# **LEGISLATIVE BILL 688**

## Committee:

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to children; to amend sections 71-3101, 2 71-3105, 71-3107, and 71-6720, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, 3 and section 71-1908, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2016; 4 to provide for the possession, use, and application of sunscreen by 5 and for children and students as prescribed; to provide immunity 6 from liability as prescribed; to provide an exception to the 7 Medication Aide Act; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the 8 original sections.
- 9 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. (1) Any child attending a recreation facility, center,
- 2 or program operated by a political or governmental subdivision pursuant
- 3 to authority provided in section 13-304 may possess and use a broad
- 4 spectrum topical sunscreen while attending such facility, center, or
- 5 program or an event sponsored by such entity without a note or
- 6 prescription from a licensed health care professional if the broad
- 7 spectrum topical sunscreen is in the original container, the container is
- 8 <u>labeled as a broad spectrum sunscreen by the manufacturer, an expiration</u>
- 9 date was printed on or otherwise affixed to such container by the
- 10 <u>manufacturer</u>, and the expiration date has not passed at the time of such
- 11 possession or use.
- 12 <u>(2) A recreation facility, center, or program operated by a</u>
- 13 political or governmental subdivision pursuant to authority provided in
- 14 section 13-304 may allow an employee or volunteer to assist in the
- 15 application of a broad spectrum topical sunscreen in the possession of a
- 16 child pursuant to subsection (1) of this section with the written consent
- 17 of such child's parent or guardian.
- 18 (3) Except in cases of gross negligence, willful misconduct, or
- 19 intentional wrongdoing, a recreation facility, center, or program
- 20 operated by a political or governmental subdivision pursuant to authority
- 21 provided in section 13-304 and any employee or volunteer of such
- 22 facility, center, or program shall be immune from civil liability with
- 23 respect to any decision made or action taken that is based on a good
- 24 <u>faith implementation of this section.</u>
- 25 Sec. 2. Section 71-1908, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 26 2016, is amended to read:
- 27 71-1908 (1) Sections 71-1908 to 71-1923 <u>and section 3 of this act</u>
- 28 shall be known and may be cited as the Child Care Licensing Act.
- 29 (2) The Legislature finds that there is a present and growing need
- 30 for quality child care programs and facilities. There is a need to
- 31 establish and maintain licensure of persons providing such programs to

- 1 ensure that such persons are competent and are using safe and adequate
- 2 facilities. The Legislature further finds and declares that the
- 3 development and supervision of programs are a matter of statewide concern
- 4 and should be dealt with uniformly on the state and local levels. There
- 5 is a need for cooperation among the various state and local agencies
- 6 which impose standards on licensees, and there should be one agency which
- 7 coordinates the enforcement of such standards and informs the Legislature
- 8 about cooperation among the various agencies.
- 9 Sec. 3. (1) Any child enrolled in or attending a program may
- 10 possess and use a broad spectrum topical sunscreen while on property used
- 11 by the program or at a program-sponsored event without a note or
- 12 <u>prescription from a licensed health care professional if the broad</u>
- 13 <u>spectrum topical sunscreen is in the original container, the container is</u>
- 14 labeled as a broad spectrum sunscreen by the manufacturer, an expiration
- 15 <u>date was printed on or otherwise affixed to such container by the</u>
- 16 <u>manufacturer</u>, and the expiration date has not passed at the time of such
- 17 possession or use.
- 18 (2) A program may allow an employee or volunteer to assist in the
- 19 application of a broad spectrum topical sunscreen in the possession of a
- 20 child pursuant to subsection (1) of this section with the written consent
- 21 of such child's parent or guardian.
- 22 (3) Except in cases of gross negligence, willful misconduct, or
- 23 <u>intentional wrongdoing, a program and any employee or volunteer of such</u>
- 24 program shall be immune from civil liability with respect to any decision
- 25 made or action taken that is based on a good faith implementation of this
- 26 section.

- 1 tents, buildings, structures, or site pads, together with the tract of
- 2 land appertaining thereto, established or maintained for more than a
- 3 forty-eight-hour period as living quarters or sites used for purposes of
- 4 sleeping or the preparation and the serving of food extending beyond the
- 5 limits of a family group for children or adults, or both, for recreation,
- 6 education, or vacation purposes, and including facilities located on
- 7 either privately or publicly owned lands except hotels or inns;
- 8 (2) Person shall mean any individual or group of individuals,
- 9 association, partnership, limited liability company, or corporation; and
- 10 (3) Department shall mean the Department of Health and Human
- 11 Services.
- 12 Sec. 5. (1) Any child attending a recreation camp may possess and
- 13 use a broad spectrum topical sunscreen while at such recreation camp or
- 14 <u>an event sponsored by such recreation camp without a note or prescription</u>
- 15 from a licensed health care professional if the broad spectrum topical
- 16 <u>sunscreen is in the original container, the container is labeled as a</u>
- 17 <u>broad spectrum sunscreen by the manufacturer, an expiration date was</u>
- 18 printed on or otherwise affixed to such container by the manufacturer,
- 19 and the expiration date has not passed at the time of such possession or
- 20 <u>use.</u>
- 21 (2) A recreation camp may allow an employee or volunteer to assist
- 22 <u>in the application of a broad spectrum topical sunscreen in the</u>
- 23 possession of a child pursuant to subsection (1) of this section with the
- 24 written consent of such child's parent or guardian.
- 25 (3) Except in cases of gross negligence, willful misconduct, or
- 26 <u>intentional wrongdoing</u>, a recreation camp and any employee or volunteer
- 27 of such recreation camp shall be immune from civil liability with respect
- 28 to any decision made or action taken that is based on a good faith
- 29 <u>implementation of this section.</u>
- 30 Sec. 6. Section 71-3105, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 31 amended to read:

- 1 71-3105 The department is authorized to and shall formulate, adopt,
- 2 publish, promulgate, and enforce such reasonable rules and regulations as
- 3 it deems necessary to enforce the provisions of sections 71-3101 to
- 4 71-3107 and section 5 of this act and to protect the health and welfare
- 5 of persons in attendance at recreation camps.

- 13 age children during the summer and other extended breaks in the school
- 14 year may possess and use a broad spectrum topical sunscreen while
- 15 attending such program or an event sponsored by such program without a
- 16 note or prescription from a licensed health care professional if the
- 17 broad spectrum topical sunscreen is in the original container, the
- 18 <u>container is labeled as a broad spectrum sunscreen by the manufacturer,</u>
- 19 an expiration date was printed on or otherwise affixed to such container
- 20 by the manufacturer, and the expiration date has not passed at the time
- 21 <u>of such possession or use.</u>
- 22 (2) A program provided only to school-age children during the summer
- 23 and other extended breaks in the school year may allow an employee or
- 24 volunteer to assist in the application of a broad spectrum topical
- 25 sunscreen in the possession of a student pursuant to subsection (1) of
- 26 this section with the written consent of such child's parent or guardian.
- 27 <u>(3) Except in cases of gross negligence, willful misconduct, or</u>
- 28 <u>intentional wrongdoing, a program provided only to school-age children</u>
- 29 <u>during the summer and other extended breaks in the school year and any</u>
- 30 employee or volunteer of such program shall be immune from civil
- 31 liability with respect to any decision made or action taken that is based

- 1 on a good faith implementation of this section.
- 2 Sec. 9. Section 71-6720, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 3 amended to read:
- 4 71-6720 (1) The purposes of the Medication Aide Act are to ensure
- 5 the health, safety, and welfare of the public by providing for the
- 6 accurate, cost-effective, efficient, and safe utilization of medication
- 7 aides to assist in the administration of medications by (a) competent
- 8 individuals, (b) caretakers who are parents, foster parents, family,
- 9 friends or legal guardians, and (c) licensed health care professionals.
- 10 (2) The act applies to all settings in which medications are
- 11 administered except the home, unless the in-home administration of
- 12 medication is provided through a licensed home health agency or licensed
- 13 or certified home and community-based provider.
- 14 (3) The act does not apply to the provision of reminders to persons
- 15 to self-administer medication, assistance to students and children in the
- 16 application of broad spectrum topical sunscreen pursuant to sections 1,
- 17 <u>3, 5, 8, and 10 of this act,</u> or assistance to persons in the delivery of
- 18 nontherapeutic topical applications by in-home personal services workers.
- 19 For purposes of this subsection, in-home personal services worker has the
- 20 definition found in section 71-6501.
- 21 Sec. 10. (1) Any student enrolled in a public, private,
- 22 denominational, or parochial school may possess and use a broad spectrum
- 23 <u>topical sunscreen while on school property or at a school-sponsored event</u>
- 24 sponsored by such entity without a note or prescription from a licensed
- 25 health care professional if the broad spectrum topical sunscreen is in
- 26 <u>the original container, the container is labeled as a broad spectrum</u>
- 27 <u>sunscreen by the manufacturer, an expiration date was printed on or</u>
- 28 <u>otherwise affixed to such container by the manufacturer, and the</u>
- 29 expiration date has not passed at the time of such possession or use.
- 30 (2) A public, private, denominational, or parochial school may allow
- 31 an employee or volunteer to assist in the application of a broad spectrum

- 1 <u>topical sunscreen in the possession of a student pursuant to subsection</u>
- 2 (1) of this section with the written consent of such child's parent or
- 3 guardian.
- 4 (3) Except in cases of gross negligence, willful misconduct, or
- 5 <u>intentional wrongdoing</u>, a public, private, denominational, or parochial
- 6 school and any employee or volunteer of such school shall be immune from
- 7 civil liability with respect to any decision made or action taken that is
- 8 <u>based on a good faith implementation of this section.</u>
- 9 Sec. 11. Original sections 71-3101, 71-3105, 71-3107, and 71-6720,
- 10 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section 71-1908, Revised
- 11 Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2016, are repealed.
