1 Section 1. Section 28-101, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 3 28-101 Sections 28-101 to 28-1356 <u>and section 2 of this</u>
- 4 <u>act</u>shall be known and may be cited as the Nebraska Criminal Code.
- 5 Sec. 2. (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law,
- 6 any person who knowingly and without consent credibly impersonates
- 7 <u>another actual person through or on an Internet web site or by other</u>
- 8 electronic means for purposes of harming, intimidating, threatening,
- 9 or defrauding another person is guilty of a Class I misdemeanor.
- 10 <u>(2) For purposes of this section:</u>
- 11 (a) An impersonation is credible if another person would
- 12 reasonably believe, or did reasonably believe, that the defendant was
- or is the person who was impersonated; and
- 14 (b) Electronic means includes opening an email account or
- 15 an account or profile on a social networking Internet web site in
- 16 <u>another person's name</u>.
- 17 (3) In addition to any other civil remedy available, a
- 18 person who suffers damage or loss by reason of a violation of this
- 19 section may bring a civil action against the violator for
- 20 compensatory damages and injunctive relief or other equitable relief.
- 21 (4) This section shall not preclude prosecution under any
- 22 other law and shall be in addition to any other offense in which
- 23 <u>impersonation is an element of the offense.</u>
