1	A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to wind energy; to amend sections 66-901 and
2	66-902, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2016; to change and
3	provide legislative findings; to provide for a moratorium on
4	industrial development of wind energy projects as prescribed; to
5	provide for a special task force and a report to the Legislature; to
6	harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original sections.

7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 66-901, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 2 2016, is amended to read:
- 3 66-901 (1) The Legislature hereby finds and declares that:
- 4 <u>(a) The the use of solar energy and wind energy in Nebraska (i)</u>
- 5 can : (1) Can help reduce the nation's reliance upon irreplaceable
- 6 domestic and imported fossil fuels, (ii) $\frac{1}{1}$ can reduce air and water
- 7 pollution resulting from the use of conventional energy sources, (iii) \div
- 8 (3) requires effective legislation and efficient administration of state
- 9 and local programs to be of greatest value to its citizens, $\frac{1}{2}$ and $\frac{1}{2}$
- 10 is of such importance to the public health, safety, and welfare that the
- 11 state should take appropriate action to <u>both</u> encourage <u>and regulate</u> its
- 12 use; and -
- 13 (b) As the use of solar energy and wind energy devices increases,
- 14 the possibility of future shading and obstruction of such devices by
- 15 structures or vegetation, and the risk of potential harm to certain
- 16 natural prairie landscapes in the state, will also increase.
- 17 <u>(2) The Legislature further finds and declares that the</u>
- 18 approximately 19,300-square-mile sand dune formation located in north
- 19 central Nebraska known as the Sandhills comprises one of the largest
- 20 contiguous tracts of grassland remaining in the United States. The area
- 21 consists of approximately eleven million acres of grassland and one
- 22 million acres of wetlands. The Sandhills also recharges several extensive
- 23 aguifers of the Ogallala Aquifer formation which contain a storage
- 24 capacity of nearly one billion acre-feet of underground water. The
- 25 fragile, grass-stabilized sand dunes of this region provide habitat for
- 26 over seven hundred native plant species, three hundred species of birds,
- 27 fifty-five species of mammals, seventy-five specifies of fish, and
- 28 twenty-seven specifies of reptile and amphibians. Eighty percent of the
- 29 <u>world's population of sandhills cranes migrate through the Sandhills</u>
- 30 <u>every year.</u>
- 31 <u>(3)</u> The Legislature therefor declares that the purpose of sections

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- 1 66-901 to 66-914 and section 3 of this act is to promote the public
- 2 health, safety, and welfare by protecting access to solar energy and wind
- 3 energy <u>as well as protecting unique aspects of the state's natural beauty</u>
- 4 <u>and resources</u> as provided in sections 66-901 to 66-914.
- 5 Sec. 2. Section 66-902, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 6 2016, is amended to read:
- 7 66-902 For purposes of sections 66-901 to 66-914 and section 3 of
- 8 this act, unless the context otherwise requires, the definitions found in
- 9 sections 66-902.01 to 66-909.04 apply.
- Sec. 3. <u>Beginning January 1, 2018, there shall be a two-year</u>
- 11 moratorium on the industrial development of wind-generated energy
- 12 projects and placement of wind turbines for the generation of electricity
- 13 within the area known as the Sandhills as such area shall be defined and
- 14 designated by the Department of Natural Resources. The Director of
- 15 Natural Resources shall appoint a special task force composed of not more
- 16 than thirteen members to study and make recommendations relating to the
- 17 <u>siting of wind-generated energy projects in the Sandhills region of the</u>
- 18 state. The task force shall make its findings and recommendations in a
- 19 report to be submitted electronically to the Legislature not later than
- 20 <u>December 1, 2019. The Director of Natural Resources or his or her</u>
- 21 <u>designee shall serve as chairperson of the task force. The other members</u>
- 22 of the task force shall be selected so that the task force represents
- 23 diversified backgrounds and experiences to ensure adequate consideration
- 24 and analysis of all relevant issues and concerns.

- 26 Cumulative Supplement, 2016, are repealed.
