- 3 4-110 Verification of lawful presence in the United
- 4 States pursuant to section 4-108 is not required for:
- 5 (1) Any purpose for which lawful presence in the United
- 6 States is not restricted by law, ordinance, or regulation;
- 7 (2) Assistance for health care services and products, not
- 8 related to an organ transplant procedure, that are necessary for the
- 9 treatment of an emergency medical condition, including emergency
- 10 labor and delivery, manifesting itself by acute symptoms of

(5)—(6) Programs, services, or assistance necessary for the protection of life or safety, such as soup kitchens, crisis counseling and intervention, and short-term shelter, which (a) deliver in-kind services at the community level, including those which deliver such services through public or private, nonprofit agencies and (b) do not condition the provision of assistance, the amount of assistance provided, or the cost of assistance provided on

9 The Legislature finds that unborn children do not have 10 immigration status and therefor are not within the scope of section 11 4-108.
