7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 60-3,122.03, Revised Statutes Cumulative
 Supplement, 2014, is amended to read:

3 60-3,122.03 (1) The department shall design license plates to be known as Military Honor Plates. The department shall create designs 4 5 honoring persons who have served or are serving in the United States Army, <u>United States Army Reserve</u>, United States Navy, <u>United States Navy</u> 6 Reserve, United States Marine Corps, United States Marine Corps Reserve, 7 United States Coast Guard, United States Coast Guard Reserve, United 8 9 States Air Force, United States Air Force Reserve, or National Guard. There shall be eleven six designs, one for each of such armed forces 10 reflecting its official emblem, official seal, or other official image. 11 The issuance of plates for each of such armed forces shall be conditioned 12 13 on the approval of the armed forces owning the copyright to the official 14 emblem, official seal, or other official image. A person may qualify for a Military Honor Plate by registering with the Department of Veterans' 15 16 Affairs pursuant to section 80-414. The Department of Motor Vehicles 17 shall verify the applicant's eligibility for a plate created pursuant to this section by consulting the registry established by the Department of 18 Veterans' Affairs. 19

20 (2) The design shall be selected on the basis of limiting the 21 manufacturing cost of each plate to an amount less than or equal to the 22 amount charged for license plates pursuant to section 60-3,102. The 23 Department of Motor Vehicles shall make applications available for each 24 type of plate when it is designed. The department may adopt and 25 promulgate rules and regulations to carry out this section and section 26 60-3,122.04.

(3) One type of Military Honor Plates shall be alphanumeric plates.The department shall:

29 (a) Assign a designation up to five characters; and

30 (b) Not use a county designation.

31 (4) One type of Military Honor Plates shall be personalized message

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plates. Such plates shall be issued subject to the same conditions
 specified for personalized message license plates in section 60-3,118,
 except that a maximum of five characters may be used.

Sec. 2. Section 60-3,122.04, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
2014, is amended to read:

60-3,122.04 (1) An Beginning January 2, 2016, an eligible person may 6 7 apply to the department for Military Honor Plates in lieu of regular license plates on an application prescribed and provided by the 8 9 department for any motor vehicle, trailer, semitrailer, or cabin trailer, except for a motor vehicle or trailer registered under section 60-3,198. 10 An applicant receiving a Military Honor Plate for a farm truck with a 11 gross weight of over sixteen tons shall affix the appropriate tonnage 12 13 decal to the plate. The department shall make forms available for such applications through the county treasurers. The license plates shall be 14 issued upon payment of the license fee described in subsection (2) of 15 16 this section and verification by the department of an applicant's 17 eligibility using the registry established by the Department of Veterans' Affairs pursuant to section 80-414. To be eligible an applicant shall be 18 19 (a) active duty or reserve duty armed forces personnel serving in any of the armed forces listed in subsection (1) of section 60-3,122.03 or (b) a 20 veteran of any of such armed forces who was discharged or otherwise 21 22 separated with a characterization of honorable or general (under honorable conditions). Any person using Military Honor Plates shall 23 24 surrender the plates to the county treasurer if such person is no longer 25 eligible for the plates. Regular plates shall be issued to any such person upon surrender of the Military Honor Plates for a three-dollar 26 transfer fee and forfeiture of any of the remaining annual fee. The 27 three-dollar transfer fee shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for 28 credit to the Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund. 29

30 (2)(a) In addition to all other fees required for registration under
 31 the Motor Vehicle Registration Act, each application for initial issuance

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or renewal of alphanumeric Military Honor Plates shall be accompanied by
a fee of five dollars. County treasurers collecting fees pursuant to this
subdivision shall remit them to the State Treasurer. The State Treasurer
shall credit five dollars of the fee to the Nebraska Veteran Cemetery
System Operation Fund.

(b) In addition to all other fees required for registration under 6 the Motor Vehicle Registration Act, each application for initial issuance 7 or renewal of personalized message Military Honor Plates shall be 8 9 accompanied by a fee of forty dollars. County treasurers collecting fees pursuant to this subdivision shall remit them to the State Treasurer. The 10 State Treasurer shall credit twenty-five percent of the fee for initial 11 issuance and renewal of such plates to the Department of Motor Vehicles 12 Cash Fund and seventy-five percent of the fee to the Nebraska Veteran 13 Cemetery System Operation Fund. 14

(3) When the Department of Motor Vehicles receives an application 15 16 for Military Honor Plates, the department shall deliver the plates to the county treasurer of the county in which the motor vehicle or cabin 17 trailer is registered. The county treasurer shall issue Military Honor 18 Plates in lieu of regular license plates when the applicant complies with 19 the other provisions of the Motor Vehicle Registration Act for 20 registration of the motor vehicle or cabin trailer. If Military Honor 21 Plates are lost, stolen, or mutilated, the licensee shall be issued 22 replacement license plates upon request pursuant to section 60-3,157. 23

24 (4) The owner of a motor vehicle or cabin trailer bearing Military 25 Honor Plates may apply to the county treasurer to have such plates transferred to a motor vehicle other than the vehicle for which such 26 plates were originally purchased if such vehicle is owned by the owner of 27 the plates. The owner may have the unused portion of the fee for the 28 plates credited to the other vehicle which will bear the plates at the 29 rate of eight and one-third percent per month for each full month left in 30 31 the registration period. Application for such transfer shall be

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accompanied by a fee of three dollars. Fees collected pursuant to this
 subsection shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to the
 Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund.

4 (5) If the cost of manufacturing Military Honor Plates at any time exceeds the amount charged for license plates pursuant to section 5 60-3,102, any money to be credited to the Nebraska Veteran Cemetery 6 7 System Operation Fund shall instead be credited first to the Highway Trust Fund in an amount equal to the difference between the manufacturing 8 9 costs of Military Honor Plates and the amount charged pursuant to section 10 60-3,102 with respect to such plates and the remainder shall be credited to the Nebraska Veteran Cemetery System Operation Fund. 11

12 (6) If the director discovers evidence of fraud in an application 13 for Military Honor Plates or that the holder is no longer eligible to 14 have Military Honor Plates, the director may summarily cancel the plates 15 and registration and send notice of the cancellation to the holder of the 16 license plates.

17 Sec. 3. Section 80-414, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is 18 amended to read:

19 80-414 (1) The Department of Veterans' Affairs shall create and maintain a registry of residents of Nebraska who meet the requirements of 20 subdivision (1)(a) or (b) of section 60-3,122.04 or subsection (1) of 21 22 section 60-4,189. The Department of Veterans' Affairs may adopt and promulgate rules and regulations governing the establishment 23 and 24 maintenance of the registry. The registry may be used to assist the department in carrying out the duties of the department and shall provide 25 for the collection of sufficient information to identify an individual 26 who qualifies for Military Honor Plates or a notation of "veteran" on his 27 or her operator's license or state identification card issued by the 28 Department of Motor Vehicles. The registry may include information such 29 as identifying information on an individual, an individual's records on 30 active duty or reserve duty in the armed forces of the United States, or 31

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an individual's status of active duty, <u>reserve duty</u>, retired, discharged,
 or other.

3 (2) Any resident of Nebraska who meets the requirements of subdivision (1)(a) or (b) of section 60-3,122.04 or subsection (1) of 4 5 section 60-4,189 shall register with the Department of Veterans' Affairs using the registry created by this section before being eligible for 6 7 Military Honor Plates or a notation of "veteran" on his or her operator's license or state identification card issued by the Department of Motor 8 9 Vehicles. No person shall be deemed eligible until his or her status has 10 been verified on the registry.

(3) The Department of Motor Vehicles may adopt and promulgate rules and regulations governing use of the registry of the Department of Veterans' Affairs for determination of eligibility for the issuance of Military Honor Plates or the notation of "veteran" on operators' licenses and state identification cards.
