## **LEGISLATIVE BILL 585**

Introduced by Hughes, 24. Read first time January 17, 2023 Committee:

A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to schools; to amend section 79-2,146, Reissue
 Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section 79-2,144, Revised Statutes
 Cumulative Supplement, 2022; to change a duty of the state school
 security director; to require behavioral and mental health training
 for certain school personnel; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal
 the original sections.

7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 79-2,144, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
 2022, is amended to read:

3 79-2,144 The state school security director appointed pursuant to 4 section 79-2,143 shall be responsible for providing leadership and 5 support for safety and security for the public schools. Duties of the 6 director include, but are not limited to:

7 (1) Collecting safety and security plans, required pursuant to rules and regulations of the State Department of Education relating to 8 9 accreditation of schools, and other school security information from each 10 school system in Nebraska. School districts shall provide the state school security director with the safety and security plans of the school 11 district and any other security information requested by the director, 12 13 but any plans or information submitted by a school district may be withheld by the department pursuant to subdivision (9) of section 14 84-712.05; 15

16 (2) Recommending minimum standards for school security on or before
 17 January 1, 2016, to the State Board of Education;

(3) Conducting an assessment of the security of each public school
building, which assessment shall be completed by August 31, 2019;

(4) Identifying deficiencies in school security based on the minimum
standards adopted by the State Board of Education and making
recommendations to school boards for remedying such deficiencies;

(5) Establishing security awareness and preparedness tools and
 training programs for public school staff;

(6) Establishing research-based model instructional programs for
staff, students, and parents to address the underlying causes for violent
attacks on schools;

(7) Overseeing <u>behavioral and mental health training, with a focus</u>
 <u>on</u> suicide awareness and prevention <del>training</del> in public schools pursuant
 to section 79-2,146;

31 (8) Establishing tornado preparedness standards which shall include,

but not be limited to, ensuring that every school conducts at least two
 tornado drills per year;

3 (9) Responding to inquiries and requests for assistance relating to
4 school security from private, denominational, and parochial schools;

5 (10) Recommending curricular and extracurricular materials to assist 6 school districts in preventing and responding to cyberbullying and 7 digital citizenship issues; and

8 (11) Carrying out the department's responsibilities under the School
9 Safety and Security Reporting System Act.

Sec. 2. Section 79-2,146, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read:

79-2,146 (1) Beginning in school year <u>2023-24</u> <del>2015-16</del>, all public 12 13 school employees who interact with students nurses, teachers, counselors, school psychologists, administrators, school social workers, and any 14 other appropriate personnel, as determined by the school superintendent, 15 shall receive at least one hour of behavioral and mental health training 16 17 with a focus on suicide awareness and prevention training each year. Such training may include, but need not be limited to, topics such as 18 19 identification of early warning signs and symptoms of behavioral and mental health issues in students, appropriate and effective responses for 20 educators to student behavioral and mental health issues, trauma-informed 21 22 care, and procedures for making students and parents and guardians aware of services and supports for behavioral and mental health issues. This 23 24 training shall be provided within the framework of existing inservice 25 training programs offered by the State Department of Education or as part of required professional development activities. 26

(2) The department, in consultation with organizations including,
but not limited to, the Nebraska State Suicide Prevention Coalition, the
Nebraska chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, the
Behavioral Health Education Center of Nebraska, the National Alliance on
Mental Illness Nebraska, and other organizations and professionals with

1 expertise in behavioral and mental health and suicide prevention, shall develop a list of approved training materials to fulfill the requirements 2 of subsection (1) of this section. Such materials shall include training 3 on how to identify appropriate mental health services, both within the 4 school and also within the larger community, and when and how to refer 5 6 youth and their families to those services. Such materials may include 7 programs that can be completed through self-review of suitable behavioral 8 and mental health and suicide prevention materials.

9 (3) The department may adopt and promulgate rules and regulations to 10 carry out this section.
