LEGISLATIVE BILL 1337

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to schools; to adopt the School Construction
- 2 Financing Act.
- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Sections 1 to 7 of this act shall be known and may be
- 2 <u>cited as the School Construction Financing Act.</u>
- 3 Sec. 2. The purpose of the School Construction Financing Act is to
- 4 streamline the process of school construction projects and provide state
- 5 support to school construction projects while maintaining and protecting
- 6 local control for school districts.
- 7 Sec. 3. For purposes of the School Construction Financing Act:
- 8 (1) Extraordinary growth means an above average growth in the
- 9 <u>student population of such school district as determined by the state</u>
- 10 board;
- 11 (2) School construction project means any project involving a
- 12 renovation, modification, or addition to school district property or
- 13 <u>facilities or the construction of a new school building on school</u>
- 14 <u>district property; and</u>
- 15 (3) State board means the State Board of Education.
- Sec. 4. A school district is eligible to apply for matching funds
- 17 from the State of Nebraska of up to fifty percent of the cost of a school
- 18 construction project for use on such project if the school district:
- 19 (1) Has had extraordinary growth within the five years prior to
- 20 applying for such matching funds;
- 21 (2) Has had recent destruction or damage to educational facilities
- 22 by fire or natural disaster; or
- 23 (3) Is required to replace school district facilities due to such
- 24 facilities being certified by the appropriate inspection individual to be
- 25 hazardous to health or safety or to be in a violation of any health or
- 26 <u>safety standards.</u>
- 27 Sec. 5. (1) A school district eligible to apply for matching funds
- 28 from the state for a school construction project pursuant to section 4 of
- 29 this act may apply in a manner prescribed by the state board for such
- 30 <u>matching funds.</u>
- 31 (2) A school district shall include with an application for matching

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1 funds pursuant to this section, a facilities plan that contains the

- 2 <u>following information for such school district:</u>
- 3 (a) Student population historical data;
- 4 (b) Student population projections for the ensuing five-year period
- 5 at the time of the application;
- 6 (c) System organization patterns at the time of the application and
- 7 future projections;
- 8 (d) Minimum and maximum limits on the student population size based
- 9 on the facilities available at the time of application for all
- 10 elementary, middle, and high schools;
- 11 (e) Instructional service and support programs for each school;
- 12 <u>(f) Facility needs, including the estimated cost for any</u>
- 13 <u>renovations, modifications, additions, or new school buildings;</u>
- 14 (g) School facilities that are to be closed, phased out, or
- 15 abandoned;
- 16 (h) The school construction project proposal for which the state
- 17 matching funds are requested;
- 18 (i) Proposed financing for effectuating the school construction
- 19 project proposal for which the state matching funds are requested,
- 20 including any local, state, federal, and other funding sources;
- 21 (j) The total cost of the school construction project for which the
- 22 state matching funds are requested; and
- 23 <u>(k) Any other information the state board may require.</u>
- 24 Sec. 6. The Commissioner of Education shall approve or deny
- 25 applications for matching funds pursuant to the School Construction
- 26 Financing Act and shall include the cost for any approved application as
- 27 part of the commissioner's operating budget request submitted to the
- 28 Legislature and the Governor.
- 29 Sec. 7. The state board shall adopt and promulgate rules and
- 30 regulations to carry out the School Construction Financing Act no later
- 31 than July 1, 2025.
