## **LEGISLATIVE BILL 200**

Introduced by Vargas, 7; Hunt, 8; Morfeld, 46. Read first time January 08, 2021 Committee:

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to schools; to amend section 79-729, Reissue
2	Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to add a high school graduation
3	requirement and provide an exception as prescribed; to provide a
4	duty for schools to submit data to the State Department of
5	Education; to provide duties for the Commissioner of Education and
6	require an annual report to the Legislature; to provide for rules
7	and regulations as prescribed; and to repeal the original section.
8	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 79-729, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
 amended to read:

3 79-729 (1) The Legislature recognizes the importance of assuring 4 that all persons who graduate from Nebraska high schools possess certain 5 minimum levels of knowledge, skills, and understanding.

6 <u>(2) Each Beginning in school year 1987-88, each high school student</u> 7 shall complete a minimum of two hundred high school credit hours prior to 8 graduation. At least eighty percent of such credit hours shall be core 9 curriculum courses prescribed by the State Board of Education.

10 <u>(3)(a) Beginning with the 2022-23 school year, each public high</u> 11 <u>school student shall complete and submit to the United States Department</u> 12 <u>of Education a Free Application for Federal Student Aid prior to</u> 13 <u>graduating from such high school except as otherwise provided in this</u> 14 <u>subsection.</u>

(b) A public high school student shall not be required to comply
with subdivision (3)(a) of this section if:

(i) A parent or legal guardian of or a person standing in loco parentis to such student signs and submits the appropriate form prescribed by the Commissioner of Education pursuant to subdivision (3) (c) of this section indicating that such parent, legal guardian, or person standing in loco parentis authorizes such student to decline to complete and submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid;

(ii) The school principal or the school principal's designee signs
and submits the appropriate form prescribed by the Commissioner of
Education pursuant to subdivision (3)(c) of this section authorizing such
student to decline to complete and submit a Free Application for Federal
Student Aid for good cause as determined by the school principal or the
school principal's designee; or

(iii) A student who is nineteen years of age or older or is an
 emancipated minor signs and submits the appropriate form prescribed by
 the Commissioner of Education pursuant to subdivision (3)(c) of this

section stating that such student declines to complete and submit a Free 1 2 Application for Federal Student Aid. (c) The Commissioner of Education shall prescribe the forms to be 3 used by each public high school for purposes of subdivision (3)(b) of 4 this section. Such forms shall be made available: 5 (i) By each public high school to students, parents and legal 6 7 guardians of students, and persons standing in loco parentis to students; 8 and 9 (ii) In English, Spanish, and any other language spoken by a 10 majority of the students enrolled in any English learner program at such public high school. 11 (d) The school principal or the school principal's designee of each 12 public high school shall provide such compliance information to the 13 school district or governing authority for such public high school and to 14 15 the State Department of Education without disclosing, for any student who has complied with the requirements of this subsection, personally 16 17 identifiable information distinguishing whether such compliance was pursuant to subdivision (3)(a) of this section or subdivision (3)(b) of 18 19 this section. Such school principal or school principal's designee shall provide separately the aggregate number of students who have not complied 20 21 with this subsection, who complied pursuant to subdivision (3)(a) of this 22 section, and who complied pursuant to subdivision (3)(b) of this section, unless otherwise prohibited by federal or state law regarding the 23 24 confidentiality of student educational information. 25 (e) On or before December 31, 2023, and on or before December 31 of each year thereafter, the Commissioner of Education shall electronically 26 27 submit a report with the information received by the State Department of

28 <u>Education pursuant to subdivision (3)(d) of this section to the Clerk of</u> 29 the Legislature.

30 (4) The State Board of Education may establish recommended statewide
 31 graduation guidelines. This section does not prohibit the governing board

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of any high school from prescribing specific graduation guidelines as
 long as such guidelines do not conflict with this section.

3 <u>(5)</u> This section does not apply to high school students whose 4 individualized education <u>programs</u> <del>plans</del> prescribe a different course of 5 instruction. This section does not prohibit the governing board of any 6 high school from prescribing specific graduation guidelines as long as 7 such guidelines do not conflict with this section.

8 (6) For purposes of this section, high school means grades nine 9 through twelve and credit hour shall be defined by appropriate rules and 10 regulations of the State Board of Education but shall not be less than 11 the amount of credit given for successful completion of a course which 12 meets at least one period per week for at least one semester.

<u>(7) The State Department of Education shall adopt and promulgate</u>
 <u>rules and regulations as necessary to implement this section. Such rules</u>
 <u>and regulations shall include, but not be limited to:</u>

(a) A timeline for the distribution of the Free Application for
Federal Student Aid and the forms prescribed pursuant to subdivision (3)
(c) of this section by public high schools and for the submission of the
Free Application for Federal Student Aid and the forms prescribed
pursuant to subdivision (3)(c) of this section by students;

(b) Standards regarding the information that a public high school
 must provide to students regarding:

23 (i) Instructions for filling out the Free Application for Federal
24 <u>Student Aid;</u>

(ii) The options available to a student under subdivision (3)(b) of
 this section if a student wishes to decline to complete and submit a Free
 Application for Federal Student Aid; and

(iii) The method by which a student shall provide proof to the
 public high school that such student has completed and submitted the Free
 Application for Federal Student Aid or a form prescribed pursuant to
 subdivision (3)(c) of this section; and

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1	<u>(c) A requirement for each public high school to report the number</u>
2	of students who completed and submitted a Free Application for Federal
3	Student Aid and the number of students who instead submitted a form
4	prescribed pursuant to subdivision (3)(c) of this section.
