A BILL

- 1 FOR AN ACT relating to state government; to adopt the Transparency in
- 2 Government Procurement Act; and to declare an emergency.
- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Sections 1 to 5 of this act shall be known and

- 2 may be cited as the Transparency in Government Procurement Act.
- 3 Sec. 2. (1) The Legislature finds that:
- 4 (a) Transparency in public procurement is an important
- 5 tool to deter corruption and to maintain the public's trust in
- 6 government contracting;
- 7 (b) Taxpayers deserve to know how and where their tax
- 8 <u>dollars are being spent;</u>
- 9 (c) The economy and general welfare of this state and its
- 10 people and the economy and general welfare of the United States are
- 11 <u>inseparably linked to the preservation and development of</u>
- 12 manufacturing industries in this state, as well as all the other
- 13 states of this nation; and
- 14 (d) Recognizing such link, it should be the policy of
- 15 this state that, whenever possible, taxpayer dollars be reinvested
- 16 with its individual and employer taxpayers in order to foster job
- 17 retention and growth and to ensure a broad and healthy tax base for
- 18 <u>future investments vital to the state's infrastructure.</u>
- 19 (2) The Legislature declares that it shall be the policy
- 20 of this state that the Department of Administrative Services shall
- 21 quantify the portion of its procurement spending that is reinvested
- 22 with taxpayers in this state and the nation.
- Sec. 3. (1) The Department of Administrative Services
- 24 <u>shall create an annual report that includes:</u>
- 25 (a) The total number and value of contracts awarded by

- 1 the department;
- 2 (b) The total number and value of contracts awarded by
- 3 <u>the department to contractors within this state;</u>
- 4 (c) The total number and value of contracts awarded by
- 5 the department to foreign contractors; and
- 6 (d) The total number of contracts awarded by the
- 7 <u>department for which a preference was given under section 73-101.01.</u>
- 8 (2) The first such report created pursuant to subsection
- 9 (1) of this section shall be submitted to the Governor and the
- 10 Legislature on or before September 1, 2015, and shall include the
- 11 information specified in such subsection from FY2014-15. Subsequent
- 12 reports shall be submitted on or before September 1 each year
- 13 thereafter and shall include the required information from the most
- 14 recent fiscal year ending prior to such date. The reports submitted
- 15 to the Legislature and the Governor shall be submitted
- 16 <u>electronically</u>. Each annual report shall be made available to the
- 17 public through publication on the department's web site on or before
- 18 <u>September 1 of each year.</u>
- 19 Sec. 4. Beginning on July 1, 2014, each contract awarded
- 20 by the Department of Administrative Services shall require that the
- 21 contractors provide to the department any and all information needed
- for compliance with section 3 of this act.
- Sec. 5. <u>The Transparency in Government Procurement Act</u>
- 24 applies only to contracts awarded by the Department of Administrative
- 25 <u>Services on and after July 1, 2014.</u>

1 Sec. 6. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect

2 when passed and approved according to law.
