Section 1. Section 38-126, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read: 38-126 To protect the health, safety, and welfare of the public and to insure to the greatest extent possible the efficient, adequate, and safe practice of health services, health-related services, and environmental services: (1)(a) The appropriate board may adopt rules and regulations to: (i) Specify minimum standards required for a credential, including education, experience, and eligibility for taking the credentialing examination; (ii) Designate credentialing examinations, specify the passing score on credentialing examinations, and specify standards, if any, for accepting examination results from other jurisdictions; (iii) Set continuing competency requirements in conformance with section 38-145; (iv) Set standards for waiver of continuing competency requirements in conformance with section 38-146; (v) Set standards for courses of study; and (vi) Provide for use of a current and valid credential from another jurisdiction to obtain a credential under the Uniform Credentialing Act by a person who is leaving service in the United States Armed Forces; (vii) Provide for use of an expired credential issued

25 under the Uniform Credentialing Act to practice temporarily in order

to obtain a current credential under the act by a person who is 1 2 leaving service in a reserve component of the United States Armed 3 Forces; and 4 (vi) (viii) Specify acts in addition to those set out in 5 section 38-179 that constitute unprofessional conduct; and 6 (b) The department shall promulgate and enforce such 7 rules and regulations; 8 (2) For professions or businesses that do not have a 9 board created by statute: (a) The department may adopt, promulgate, and enforce 10 11 such rules and regulations; and 12 (b) The department shall carry out any statutory powers 13 and duties of the board; 14 (3) The department, with the recommendation of the 15 appropriate board, if any, may adopt, promulgate, and enforce rules 16 and regulations for the respective profession, other than those 17 specified in subdivision (1) of this section, to carry out the Uniform Credentialing Act; and 18 (4) The department may adopt, promulgate, and enforce 19 20 rules and regulations with general applicability to carry out the 21 Uniform Credentialing Act. Sec. 2. Section 38-161, Reissue Revised Statutes of 22 23 Nebraska, is amended to read: 24 38-161 (1) The purpose of each board is to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the public as prescribed in the 25

2 (2) The duties of each board include, but are not limited to, (a) setting the minimum standards of proficiency and competency 3 in accordance with section 38-126, (b) providing recommendations in 4 5 accordance with section 38-149, (c) providing recommendations related б to the issuance or denial of credentials, disciplinary action, and 7 changes in legislation, and (d) providing the department with 8 recommendations on regulations to carry out the Uniform Credentialing 9 Act in accordance with section 38-126.

10 (3) Each board may appoint advisory committees or other 11 advisory bodies as necessary for specific purposes. At least one 12 board member shall serve on each advisory committee or body, and 13 other members may be appointed from outside the board.

14 (4) Each board shall consider the ability of veterans to 15 meet the requirements for its credentialed profession using military 16 training, education, and experience.
