- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 24-201.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative
2 Supplement, 2020, is amended to read:

3 24-201.01 ~~On January 1, 2019, the salary of the Chief Justice and~~
4 ~~the judges of the Supreme Court shall be one hundred seventy-six thousand~~
5 ~~two hundred ninety-nine dollars and thirty-eight cents. On July 1, 2019,~~
6 ~~the salary of the Chief Justice and the judges of the Supreme Court shall~~
7 ~~be one hundred eighty-one thousand five hundred eighty-eight dollars and~~
8 ~~thirty-six cents. On July 1, 2020, the salary of the Chief Justice and~~
9 the judges of the Supreme Court shall be one hundred eighty-seven
10 thousand thirty-six dollars and one cent. On July 1, 2021, the salary of
11 the Chief Justice and the judges of the Supreme Court shall be XXX
12 dollars and XXX cents. On July 1, 2022, the salary of the Chief Justice
13 and the judges of the Supreme Court shall be XXX dollars and XXX cents.

14 The Chief Justice and the judges of the Supreme Court shall hold no
15 other public office of profit or trust during their terms of office nor
16 accept any public appointment or employment under the authority of the
17 government of the United States for which they receive compensation for
18 their services. Such salaries shall be payable in equal monthly
19 installments.

20 Sec. 2. This act becomes operative on July 1, 2021.

21 Sec. 3. Original section 24-201.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative
22 Supplement, 2020, is repealed.

23 Sec. 4. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
24 passed and approved according to law.
