## **LEGISLATIVE BILL 354**

Committee:

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to labor; to adopt the Wage Disclosure Act.
- 2 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Sections 1 to 5 of this act shall be known and may be

- 2 <u>cited as the Wage Disclosure Act.</u>
- 3 Sec. 2. <u>For purposes of the Wage Disclosure Act:</u>
- 4 (1) Employer means any individual, partnership, limited liability
- 5 company, association, corporation, business trust, legal representative,
- 6 or organized group of persons employing four or more individuals in this
- 7 <u>state at any one time. Employer does not include the United States, the</u>
- 8 state, or any political subdivision thereof;
- 9 (2) Job applicant means an individual seeking employment with an
- 10 employer; and
- 11 (3) Wages means all remuneration for employment, including the cash
- 12 <u>value of all remuneration paid in any medium other than cash.</u>
- Sec. 3. <u>It shall be unlawful for an employer to:</u>
- 14 (1) Screen job applicants based on their current or prior wages,
- 15 <u>including any requirement that a job applicant's current or prior wages</u>
- 16 satisfy minimum or maximum criteria;
- 17 (2) Request or require as a condition of being interviewed, or as a
- 18 condition of continuing to be considered for an offer of employment, that
- 19 <u>a job applicant disclose his or her current or prior wages; or</u>
- 20 (3) Seek information regarding a job applicant's current or prior
- 21 wages from the current or former employer of the job applicant, except
- 22 that an employer may confirm a job applicant's wages if the job applicant
- 23 provides written authorization to do so and the confirmation is done
- 24 after the employer has made an offer of employment to the job applicant.
- 25 Sec. 4. (1) The Commissioner of Labor may subpoena records and
- 26 <u>witnesses</u> related to the enforcement of the Wage Disclosure Act. The
- 27 <u>commissioner or his or her agent may inspect all related records and</u>
- 28 gather testimony on any matter relative to the enforcement of the act.
- 29 <u>(2) Any employer who violates the Wage Disclosure Act shall be</u>
- 30 guilty of a Class IV misdemeanor.
- 31 (3) It shall be the duty of the county attorney for the county in

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1 <u>which any violation of the Wage Disclosure Act occurs to prosecute the</u>

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- 2 <u>same in the district court in the county where the offense occurred.</u>
- 3 Sec. 5. The Commissioner of Labor may adopt and promulgate rules

4 and regulations to carry out the Wage Disclosure Act.
