LEGISLATIVE BILL 563

Introduced by Bolz, 29. Read first time January 22, 2019 Committee:

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to education; to amend section 85-1539,
2	Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and sections 85-1412 and
3	85-2104, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2018; to adopt the
4	Access College Early Tech Promise Program Act; to provide duties; to
5	harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original sections.
6	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1	Section 1. <u>Sections 1 to 8 of this act shall be known and may be</u>
2	cited as the Access College Early Tech Promise Program Act.
3	Sec. 2. For purposes of the Access College Early Tech Promise
4	<u>Program Act:</u>
5	<u>(1) Academic year means a twelve-month period of instruction as</u>
6	determined by the eligible institution;
7	<u>(2) Access college early scholarship means a scholarship granted</u>
8	pursuant to the Access College Early Scholarship Program Act;
9	(3) Award means a grant of money by the commission to an eligible
10	student to be used for educational expenses;
11	(4) Career program of study has the same meaning as in section
12	<u>85-2102;</u>
13	(5) Commission means the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary
14	Education;
15	<u>(6) Committee means the Nebraska Community College Student</u>
16	Performance and Occupational Education Grant Committee;
17	<u>(7) Educational expenses means tuition, fees, room, board, books,</u>
18	supplies, and other educational expenses as determined by the eligible
19	institution;
20	(8) Eligible institution means any Nebraska community college, any
21	tribally controlled community college in Nebraska, or the Nebraska
22	<u>College of Technical Agriculture at Curtis;</u>
23	(9) Eligible occupation means an in-demand occupation designated as
24	an eligible occupation pursuant to section 4 of this act;
25	(10) Eligible program means a program of study that:
26	(a) Is offered by an eligible institution;
27	(b) Is designed to be completed in two academic years or less;
28	(c) Offers a certificate, diploma, or associate degree that directly
29	qualifies the recipient for employment in an eligible occupation; and
30	(d) Is approved to be an eligible program pursuant to section 4 of

31 <u>this act;</u>

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1	<u>(11) Eligible student means a full-time student who:</u>
2	<u>(a) Is enrolled in an eligible program at an eligible institution;</u>
3	(b) Received postsecondary education credit while in high school for
4	<u>at least two courses in a single career program of study related to an</u>
5	<u>in-demand occupation;</u>
6	<u>(c)(i) Received an access college early scholarship while in high</u>
7	<u>school; or</u>
8	<u>(ii) Qualified to receive an access college early scholarship while</u>
9	in high school, but the scholarship was not granted due to insufficient
10	<u>funds;</u>
11	<u>(d) Has applied for federal financial aid through the Free</u>
12	Application for Federal Student Aid for the applicable academic year;
13	(e) Has not previously earned an associate degree; and
14	(f) For a student who is applying for an award for a second academic
15	year, has successfully completed the first academic year at an eligible
16	institution and maintained the minimum standards of performance as
17	required by such eligible institution;
18	<u>(12) Full-time student means a student who is enrolled in a minimum</u>
19	of twelve credit hours per semester or nine credit hours per quarter; and
20	<u>(13) In-demand occupation has the same meaning as in section</u>
21	<u>85-2002.</u>
22	Sec. 3. <u>The Access College Early Tech Promise Program is</u>
23	established. Except for duties assigned to the committee as provided in
24	section 4 of this act, the program shall be administered by the
25	<pre>commission.</pre>
26	Sec. 4. <u>(1) For each biennium, the committee shall establish</u>
27	criteria to determine what constitutes an in-demand occupation that is a
28	high priority for the state for purposes of the Access College Early Tech
29	Promise Program. After establishing such criteria, the committee shall
30	designate each in-demand occupation that meets the criteria as an
31	eligible occupation for such biennium.

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1	(2) Each program applicant shall complete an application form
2	developed and provided by the commission and shall submit the form for
3	the biennium for which eligibility is sought to the commission. The
4	application shall include, but not be limited to, the name of the
5	eligible institution, the program description and requirements, the
6	<u>certificate, diploma, or associate degree a student may earn from such</u>
7	program, the eligible occupation for which a graduate of the program
8	would be qualified, and any other information necessary to determine
9	eligibility. The commission shall transmit the applications to the
10	committee, and the committee shall review each application and either
11	approve or deny the application. If an application is approved, the
12	program of study shall be designated as an eligible program for the
13	<u>biennium.</u>
14	<u>(3) An eligible student who is granted an award for his or her first</u>
15	<u>academic year in an eligible program shall be eligible for an award to</u>
16	complete his or her second academic year of such program notwithstanding
17	<u>a decision of the committee to remove the eligible program designation</u>

18 for entering eligible students.

19 Sec. 5. (1) Each student applicant for the Access College Early Tech Promise Program shall complete an application form developed and 20 provided by the commission and shall submit the form for the academic 21 22 year for which an award is sought to the financial aid office or other 23 official designated by the eligible institution. Such application shall include, but not be limited to, the applicant's name, social security 24 number, and date of birth and any other information necessary to 25 determine eligibility. The financial aid office or other official 26 designated by an eligible institution shall make recommendations 27 28 regarding the eligibility of each applicant making application to such 29 eligible institution and shall forward each application and 30 recommendation to the commission for review.

31 (2) The commission shall review each application and verify or deny

the eligibility of each applicant under the Access College Early Tech Promise Program Act. The commission shall notify the applicant and the financial aid office or other official designated by an eligible institution of the verification or denial of eligibility and the award amount, if any, for such academic year in writing within thirty days following receipt of the application and recommendation from a financial aid office or other designated official of an eligible institution.

(3) An award for an academic year shall not exceed the sum of 8 9 tuition and fees plus one thousand five hundred dollars for educational 10 expenses minus any Federal Pell Grant granted to the eligible student for such academic year. No award for an academic year shall be less than one 11 thousand five hundred dollars. No eligible student shall be granted 12 13 awards for more than two academic years pursuant to this section. The commission shall forward such amount directly to the eligible institution 14 15 as payment of the tuition and mandatory fees remaining after any Federal Pell Grant for such eligible student and for distribution to such 16 17 eligible student for educational expenses. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the commission may distribute awards pro rata on a 18 19 term-by-term basis.

20 Sec. 6. <u>Within twenty days following notice of an adverse decision,</u> 21 <u>an affected student may submit a request in writing to the executive</u> 22 <u>director of the commission for a review of such adverse decision. The</u> 23 <u>commission shall conduct any such review pursuant to the Administrative</u> 24 <u>Procedure Act.</u>

Sec. 7. <u>The commission shall prepare an annual report on awards</u> granted pursuant to the Access College Early Tech Promise Program Act and shall submit the report electronically to the Clerk of the Legislature. The report shall include, but not be limited to, the number and amount of awards, successful completion by award recipients, and workforce outcomes aggregated by eligible institution and by eligible program. Each eligible institution shall cooperate with the commission and the Department of <u>Labor to report workforce outcomes one year, three years, and five years</u>
 <u>after award recipients complete their eligible programs.</u>

3 Sec. 8. <u>The commission may adopt and promulgate rules and</u>
4 <u>regulations to carry out the Access College Early Tech Promise Program</u>
5 <u>Act.</u>

Sec. 9. Section 85-1412, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
2018, is amended to read:

8 85-1412 The commission shall have the following additional powers9 and duties:

10 (1) Conduct surveys and studies as may be necessary to undertake the coordination function of the commission pursuant to section 85-1403 and 11 request information from governing boards and appropriate administrators 12 of public institutions and other governmental agencies for research 13 projects. All public institutions and governmental agencies receiving 14 state funds shall comply with reasonable requests for information under 15 this subdivision. Public institutions may comply with such requests 16 17 pursuant to section 85-1417;

18 (2) Recommend to the Legislature and the Governor legislation it 19 deems necessary or appropriate to improve postsecondary education in 20 Nebraska and any other legislation it deems appropriate to change the 21 role and mission provisions in sections 85-917 to 85-966.01. The 22 recommendations submitted to the Legislature shall be submitted 23 electronically;

(3) Establish any advisory committees as may be necessary to undertake the coordination function of the commission pursuant to section 85-1403 or to solicit input from affected parties such as students, faculty, governing boards, administrators of the public institutions, administrators of the private nonprofit institutions of postsecondary education and proprietary institutions in the state, and community and business leaders regarding the coordination function of the commission;

31 (4) Participate in or designate an employee or employees to

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participate in any committee which may be created to prepare a
 coordinated plan for the delivery of educational programs and services in
 Nebraska through the telecommunications system;

4 (5) Seek a close liaison with the State Board of Education and the 5 State Department of Education in recognition of the need for close 6 coordination of activities between elementary and secondary education and 7 postsecondary education;

(6) Administer the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System or 8 9 other information system or systems to provide the commission with timely, comprehensive, and meaningful information pertinent to the 10 exercise of its duties. The information system shall be designed to 11 provide comparable data on each public institution. The commission shall 12 13 also administer the uniform information system prescribed in sections 85-1421 to 85-1427 known as the Nebraska Educational Data System. Public 14 institutions shall supply the appropriate data for the information system 15 or systems required by the commission; 16

(7) Administer (a) the Access College Early Scholarship Program Act, 17 (b) the Community College Aid Act, (c) the Nebraska Community College 18 Student Performance and Occupational Education Grant Fund under the 19 direction of the Nebraska Community College Student Performance and 20 Occupational Education Grant Committee, (d) the Nebraska Opportunity 21 Grant Act, (e) the Postsecondary Institution Act, and (f) the community 22 college gap assistance program and the Community College Gap Assistance 23 24 Program Fund, and (g) the Access College Early Tech Promise Program Act;

(8) Accept and administer loans, grants, and programs from the federal or state government and from other sources, public and private, for carrying out any of its functions, including the administration of privately endowed scholarship programs. Such loans and grants shall not be expended for any other purposes than those for which the loans and grants were provided. The commission shall determine eligibility for such loans, grants, and programs, and such loans and grants shall not be

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1 expended unless approved by the Governor;

2 (9) On or before December 1 of each even-numbered year, submit to the Legislature and the Governor a report of its objectives 3 and 4 activities and any new private colleges in Nebraska and the 5 implementation of any recommendations of the commission for the preceding two calendar years. The report submitted to the Legislature shall be 6 7 submitted electronically;

8 (10) Provide staff support for interstate compacts on postsecondary9 education; and

10 (11) Request inclusion of the commission in any existing grant
 11 review process and information system.

12 Sec. 10. Section 85-1539, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is 13 amended to read:

85-1539 (1) There is hereby created the Nebraska Community College 14 Student Performance and Occupational Education Grant Committee. The 15 committee shall consist of (a) a representative of the Coordinating 16 17 Commission for Postsecondary Education who shall serve as chairperson of the committee, (b) a representative of the Department of Economic 18 19 Development, (c) a representative of the Department of Labor, (d) a representative of the State Department of Education, (e) a representative 20 affiliated with one of the two community college areas with the two 21 22 smallest full-time equivalent student enrollment totals for the most recent fiscal year, (f) a representative affiliated with one of the two 23 24 community college areas with the two largest full-time equivalent student 25 enrollment totals for the most recent fiscal year, and (g) a representative affiliated with one of the two community college areas not 26 included in the categories provided in subdivisions (1)(e) and (f) of 27 28 this section. Each member shall be appointed by the agency or community college areas being represented. The representatives appointed pursuant 29 to subdivisions (1)(e) through (g) of this section shall serve terms of 30 two years and shall be succeeded by a representative affiliated with the 31

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community college areas not represented for the preceding term.

2 (2) The committee shall develop quidelines for and annually determine the allocation of aid or grants to the community colleges for 3 (a) applied technology and occupational faculty training, instructional 4 5 upgrades, employee assessment, preemployment equipment training, employment training, and dislocated worker programs benefiting the State 6 7 of Nebraska or (b) programs or activities to enhance (i) student performance in the areas of degree, certificate, or diploma completion, 8 9 retention, or foundations education as defined in section 85-932.01 or (ii) the collection, reporting, analysis, and utilization of student 10 data. The total amount allocated for a fiscal year shall not exceed the 11 12 amounts appropriated from the Nebraska Community College Student Performance and Occupational Education Grant Fund and such other funds as 13 may be appropriated by the Legislature for purposes of this section for 14 such fiscal year. The commission shall certify the allocation determined 15 16 by the committee on or before September 10 of the fiscal year for which such allocation is being certified and shall report such allocation to 17 Department of Administrative Services. 18 the The commission shall 19 distribute the allocated funds to the selected community college board or boards in a single payment between the fifth and twentieth day of October 20 21 of each year.

(3) Applications for aid or grants pursuant to <u>subsection (2) of</u>
this section may be submitted by a community college area independently
or in collaboration with other community college areas.

(4) The committee shall review programs submitted pursuant to the
 Access College Early Tech Promise Program Act and approve or deny each
 program for eligibility on a biennial basis.

Sec. 11. Section 85-2104, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
2018, is amended to read:

30 85-2104 Applications for the Access College Early Scholarship
 31 Program shall be prioritized for students qualifying pursuant to

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subdivision (1) or (2) of this section, and applications for students 1 qualifying only pursuant to subdivision (3) of this section shall only be 2 3 considered if funds are available after fulfilling the applications for students qualifying pursuant to subdivision (1) or (2) of this section. 4 Priority dates shall be determined by the commission on a term basis. A 5 student who is applying to take one or more courses for credit from a 6 qualified postsecondary educational institution is eligible for the 7 Access College Early Scholarship Program if: 8

9 (1) Such student or the student's parent or legal guardian is 10 eligible to receive:

11 (a) Supplemental Security Income;

12 (b) Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program benefits;

(c) Free or reduced-price lunches under United States Department of
 Agriculture child nutrition programs;

15 (d) Aid to families with dependent children; or

(e) Assistance under the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program forWomen, Infants, and Children;

18 (2) The student or the student's parent or legal guardian has
19 experienced an extreme hardship; or

(3) Such student is requesting assistance pursuant to the program to cover the cost of tuition and fees for a course that is part of a career <u>program plan</u> of study, up to two hundred fifty dollars per term, and the student's family has an annual household income at or below two hundred percent of the federal poverty level.
