## A BILL

1	FOR AN ACT	relating to the Concealed Handgun Permit Act; to amend
2		section 69-2433, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
3		2010; to change application requirements relating to
4		residency; and to repeal the original section.

5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1	Section 1. Section 69-2433, Revised Statutes Cumulative	
2	Supplement, 2010, is amended to read:	
3	69-2433 An applicant shall:	
4	(1) Be at least twenty-one years of age;	
5	(2) Not be prohibited from purchasing or possessing a	
6	handgun by 18 U.S.C. 922, as such section existed on January 1, 2005;	
7	(3) Possess the same powers of eyesight as required under	
8	section 60-4,118 for a Class O operator's license. If an applicant	
9	does not possess a current Nebraska motor vehicle operator's license,	
10	the applicant may present a current optometrist's or	
11	ophthalmologist's statement certifying the vision reading obtained	
12	when testing the applicant. If such certified vision reading meets	
13	the vision requirements prescribed by section 60-4,118 for a Class O	
14	operator's license, the vision requirements of this subdivision shall	
15	have been met;	
16	(4) Not have pled guilty to, not have pled nolo	
17	contendere to, or not have been convicted of a felony under the laws	
18	of this state or under the laws of any other jurisdiction;	
19	(5) Not have pled guilty to, not have pled nolo	
20	contendere to, or not have been convicted of a misdemeanor crime of	
21	violence under the laws of this state or under the laws of any other	
22	jurisdiction within the ten years immediately preceding the date of	
23	application;	
24	(6) Not have been found in the previous ten years to be a	
25	mentally ill and dangerous person under the Nebraska Mental Health

Commitment Act or a similar law of another jurisdiction or not be
currently adjudged mentally incompetent;

3 (7)(a) Have been a resident of this state for at least 4 one hundred eighty days. For purposes of this section, resident does 5 not include an applicant who maintains a residence in another state 6 and claims that residence for voting or tax purposes except as 7 provided in subdivision (b) <u>or (c)</u> of this subdivision; <del>or</del>

8 (b) If an applicant is a member of the United States 9 Armed Forces, such applicant shall be considered a resident of this 10 state for purposes of this section after he or she has been stationed 11 at a military installation in this state pursuant to permanent duty 12 station orders even though he or she maintains a residence in another 13 state and claims that residence for voting or tax purposes; or

14 (c) If an applicant is a new Nebraska resident and 15 possesses a valid permit to carry a concealed handgun issued by his 16 or her previous state of residence that is recognized by this state 17 pursuant to section 69-2448, such applicant shall be considered a 18 resident of this state for purposes of this section;

19 (8) Have had no violations of any law of this state 20 relating to firearms, unlawful use of a weapon, or controlled 21 substances or of any similar laws of another jurisdiction in the ten 22 years preceding the date of application;

23 (9) Not be on parole, probation, house arrest, or work24 release;

25 (10) Be a citizen of the United States; and
