5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 38-1706, Reissue Revised Statutes of
 Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 38-1706 Massage therapy means the physical, mechanical, 4 or electrical manipulation of soft tissue for the therapeutic 5 purposes of enhancing muscle relaxation, reducing stress, improving circulation, or instilling a greater sense of well-being and may б 7 include the use of oil, salt glows, heat lamps, and hydrotherapy. 8 Massage therapy does not include diagnosis or treatment or use of 9 procedures for which a license to practice medicine or surgery, chiropractic, or podiatry is required nor the use of microwave 10 diathermy, shortwave diathermy, ultrasound, transcutaneous electrical 11 12 nerve stimulation, electrical stimulation of over thirty-five volts, 13 neurological hyperstimulation, or spinal and joint adjustments.

Sec. 2. Section 38-1709, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

16 38-1709 (1) No person shall engage in the practice of 17 massage therapy, advertise massage therapy services, hold oneself out 18 <u>as a massage therapist, or engage in or</u> the operation of a massage 19 therapy school or establishment unless he or she obtains a license 20 from the department for that purpose.

21 (2) All forms and purposes of massage are considered 22 massage therapy unless excluded under section 38-1706 or 38-1708. Any 23 person engaging in the physical, mechanical, or electrical 24 manipulation of soft tissue for compensation in the State of Nebraska 25 is practicing massage therapy, whether or not such service is

1	described as massage, massage therapy, nontherapeutic massage, or any
2	other variant or any substitute for the term massage, and is required
3	to be licensed as a massage therapist pursuant to the Massage Therapy
4	Practice Act unless excluded under section 38-1706 or 38-1708.
