Approved by the Governor May 22, 2023

Introduced by Arch, 14; at the request of the Governor.

A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to appropriations; to amend Laws 2021, LB380, sections 57, 68, and 83; Laws 2021, LB383, section 25; Laws 2022, LB1011, sections 56, 187, 189, and 190; Laws 2022, LB1014, sections 34 and 49; and Laws 2022, LB1024A, section 3; to define terms; to provide, change, and eliminate appropriations for operation of state government; to repeal the original sections; and to declare an emergency. Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. DEFINITION OF APPROPRIATION PERIOD.

For purposes of this act and any other legislative bill passed by the One Hundred Eighth Legislature, First or Second Session, which appropriates funds, FY2021-22 means the period July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022; FY2022-23 means the period July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023; FY2023-24 means the period July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2024; FY2024-25 means the period July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025; FY2025-26 means the period July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2026; and FY2026-27 means the period July 1, 2026, through June 30, 2027.

Sec. 2. <u>APPROPRIATION LANGUAGE.</u> <u>There are hereby appropriated, for FY2021-22 and FY2022-23, the sums set</u> forth in this act to each agency for each program from the respective funds for the general operations of state government, postsecondary education, capital construction, and state aid, except as otherwise appropriated. Sec. 3. <u>UNEXPENDED BALANCES AND CERTIFIED ENCUMBRANCES</u>.

All General Fund appropriations existing on June 30, 2021, in excess of expended and certified encumbrance amounts are hereby lapsed unless otherwise provided. All Cash Fund and Revolving Fund appropriations existing on June 30, 2021, in excess of expended and certified encumbrance amounts are hereby lapsed unless otherwise expressly provided. All certified encumbrance amounts on June 30, 2021, and June 30, 2022, are hereby reappropriated for FY2021-22 and respectively, which amounts shall be in addition to the amounts FY2022-23, <u>shown in this act.</u>

Sec. 4. <u>REAPPROPRIATION OF BALANCES, FY2021-22 to FY2022-23.</u> In addition to the appropriations set forth in this act, there are hereby reappropriated all unexpended appropriation balances existing on June 30, 2022, for FY2022-23 to the respective agencies, programs, and funds listed in this act, except as otherwise provided in this act.

Sec. 5. <u>NEBRASKA ACCOUNTING SYSTEM MANUAL DEFINITIONS.</u>

The definitions contained in the Nebraska Accounting System Manual, and any amendments thereto, on file with the Clerk of the Legislature are hereby adopted by the Legislature as the definitions for this act, except as provided in section 41 of this act.

DRAWING AND PAYING WARRANTS. Sec. 6.

The Director of Administrative Services shall draw warrants upon the proper fund in the state treasury for an amount not to exceed the appropriations set forth in this act upon presentation of proper documentation. The State Treasurer shall pay the warrants out of the appropriate funds.
