7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 9-812, Revised Statutes Supplement,
 2013, is amended to read:

3 9-812 (1) All money received from the operation of lottery games conducted pursuant to the State Lottery Act in Nebraska 4 5 shall be credited to the State Lottery Operation Trust Fund, which 6 fund is hereby created. All payments of the costs of establishing and 7 maintaining the lottery games shall be made from the State Lottery 8 Operation Cash Fund. In accordance with legislative appropriations, money for payments for expenses of the division shall be transferred 9 from the State Lottery Operation Trust Fund to the State Lottery 10 11 Operation Cash Fund, which fund is hereby created. All money 12 necessary for the payment of lottery prizes shall be transferred from 13 the State Lottery Operation Trust Fund to the State Lottery Prize 14 Trust Fund, which fund is hereby created. The amount used for the payment of lottery prizes shall not be less than forty percent of the 15 dollar amount of the lottery tickets which have been sold. 16

17 (2) A portion of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets which have been sold on an annualized basis shall be transferred from 18 19 the State Lottery Operation Trust Fund to the Education Innovation 20 Fund, the Nebraska Opportunity Grant Fund, the Nebraska Education Improvement Fund, the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund, the Nebraska 21 State Fair Board, and the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund as 22 23 provided in subsection (3) of this section. The dollar amount transferred pursuant to this subsection shall equal the greater of 24 25 (a) the dollar amount transferred to the funds in fiscal year 2002-03

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or (b) any amount which constitutes at least twenty-two percent and no more than twenty-five percent of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets which have been sold on an annualized basis. To the extent that funds are available, the Tax Commissioner and director may authorize a transfer exceeding twenty-five percent of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets sold on an annualized basis.

7 (3) Of the money available to be transferred to the 8 Education Innovation Fund, the Nebraska Opportunity Grant Fund, the 9 Nebraska Education Improvement Fund, the Nebraska Environmental Trust 10 Fund, the Nebraska State Fair Board, and the Compulsive Gamblers 11 Assistance Fund:

12 (a) The first five hundred thousand dollars shall be 13 transferred to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund to be used as 14 provided in section 9-1006;

15 (b) Beginning July 1, 2016, forty-four and one-half 16 percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and 17 operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive 18 Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the Nebraska 19 Education Improvement Fund;

20 (c) Through June 30, 2016, nineteen and three-fourths 21 percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and 22 operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive 23 Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the Education 24 Innovation Fund;

25 (d) Through June 30, 2016, twenty-four and three-fourths

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1 percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and 2 operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive 3 Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the Nebraska 4 Opportunity Grant Fund;

5 (e) Forty-four and one-half percent of the money 6 remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and the 7 initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be 8 transferred to the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund to be used as 9 provided in the Nebraska Environmental Trust Act;

10 (f) Ten percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the 11 12 Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the 13 Nebraska State Fair Board if the most populous city within the county 14 in which the fair is located provides matching funds equivalent to 15 ten percent of the funds available for transfer. Such matching funds 16 may be obtained from the city and any other private or public entity, 17 except that no portion of such matching funds shall be provided by the state. If the Nebraska State Fair ceases operations, ten percent 18 of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating 19 20 expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the General Fund; and 21

(g) One percent of the money remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund to be used as provided in section

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1 9-1006.

2 (4)(a) The Education Innovation Fund is created. At least
3 seventy-five percent of the lottery proceeds allocated to the
4 Education Innovation Fund shall be available for disbursement.

5 (b) For fiscal year 2012-13, the Education Innovation 6 Fund shall be allocated as follows: (i) The first forty-five thousand 7 dollars shall be transferred to the Excellence in Teaching Cash Fund 8 to fund the Attracting Excellence to Teaching Program; (ii) the next three million three hundred sixty-five thousand nine hundred sixty-9 two dollars shall be distributed to school districts as grants 10 pursuant to the Early Childhood Education Grant Program; (iii) the 11 12 next two million one hundred seventy-five thousand six hundred 13 seventy-three dollars shall be distributed to local systems as grants for approved accelerated or differentiated curriculum programs for 14 15 students identified as learners with high ability pursuant to section 79-1108.02; (iv) the next one hundred eight thousand one hundred 16 thirty-six dollars shall be used by the State Department of Education 17 18 for the development of an integrated early childhood, elementary, 19 secondary, and postsecondary student information system; (v) the next 20 four hundred fifty thousand dollars shall fund the Center for Student Leadership and Extended Learning Act; (vi) the next one hundred 21 fourteen thousand six hundred twenty-nine dollars shall be used by 22 23 the department to fund the multicultural education program created under section 79-720; (vii) the next one hundred twenty-three 24 thousand four hundred sixty-eight dollars shall be used by the 25

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department to employ persons to investigate and prosecute alleged 1 2 violations as provided in section 79-868; (viii) up to the next one 3 hundred sixty thousand dollars shall be used by the department to implement section 79-759; (ix) the next twenty-seven thousand two 4 5 hundred dollars shall be used to fund the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children; (x) the next two 6 7 hundred thousand dollars shall be used to provide grants to establish 8 bridge programs pursuant to sections 79-1189 to 79-1195; and (xi) the amount remaining shall be allocated, after administrative expenses, 9 for distance education equipment and incentives pursuant to sections 10 79-1336 and 79-1337. No funds received as allocations from the 11 12 Education Innovation Fund pursuant to this subdivision may be 13 obligated for payment to be made after June 30, 2016.

14 (c) For fiscal year 2013-14, the Education Innovation 15 Fund shall be allocated as follows: (i) The first one million dollars shall be transferred to the Excellence in Teaching Cash Fund to fund 16 the Excellence in Teaching Act; (ii) the next allocation shall be 17 18 distributed to local systems as grants for approved accelerated or 19 differentiated curriculum programs for students identified as 20 learners with high ability pursuant to section 79-1108.02 in an aggregated amount up to the amount distributed in the prior fiscal 21 year for such purposes increased by the basic allowable growth rate 22 23 pursuant to section 79-1025; (iii) up to the next one hundred sixty thousand dollars shall be used by the State Department of Education 24 to implement section 79-759; (iv) the next one million seven hundred 25

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fifty thousand dollars shall be allocated to early childhood 1 2 education grants awarded by the department pursuant to section 3 79-1103; (v) the next one million dollars shall be transferred to the 4 Early Childhood Education Endowment Cash Fund for use pursuant to 5 section 79-1104.02; (vi) the next two hundred thousand dollars shall be used to provide grants to establish bridge programs pursuant to 6 7 sections 79-1189 to 79-1195; (vii) the next ten thousand dollars 8 shall be used to fund the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children; (viii) the next eighty-five 9 thousand five hundred fifty dollars shall be allocated to the State 10 11 Department of Education for distribution pursuant to section 79-2306; 12 (ix) the amount remaining shall be allocated, after and 13 administrative expenses, for distance education equipment and 14 incentives pursuant to sections 79-1336 and 79-1337. No funds 15 received as allocations from the Education Innovation Fund pursuant 16 to this subdivision may be obligated for payment to be made after 17 June 30, 2016.

(d) For fiscal year 2014-15, the Education Innovation 18 19 Fund shall be allocated as follows: (i) The first one million dollars 20 shall be transferred to the Excellence in Teaching Cash Fund to fund the Excellence in Teaching Act; (ii) the next allocation shall be 21 distributed to local systems as grants for approved accelerated or 22 23 differentiated curriculum programs for students identified as learners with high ability pursuant to section 79-1108.02 in an 24 25 aggregated amount up to the amount distributed in the prior fiscal

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year for such purposes increased by the basic allowable growth rate 1 2 pursuant to section 79-1025; (iii) up to the next one hundred forty-3 five thousand dollars shall be used by the State Department of Education to implement section 79-759; (iv) the next one million 4 5 eight hundred fifty thousand dollars shall be allocated to early 6 childhood education grants awarded by the State Department of 7 Education pursuant to section 79-1103; (iv) the next one million 8 dollars shall be transferred to the Early Childhood Education 9 Endowment Cash Fund for use pursuant to section 79-1104.02; (v) (vi) the next two hundred thousand dollars shall be used to provide grants 10 to establish bridge programs pursuant to sections 79-1189 to 79-1195; 11 12 (vi) (vii) the next ten thousand dollars shall be used to fund the 13 Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children; and (vii) (viii) the amount remaining shall be allocated, after 14 15 administrative expenses, for distance education equipment and incentives pursuant to sections 79-1336 and 79-1337. No funds 16 received as allocations from the Education Innovation Fund pursuant 17 18 to this subdivision may be obligated for payment to be made after June 30, 2016. 19

20 (e) For fiscal year 2015-16, the Education Innovation 21 Fund shall be allocated as follows: (i) The first one million dollars 22 shall be transferred to the Excellence in Teaching Cash Fund to fund 23 the Excellence in Teaching Act; (ii) the next allocation shall be 24 distributed to local systems as grants for approved accelerated or 25 differentiated curriculum programs for students identified as

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learners with high ability pursuant to section 79-1108.02 in an 1 2 aggregated amount up to the amount distributed in the prior fiscal 3 year for such purposes increased by the basic allowable growth rate pursuant to section 79-1025; (iii) up to the next one hundred forty-4 5 five thousand dollars shall be used by the State Department of Education to implement section 79-759; (iv) the next one million nine 6 7 hundred fifty thousand dollars shall be allocated to early childhood 8 education grants awarded by the State Department of Education pursuant to section 79-1103; (iv) (v) the next one million dollars 9 10 shall be transferred to the Early Childhood Education Endowment Cash 11 Fund for use pursuant to section 79-1104.02; (v) (vi) the next ten 12 thousand dollars shall be used to fund the Interstate Compact on 13 Educational Opportunity for Military Children; and (vi) (vii) the 14 amount remaining shall be allocated, after administrative expenses, 15 for distance education equipment and incentives pursuant to sections 79-1336 and 79-1337. No funds received as allocations from the 16 Education Innovation Fund pursuant to this subdivision may be 17 18 obligated for payment to be made after June 30, 2016.

(f) The Education Innovation Fund terminates on June 30,
20 2016. Any money in the fund on such date shall be transferred to the
21 Nebraska Education Improvement Fund on such date.

(5) The Nebraska Education Improvement Fund is created.
The fund shall consist of money transferred pursuant to subsections
(3) and (4) of this section, money transferred pursuant to section
85-1920, and any other funds appropriated by the Legislature. Any

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1 money in the fund available for investment shall be invested by the 2 state investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion 3 Act and the Nebraska State Funds Investment Act.

4 (6) Any money in the State Lottery Operation Trust Fund, 5 the State Lottery Operation Cash Fund, the State Lottery Prize Trust 6 Fund, or the Education Innovation Fund available for investment shall 7 be invested by the state investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska 8 Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds Investment Act.

9 (7) Unclaimed prize money on a winning lottery ticket 10 shall be retained for a period of time prescribed by rules and 11 regulations. If no claim is made within such period, the prize money 12 shall be used at the discretion of the Tax Commissioner for any of 13 the purposes prescribed in this section.

14 (8) It is the intent of the Legislature to replace funding from the Education Innovation Fund with General Fund 15 16 appropriations to the State Department of Education beginning with 17 FY2013-14 for (a) the integrated early childhood, elementary, secondary, and postsecondary student information system, (b) the 18 Center for Student Leadership and Extended Learning Act, (c) the 19 20 multicultural education program created under section 79-720, and (d) 21 the employment of persons to investigate and prosecute alleged violations as provided in section 79-868. 22

25 79-759 Beginning with the 2011-12 school year, the State

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Department of Education may implement a three year pilot project for 1 2 the districtwide administration of a standard college admission test, 3 selected by the State Board of Education, to students in the eleventh grade attending a public school in a participating school district to 4 5 determine if such test (1) would improve the college-going rate and career readiness of Nebraska students and (2) could be utilized as б 7 the assessment for the one grade in high school as required under 8 section 79-760.03. Participation by school districts in the pilot project shall be voluntary and shall be subject to the approval of 9 the board. On or before September 1, 2012, and on or before September 10 1 each year thereafter through 2014, 2016, the department shall 11 12 report to the Governor, the Clerk of the Legislature, and the 13 chairperson of the Education Committee of the Legislature on the pilot project. The report submitted to the Clerk of the Legislature 14 and the committee shall be submitted electronically. The project 15 shall continue through school year 2015-16. The project shall be paid 16 for with funds from the Education Innovation Fund as provided in 17 section 9-812. 18
