- 1 FOR AN ACT relating to natural resources districts; to amend section 2 2-3226.11, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2010; 3 to change provisions relating to flood protection and water quality enhancement bonds; and to repeal the 4 5 original section. Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 2-3226.11, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2010, is amended to read:
- 3 2-3226.11 (1) The proceeds of bonds issued pursuant to
- 4 section 2-3226.10 shall be used to pay costs of design, rights-of-way
- 5 acquisition, and construction of multipurpose flood protection and
- 6 water quality projects and practices for storm water management
- 7 within the natural resources district issuing such bonds. , including
- 8 flood control and water quality. For purposes of this section, flood
- 9 control protection and water quality projects and practices include,
- 10 but are not limited to, low-impact development best management
- 11 measures, flood plain buyout, dams, reservoir basins, and levees. The
- 12 proceeds of bonds issued pursuant to section 2-3226.10 shall not be
- 13 used to fund combined sewer separation projects in a city of the
- 14 metropolitan class or to fund recreational facilities. No project for
- 15 which bonds are issued under section 2-3226.10 shall include a
- 16 reservoir or water quality basin having a permanent pool greater than
- 17 four hundred surface acres. Any project having a permanent pool
- 18 greater than twenty surface acres shall provide for public access.
- 19 (2) A district shall only convey real property that is
- 20 acquired for a project described in subsection (1) of this section by
- 21 eminent domain proceedings pursuant to sections 76-704 to 76-724 to a
- 22 political subdivision or an agency of state or federal government.
- 23 (3)(a) Prior to the issuing of bonds pursuant to section
- 24 2-3226.10 or expending funds of a natural resources district
- 25 encompassing a city of the metropolitan class to pay costs of a

1 reservoir or water quality basin project or projects greater than

- 2 twenty surface acres, a county board of the affected county may pass
- 3 a resolution stating that it does not approve of the construction of
- 4 such reservoir or water quality basin project or projects within its
- 5 exclusive zoning jurisdiction. The county board shall hold a public
- 6 hearing and shall vote on the resolution within ninety days after
- 7 notice from the board of directors of the natural resources district
- 8 of its intent to issue bonds.
- 9 (b) No proceeds from bonds issued pursuant to section
- 10 2-3226.10 or funds of a natural resources district encompassing a
- 11 city of the metropolitan class may be used to pay costs of a
- 12 reservoir or water quality basin project or projects greater than
- 13 twenty surface acres if the county board of the affected county
- 14 passes such a resolution.
- 15 (c) Sections 2-3226.10 to 2-3226.14 do not (i) limit the
- 16 authority of a natural resources district with regard to reservoirs,
- 17 water quality basin projects, or other projects of less than twenty
- 18 surface acres or (ii) prohibit use of funds of a natural resources
- 19 district for preliminary studies or reports necessary, in the
- 20 discretion of the board of directors of the natural resources
- 21 district, to determine whether a reservoir or water quality basin
- 22 project should be presented to a county board pursuant to this
- 23 section.
- 24 (4) Proceeds of bonds issued pursuant to section
- 25 2-3226.10 shall not be used to fund any project in any city or county

1 (a) located within a watershed in which is located a city of the

- 2 metropolitan class and (b) which is party to an agreement under the
- 3 Interlocal Cooperation Act, unless such city or county has adopted a
- 4 storm water management plan approved by the board of directors of the
- 5 natural resources district encompassing a city of the metropolitan
- 6 class.
- 7 (5) A natural resources district encompassing a city of
- 8 the metropolitan class shall only issue bonds for projects in cities
- 9 and counties that have adopted zoning regulations or ordinances that
- 10 comply with state and federal flood plain management rules and
- 11 regulations.
