- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. (1) The Legislature finds and declares that:
- 2 (a) One of the purposes of an expressway system is to connect urban
- 3 population centers to each other and to populations in rural areas for
- 4 the benefit of those who commute to urban areas for work and school.
- 5 (b) The planning, design, and purchase of rights-of-way for a
- 6 continuous four-lane divided highway system located along U.S. Highway 75
- 7 from Plattsmouth, Nebraska, and running south to the Kansas border are
- 8 <u>critically necessary to link southeast Nebraska to Omaha and other parts</u>
- 9 of the state; and
- 10 <u>(c) The planning, design, and purchase of rights-of-way described in</u>
- 11 this subsection will address the growth of global transportation,
- 12 <u>agribusiness, tourism industries, and significant safety concerns for a</u>
- 13 growing commuter population in southeast Nebraska.
- 14 (2) The Department of Transportation shall plan, design, and
- 15 purchase rights-of-way for a four-lane divided highway system located
- 16 along U.S. Highway 75 running from Plattsmouth, Nebraska, south to the
- 17 Kansas border.
- 18 (3) It is the intent of the Legislature to appropriate General Funds
- 19 for the planning, design, and purchase of rights-of-way for U.S. Highway
- 20 <u>75 between Plattsmouth, Nebraska, and the Kansas border into a four-lane</u>
- 21 <u>divided highway.</u>
- 22 (4) It is the intent of the Legislature to appropriate General Funds
- 23 <u>for the paving or hard-surfacing of all state highways in the state that</u>
- 24 remain unpaved.
