## **LEGISLATIVE BILL 646**

## Committee:

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to extreme weather preparedness; to require
- 2 development of a strategic action plan; to state findings; to
- 3 provide for a task force and require submission of a plan.
- 4 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. The Legislature finds that:
- 2 (1) Pests, drought, floods, high winds, and other extreme weather
- 3 present serious, diverse, and ongoing issues for Nebraska. Many sectors
- 4 and resources are impacted by such extreme weather, including
- 5 agriculture, water, health care, energy generation and usage, ecosystems,
- 6 forestry, rural and urban communities, transportation, and commerce and
- 7 industry. Nebraska's life-giving water and soil resources continue to be
- 8 <u>subject to new stressors and risks;</u>
- 9 (2) Opportunities exist for the people of Nebraska to respond
- 10 appropriately to these risks, including economic opportunities through
- 11 <u>development of renewable energy from our abundant wind and solar</u>
- 12 <u>resources, reduction of pollutants through efforts to reduce the use of</u>
- 13 <u>fossil fuels, and development of new technologies, new agricultural crops</u>
- 14 and harvesting methods, and new products that match Nebraska's vibrant
- 15 and changing needs and resources;
- 16 (3) The report Understanding and Assessing Climate Change:
- 17 <u>Implications for Nebraska, University of Nebraska-Lincoln, 2014, provides</u>
- 18 <u>a fundamental basis for understanding the impacts of extreme weather</u>
- 19 <u>events or climate change for our state;</u>
- 20 <u>(4) The 2015 Nebraska Rural Poll found that sixty-one percent of</u>
- 21 rural Nebraskans agree or strongly agree that the state should develop a
- 22 plan to address the impacts of extreme weather events or climate change;
- 23 (5) Appropriate planning is needed to develop strategies to mitigate
- 24 and adapt to the impacts of extreme weather events or climate change on
- 25 the health and well-being of Nebraskans;
- 26 (6) The state must invest in research and data gathering, planning,
- 27 <u>education</u>, <u>and coordination of efforts related to mitigation of and</u>
- 28 <u>adaptation to the impacts of extreme weather events or climate change;</u>
- 29 and
- 30 (7) An effective plan to meet the challenges of extreme weather
- 31 events or climate change will enable the state and its communities to

- 1 take advantage of opportunities resulting from adaptation and mitigation
- 2 strategies, including attracting new businesses and investment to
- 3 Nebraska, as well as reducing the potential negative impacts of extreme
- 4 <u>weather events or climate change.</u>
- 5 Sec. 2. <u>The Legislature shall provide for the creation of an</u>
- 6 evidence-based, data-driven strategic action plan for the State of
- 7 Nebraska related to the pests, drought, floods, high winds, impacts of
- 8 <u>extreme weather events or climate change on Nebraskans that includes:</u>
- 9 <u>(1) A baseline measurement of greenhouse gas emissions, also known</u>
- 10 as a carbon footprint, for the State of Nebraska;
- 11 (2) Measurable benchmarks and goals, including actions needed to
- meet the goals and benchmarks;
- 13 (3) Assessment of risks and vulnerabilities from negative impacts of
- 14 extreme weather events or climate change;
- 15 (4) Opportunities presented by strategies for mitigation of and
- 16 adaptation to extreme weather events or climate change;
- 17 (5) Opportunities to improve and increase resilience to the impacts
- 18 of extreme weather events or climate change;
- 19 (6) Potential economic impacts of extreme weather events or climate
- 20 change, both positive and negative;
- 21 (7) Examination of impacts of extreme weather events or climate
- 22 change upon the following sectors:
- 23 (a) Agriculture;
- (b) Water resources;
- 25 (c) Health care and public health;
- 26 (d) Energy generation and use;
- 27 (e) Ecosystems and forestry;
- 28 (f) Rural and urban communities;
- 29 (g) Transportation; and
- 30 (h) Commerce and industry; and
- 31 (8) Recommendations for new policies and changes to policies and

1 programs that support the goals based on the information and data

- 2 collected and generated, including funding needs and recommendations for
- 3 <u>legislation</u>.
- 4 Sec. 3. The Pests, Drought, Flood, and Extreme Weather Mitigation
- 5 and Preparedness Plan Task Force is created. The task force shall consist
- 6 of the chairperson of the Natural Resources Committee of the Legislature,
- 7 the chairperson of the Appropriations Committee of the Legislature, and
- 8 five additional members of the Legislature appointed by the Executive
- 9 Board of the Legislative Council. The task force shall develop the
- 10 <u>strategic action plan described in section 2 of this act. The process for</u>
- 11 <u>developing the plan shall include:</u>
- 12 (1) Extensive opportunities for public comment and engagement,
- 13 including, but not limited to, online input, public hearings, and public
- 14 and private sector engagement;
- 15 (2) Input from postsecondary educational institutions in Nebraska,
- 16 including, but not limited to, input from entomological climate, water,
- 17 and agricultural experts at the University of Nebraska;
- 18 (3) Examination of extreme weather preparedness or climate plans
- 19 <u>from other states; and</u>
- 20 (4) Such other and additional activities as may be necessary.
- Sec. 4. On or before December 15, 2017, the Pests, Drought, Flood,
- 22 and Extreme Weather Mitigation and Preparedness Task Force shall submit
- 23 the strategic action plan described in section 2 of this act to the
- 24 Governor and electronically to the Executive Board of the Legislative
- 25 Council.
