1	Section 1. Section 68-911, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is

3	68-911 (1) Medical assistance shall include coverage for health care										
4	and related services as required under Title XIX of the federal Social										
5	Security Act, including, but not limited to:										
6	(a) Inpatient and outpatient hospital services;										
7	(b) Laboratory and X-ray services;										
8	(c) Nursing facility services;										
9	(d) Home health services;										
10	(e) Nursing services;										
11	(f) Clinic services;

13	(h) Medical and surgical services of a dentist;

22	(2) In addition to coverage otherwise required under this section,										
23	medical assistance may include coverage for health care and related										
24	services as permitted but not required under Title XIX of the federal										
25	Social Security Act, including, but not limited to:

27	(b) Intermediate care facilities for persons with developmental

(3) No later than July 1, 2009, the department shall submit a state plan amendment or waiver to the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services to provide coverage under the medical assistance program for community-based secure residential and subacute behavioral health services for all eligible recipients, without regard to whether the recipient has been ordered by a mental health board under the Nebraska Mental Health Commitment Act to receive such services.

(4) On or before October 1, 2014, the department, after consultation with the State Department of Education, shall submit a state plan amendment to the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, as necessary, to provide that the following are direct reimbursable services when provided by school districts as part of an individualized education program or an individualized family service plan: Early and periodic

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screening, diagnosis, and treatment services for children; medical transportation services; mental health services; nursing services; occupational therapy services; personal care services; physical therapy services; rehabilitation services; speech therapy and other services for individuals with speech, hearing, or language disorders; and visionrelated services.

(5) No later than September 1, 2019, the department shall submit a 7 state plan amendment to the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid 8 9 Services for the purpose of providing medical assistance for family planning services for persons whose income is at or below the income 10 eligibility level set by the state as of January 1, 2019, for coverage 11 for pregnant women, as permitted under section 1902(a)(10)(A)(ii)(XXI) of 12 the federal Social Security Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. 1396a(a)(10)(A) 13 (ii)(XXI), as such act and section existed on January 1, 2019. 14

15 (6) For purposes of this section:

16 (a) Family planning services shall be consistent with 42 U.S.C. <u>1396a(a)(10)(G)(XVI) and includes coverage, without imposition of</u> 17 utilization controls, of: All United States Food and Drug Administration-18 approved family planning methods, including the drug or device, insertion 19 or provision, and removal; screening and treatment for preinvasive, 20 cervical, and breast cancers, including cancer prevention vaccinations; 21 22 interpersonal violence screening and prevention; and followup family 23 planning appointments and counseling; and

(b) Family planning services includes the following related 24 25 services: Medical diagnosis and treatment services that are provided in a family planning setting as part of or as a followup to a family planning 26 visit, including, but not limited to, treatment of medical conditions 27 28 routinely diagnosed during a family planning visit, such as treatment for a urinary tract infection or sexually transmitted infection; preventive 29 30 services routinely provided during a family planning visit, such as the 31 human papillomavirus vaccine; treatment of a major medical complication

4 <u>(7) No state funds shall be utilized to pay for elective abortion</u>
