1	A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to judges' salaries; to amend section
2	24-201.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2014; to change
3	the salary of Supreme Court judges; to provide an operative date; to
4	repeal the original section; and to declare an emergency.
5	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 24-201.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative
 Supplement, 2014, is amended to read:

3 24-201.01 On July 1, 2012, the salary of the Chief Justice and the 4 judges of the Supreme Court shall be one hundred forty-five thousand six 5 hundred fourteen dollars and seventy-four cents. On July 1, 2013, the 6 salary of the Chief Justice and the judges of the Supreme Court shall be 7 one hundred fifty-two thousand eight hundred ninety-five dollars and 8 forty-eight cents. On July 1, 2014, the salary of the Chief Justice and 9 the judges of the Supreme Court shall be one hundred sixty thousand five hundred forty dollars and twenty-five cents. On July 1, 2015, the salary 10 of the Chief Justice and the judges of the Supreme Court shall be one 11 hundred sixty-seven thousand seven hundred sixty-four dollars. On July 1, 12 13 2016, the salary of the Chief Justice and the judges of the Supreme Court shall be one hundred seventy-five thousand three hundred thirteen 14 dollars. 15

The Chief Justice and the judges of the Supreme Court shall hold no other public office of profit or trust during their terms of office nor accept any public appointment or employment under the authority of the government of the United States for which they receive compensation for their services. Such salaries shall be payable in equal monthly installments.

22 Sec. 2. This act becomes operative on July 1, 2015.

Sec. 3. Original section 24-201.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative
Supplement, 2014, is repealed.

25 Sec. 4. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when 26 passed and approved according to law.
