23 Capitol; and
- 24 (f) To assist the commission, the budget division of the Department
- 25 of Administrative Services, and the Legislative Fiscal Analyst in
- 26 preparing budget recommendations.
- 27 (3) Facilities construction includes the following powers and
- 28 duties:
- 29 (a) To maintain close contact with and inspections of each project
- 30 for the State Capitol and capitol grounds so as to assure execution of
- 31 the highest quality work product, time-cost schedules, and efficient

- 1 contract performance;
- 2 (b) To perform final acceptance inspections and evaluations; and
- 3 (c) To coordinate all modifications or change orders and progress
- 4 payment orders.
- 5 (4) Facilities administration includes the following powers and
- 6 duties:
- 7 (a) To provide or assure adequate administration and preservation
- 8 maintenance of, repairs to, and custodial duties for the State Capitol
- 9 and capitol grounds;
- 10 (b) To be responsible for all maintenance, repairs, and custodial
- 11 duties necessary to preserve properly and maintain the State Capitol and
- 12 capitol grounds;
- 13 (c) To report to the commission quarterly, or as prescribed by the
- 14 commission, the time-cost data on State Capitol construction projects;
- 15 (d) To be responsible for parking on the capitol grounds; and
- (e) To submit to the commission a final report on each State Capitol
- 17 project. The report shall include, but not be limited to, a comparison of
- 18 final costs and appropriations made for the project, change orders, and
- 19 modifications, and a conclusion as to whether the construction complied
- 20 with the related approved project purpose and program statement. Such
- 21 report shall be required on all projects costing fifty thousand dollars
- 22 or more and any other projects designated by the commission.

- 25 72-2213 (1) The office space in the State Capitol or any other state
- 26 office building occupied by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary
- 27 of State, State Treasurer, Attorney General, Auditor of Public Accounts,
- 28 or Chief Justice and judges of the Supreme Court and Court of Appeals,
- 29 including the office of the Clerk of the Supreme Court and courtrooms,
- 30 shall remain under the control of such constitutional officer or Chief
- 31 Justice. The Executive Board of the Legislative Council shall determine

- its office space requirements in the State Capitol and may occupy such office space as it requires except as provided in this subsection.
- 3 the determination by the Executive Board of (2) After the 4 Legislative Council pursuant to subsection (1) of this section, administrator, with the advice of the commission, shall determine the 5 space needs of all other departments and agencies of the state located in 6 7 the State Capitol and assign the remaining office space. The determination of such needs shall be based the 8 on following 9 considerations: (a) The availability of space within the State Capitol as provided in this section; (b) the desirability of locating all divisions 10 and other organizational subunits of each department and agency of the 11 state in physical proximity to the office of its head; (c) the degree to 12 which the convenience of the public may be served by assignment of 13 various areas within the State Capitol; (d) the interdependence of 14 and operating procedures of the various 15 functions agencies; (e) 16 applicable standards governing office requirements; and (f) the 17 availability of appropriations with which to finance renovations, remodeling, and movement of equipment necessary to accommodate any 18 proposed assignment or reassignment of area. 19
- The office shall have responsibility for provision 20 and lighting fixtures, heating, 21 replacement of lighting, cooling and ventilation, and janitorial, custodial, and all other building services, 22 including care and custody of the State Capitol and capitol grounds, as 23 24 may now be provided by law.
- (4) Responsibility for employment and supervision of custodial workers for areas of the State Capitol occupied by the Legislature, the courts, and executive departments and agencies shall be in accordance with such agreements as may be defined by authorized representatives of the three branches. All funds for improvements, remodeling, renovation, partitioning, or replacement of major fixtures, including carpeting, flooring, provision of drapes, lighting fixtures, and lamps, within any

- 1 area of the State Capitol shall be at the disposal of the administrator.
- 2 (5) After a recommendation from the commission to name a room or
- 3 other portion of the State Capitol pursuant to section 81-1108.38, the
- 4 Legislature shall by resolution reject or approve such recommendation.

- 8 of Veterans' Affairs in the State Capitol. It may maintain necessary
- 9 offices at such other places in the state as it may designate subject to
- 10 subsection (2) of section 81-1108.22 and may incur the necessary expense
- 11 for office <u>rent,</u> furniture, stationery, printing, and other incidental or
- 12 necessary expenses. The department It may employ such clerical and other
- 13 employees and assistants as it may deem necessary for the proper
- 14 transaction of its business.

- 17 81-1108.36 Except when sites or structures are named by statute, the
- 18 administrator, after considering any recommendations of the Nebraska
- 19 Capitol Commission if such sites or structures are within the Nebraska
- 20 State Capitol Environs District as provided in subsection (1) of section
- 21 81-1108.38, shall review the proposals of the various agencies and
- 22 commissions for the naming of state-owned or leased sites or structures.
- 23 Unless otherwise provided by statute, sites or structures shall not be
- 24 named for citizens who are active elected officials or active employees
- 25 of the State of Nebraska. Subsequent to review, the proposed name shall
- 26 be approved by the Governor and the Legislature.

- 1 by the Legislature, (b) approve or reject recommendations to name state-
- 2 <u>owned or leased sites or structures within the Nebraska State Capitol</u>
- 3 Environs District, and (c) approve or reject recommendations to establish
- 4 a monument or memorial, except a monument or memorial that is part of the
- 5 Nebraska Hall of Fame, or to remove a monument or memorial on or in the
- 6 State Capitol or on the capitol grounds.
- 7 (2) The (1) It shall be the duty of the Nebraska Capitol Commission
- 8 shall to provide advice to the Office of the Nebraska Capitol Commission

- 1 meetings on a quarterly basis or as needed. The commission shall meet at
- 2 least annually with the Nebraska State Capitol Environs Commission to
- 3 discuss and coordinate projects that may impact the capitol and its
- 4 environs. The meeting with the Nebraska State Capitol Environs Commission
- 5 may be held in conjunction with one of the meetings of the Nebraska
- 6 Capitol Commission required by this subsection.
- 7 (5) (3) In addition to any other rights and powers conferred upon
- 8 the Nebraska Capitol Commission commission, it shall monitor and advise
- 9 the State Building Administrator in exercising the power of eminent
- 10 domain on behalf of the state for the purpose of acquiring sites or
- 11 buildings for state use within the Nebraska State Capitol Environs
- 12 <u>District</u>. The administrator may for such purpose take, hold, and condemn
