- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Wage and Hour Act; to amend section
- 2 48-1203, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2018; to provide
- 3 for an annual adjustment to the minimum wage; to provide duties for
- 4 the State Treasurer and Department of Labor; to define a term; and
- 5 to repeal the original section.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 48-1203, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
2 2018, is amended to read:

3 48-1203 (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section and section
4 48-1203.01, every employer shall pay to each of his or her employees a
5 minimum wage of:

6 (a) Seven dollars and twenty-five cents per hour through December
7 31, 2014;

8 (b) Eight dollars per hour on and after January 1, 2015, through
9 December 31, 2015;~~and~~

10 (c) Nine dollars per hour on and after January 1, 2016 through April
11 1, 2020; and -

12 (d) The amount set pursuant to subsection (2) of this section on and
13 after April 1, 2020.

14 (2)(a) By January 31, 2020, and on or before each January 31
15 thereafter, the State Treasurer shall adjust the minimum wage by an
16 amount determined by the State Treasurer at the end of the preceding
17 calendar year to reflect the average annual percentage change in the
18 consumer price index for the most recent five-year period for which data
19 is available. The minimum wage so adjusted shall be rounded to the
20 nearest cent divisible by five. Such minimum wage shall become effective
21 beginning April 1 of such year.

22 (b) An annual increase under this subsection shall not exceed three
23 and one-half percent.

24 (c) By February 1, 2020, and on or before each February 1
25 thereafter, the Department of Labor shall post on the department's web
26 site the adjusted minimum wage that will take effect April 1 of such
27 year.

28 (d) As used in this subsection, consumer price index means the
29 Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers, as prepared by the United
30 States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.

31 (3) (-2) For persons compensated by way of gratuities such as

1 waitresses, waiters, hotel bellhops, porters, and shoeshine persons, the
2 employer shall pay wages at the minimum rate of two dollars and thirteen
3 cents per hour, plus all gratuities given to them for services rendered.
4 The sum of wages and gratuities received by each person compensated by
5 way of gratuities shall equal or exceed the minimum wage rate provided in
6 subsection (1) of this section. In determining whether or not the
7 individual is compensated by way of gratuities, the burden of proof shall
8 be upon the employer.

9 (4) ~~(3)~~ Any employer employing student-learners as part of a bona
10 fide vocational training program shall pay such student-learners' wages
11 at a rate of at least seventy-five percent of the minimum wage rate which
12 would otherwise be applicable.
