LEGISLATIVE BILL 648

Committee:

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to technology; to create and provide duties
- for the New Machine Age Task Force.
- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. (1) The New Machine Age Task Force is created. The
- 2 executive committee of the task force shall consist of the following
- 3 voting members: (a) The chairperson of the Business and Labor Committee
- 4 of the Legislature or his or her designee; (b) the chairperson of the
- 5 Education Committee of the Legislature or his or her designee; (c) the
- 6 chairperson of the Appropriations Committee of the Legislature or his or
- 7 her designee; and (d) three at-large members appointed by the Executive
- 8 Board of the Legislative Council. The voting members of the executive
- 9 <u>committee shall choose a chairperson and vice-chairperson from among the</u>
- 10 voting members.
- 11 (2) The following persons shall serve as ex officio members of the
- 12 <u>executive committee of the task force: The Director of Economic</u>
- 13 <u>Development or his or her designee, the Commissioner of Labor or his or</u>
- 14 her designee, the Commissioner of Education or his or her designee, the
- 15 Chancellor of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln or his or her designee,
- 16 the Chancellor of the University of Nebraska Medical Center or his or her
- 17 designee, the Chancellor of the Nebraska State College System or his or
- 18 <u>her designee</u>, and the executive director of the Nebraska Community
- 19 <u>College Association or his or her designee.</u>
- 20 (3) The remaining members of the task force shall consist of at
- 21 least five nonvoting members appointed by the executive committee of the
- 22 task force through an application and selection process, representing (a)
- 23 <u>business leaders and representatives from startup businesses (b) academic</u>
- 24 experts in education and economic development issues, (c) workforce
- 25 development agencies, and (d) labor leaders. The members appointed
- 26 <u>pursuant to this subsection shall constitute the advisory committee to</u>
- 27 the task force.
- Sec. 2. The Legislature finds that, as noted by Erik Brynjolfsson
- 29 and Andrew McAfee in their bestselling book "The Second Machine Age"
- 30 written in 2014, "Technological progress is going to leave behind some
- 31 people, perhaps even a lot of people, as it races ahead. As we'll

- 1 demonstrate...there's never been a better time to be a worker with
- 2 special skills or the right education, because these people can use
- 3 technology to create and capture values. However, there's never been a
- 4 worse time to be a worker with only ordinary skills and abilities to
- 5 offer, because computers, robots, and other digital technologies are
- 6 acquiring these skills and abilities at an extraordinary rate."
- 7 Sec. 3. The New Machine Age Task Force created under section 1 of
- 8 this act shall examine the interaction between Nebraska policies,
- 9 programs, and initiatives, particularly in the areas of economic
- 10 <u>development</u>, <u>business</u>, <u>labor</u>, <u>and education</u>, <u>and changing technologies</u>,
- 11 <u>automation</u>, and replacement of human capital. The task force shall:
- 12 <u>(1) Collect, examine, and analyze data and projections on automation</u>
- 13 and technology, collect and analyze data and projections on labor market
- 14 trends, and collect data and analyze kindergarten through grade twelve
- and postsecondary education performance;
- 16 (2) Obtain input from academic experts, including the University of
- 17 Nebraska;
- 18 (3) Encourage and obtain input from nonprofit organizations;
- 19 (4) Study, evaluate, and report on the status and effectiveness of
- 20 policies, procedures, and programs implemented by other states in
- 21 planning for evolving technological changes;
- 22 <u>(5) Identify policies, procedures, and programs, including any lack</u>
- 23 of interagency data sharing, lack of policy coordination, or state or
- 24 local requirements and recommend changes to those policies and
- 25 procedures; and
- 26 <u>(6) Create a long-range strategic plan containing measurable goals</u>
- 27 <u>and benchmarks to plan for Nebraska's future as that future relates to</u>
- 28 the balance of technological advancement versus human capital and
- 29 <u>resources</u>.
- 30 Sec. 4. <u>To accomplish its duties, the New Machine Age Task Force</u>
- 31 created pursuant to section 1 of this act may request and receive from

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- 1 any state or local governmental entity or institution information 2 relating to economic development, labor market trends, and educational 3 performance and appoint special committees to advise and assist the task 4 force. Members of any such special committee shall be appointed by the 5 chairperson of the task force and may be members of the task force or 6 individuals from the private sector or public sector. Any such special 7 committee shall report to the task force on the progress of the special 8 committee. Members of a special committee appointed under this section 9 may not receive reimbursement or payment for work done as members of the 10 special committee. 11 On or before December 15, 2017, the New Machine Age Task Sec. 5. Force created pursuant to section 1 of this act shall submit a 12 13 preliminary report and on or before December 14, 2018, the task force 14 shall submit a final report to the Governor and electronically to the Executive Board of the Legislative Council. The preliminary report and 15 16 the final report shall: (1) Include the long-range strategic plan 17 required in section 3 of this act; (2) describe how the task force fulfilled its statutory purposes and duties during the time period 18 19 covered by the report; (3) describe policies, procedures, and programs
