1	A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to education; to amend sections 79-101 and								
2	79-8,143, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2022; to change								
3	provisions relating to the Alternative Certification for Quality								
4	Teachers Act; to authorize the Commissioner of Education to issue								
5	alternative certificates to teach as prescribed; to redefine a term;								
6	to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original sections.								
7	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,								

Section 1. Section 79-101, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
 2022, is amended to read:

3 79-101 For purposes of Chapter 79:

4 (1) School district means the territory under the jurisdiction of a
5 single school board authorized by Chapter 79;

6 (2) School means a school under the jurisdiction of a school board
7 authorized by Chapter 79;

8 (3) Legal voter means a registered voter as defined in section 9 32-115 who is domiciled in a precinct or ward in which he or she is 10 registered to vote and which precinct or ward lies in whole or in part 11 within the boundaries of a school district for which the registered voter 12 chooses to exercise his or her right to vote at a school district 13 election;

(4) Prekindergarten programs means all early childhood programs
 provided for children who have not reached the age of five by the date
 provided in section 79-214 for kindergarten entrance;

17 (5) Elementary grades means grades kindergarten through eight,18 inclusive;

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(6) High school grades means all grades above the eighth grade;

20 (7) School year means (a) for elementary grades other than
21 kindergarten, the time equivalent to at least one thousand thirty-two
22 instructional hours and (b) for high school grades, the time equivalent
23 to at least one thousand eighty instructional hours;

(8) Instructional hour means a period of time, at least sixty
minutes, which is actually used for the instruction of students;

(9) Teacher means any certified employee who is regularly employed
 for the instruction of pupils in the public schools;

(10) Administrator means any certified employee such as
superintendent, assistant superintendent, principal, assistant principal,
school nurse, or other supervisory or administrative personnel who do not
have as a primary duty the instruction of pupils in the public schools;

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(11) School board means the governing body of any school district.
 Board of education has the same meaning as school board;

3 (12) Teach means and includes, but is not limited to, the following 4 responsibilities: (a) The organization and management of the classroom or 5 the physical area in which the learning experiences of pupils take place; (b) the assessment and diagnosis of the individual educational needs of 6 the pupils; (c) the planning, selecting, organizing, prescribing, and 7 directing of the learning experiences of pupils; (d) the planning of 8 9 teaching strategies and the selection of available materials and equipment to be used; and (e) the evaluation and reporting of student 10 progress; 11

12 (13) Permanent school fund means the fund described in section 13 79-1035.01;

14 (14) Temporary school fund means the fund described in section 15 79-1035.02;

16 (15) School lands means the lands described in section 79-1035.03.
17 Educational lands has the same meaning as school lands;

(16) Community eligibility provision means the alternative to household applications for free and reduced-price meals in high-poverty schools enacted in section 104(a) of the federal Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010, section 11(a)(1) of the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act, 42 U.S.C. 1759a(a)(1), as such act and section existed on January 1, 2015, and administered by the United States Department of Agriculture; and

(17) Certificate, certificated, or certified, when referring to an individual holding a certificate to teach, administer, or provide special services, also includes an individual who holds a permit issued by the Commissioner of Education pursuant to sections 79-806 to 79-815<u>or an</u> alternative certificate to teach issued pursuant to section 3 of this act.

8	Sec. 3. (1) In addition to certificates issued pursuant to section									
9	79-806 to 79-815, the Commissioner of Education shall, subject to the									
10	provisions of subsections (2) and (3) of this section, issue an									
11	alternative certificate to teach on a full-time basis to any applicant									
12	<u>who:</u>									
13	(a) Possess a bachelor's degree; and									
14	(b) Has successfully completed an alternative teacher certification									
15	program operated by an organization that satisfies the following									
16	<u>criteria:</u>									
17	(i) The organization operates in at least five states;									
18	<u>(ii) The organization has operated an alternative teacher</u>									
19	certification program for at least ten years; and									
20	<u>(iii) The program requires candidates to pass a subject area exam</u>									
21	and the pedagogy exam known as the professional teaching knowledge exam									
22	to receive a certificate under such program.									
23	<u>(2) A certificate issued under this section only authorizes an</u>									
24	individual to teach the subject and educational levels for which the									
25	individual has successfully completed an alternative teacher									
26	certification program.									
27	(3) Issuance of an alternative certificate to teach pursuant to this									
28	section shall be subject to a criminal history record information check									
29	pursuant to section 79-814.01 and payment of any required fees.									
30	(4) An individual who receives an alternative certificate to teach									
31	pursuant to this section shall be subject to the same certification
