1 Section 1. Section 86-1029.02, Revised Statutes Cumulative
2 Supplement, 2018, is amended to read:

3 86-1029.02 (1) Any local governing body, the commission, or any
4 public safety agency and their employees, including employees of public
5 safety answering points, involved in the provision of next-generation 911
6 service, shall, except for failure to use reasonable care or for
7 intentional acts, be immune from liability or the payment of damages in
8 providing next-generation 911 service.

9 (2) Except as provided in subsection (1) of this section, any Any
10 person involved in the provision of next-generation 911 service who: (a)
11 ~~(1)~~ Receives, develops, collects, or processes information for any 911
12 data base; (b) ~~(2)~~ provides local exchange, interexchange, or transport
13 service in connection with any next-generation 911 service; (c) ~~(3)~~
14 relays, transfers, operates, maintains, or provides next-generation 911
15 service or systems capabilities; or (d) ~~(4)~~ provides next-generation 911
16 communications service for emergency service providers shall, except for
17 actions or inactions that constitute gross negligence ~~failure to use~~
18 ~~reasonable care or for intentional wrongful~~ acts, be immune from
19 liability or the payment of damages in the performance of installing,
20 maintaining, or providing next-generation 911 service.
