- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to firearms; to amend sections 28-1203,
- 2 28-1351, and 28-1354, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and
- 3 section 28-1201, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2017; to define terms;
- 4 to prohibit the manufacture, import, transfer, and possession of
- 5 multiburst trigger activators and firearm silencers; to provide a
- 6 penalty; to eliminate an obsolete provision; to harmonize
- 7 provisions; and to repeal the original sections.
- 8 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 5 (1) Firearm means any weapon which is designed to or may readily be
- 6 converted to expel any projectile by the action of an explosive or frame

- 8 (2) Firearm silencer means any device for silencing, muffling, or
- 9 <u>diminishing the report of a portable firearm, including any combination</u>
- 10 of parts, designed or redesigned, and intended for use in assembling or

- 23 to be used, is capable of producing death or serious bodily injury; or

- 25 cutting, stabbing, or tearing wounds and which, in the manner it is used
- 26 or intended to be used, is capable of producing death or serious bodily

- 28 (7) (6) Knuckles and brass or iron knuckles means any instrument
- 29 that consists of finger rings or guards made of a hard substance and that
- 30 is designed, made, or adapted for the purpose of inflicting serious
- 31 bodily injury or death by striking a person with a fist enclosed in the

- 2 (8) (7) Machine gun means any firearm, whatever its size and usual
- 3 designation, that shoots automatically more than one shot, without manual

- 6 or redesigned to be attached to a semiautomatic firearm which allows the
- 7 firearm to discharge two or more shots in a burst by activating the

- 10 <u>attached to a semiautomatic firearm the rate of fire of such firearm is</u>
