- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to juveniles; to adopt the Transition to Adult
- 2 Living Success Program Act.
- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Sections 1 to 6 of this act shall be known and may be

- 2 <u>cited as the Transition to Adult Living Success Program Act.</u>
- 3 Sec. 2. For purposes of the Transition to Adult Living Success
- 4 Program Act:
- 5 (1) Department means the Department of Health and Human Services;
- 6 (2) Eligible participant means an individual who was adjudicated to
- 7 be a juvenile described in subdivision (1), (2), or (3)(b) of section
- 8 43-247 and upon attaining nineteen years of age was in an out-of-home
- 9 placement and had been in an out-of-home placement for at least ninety of
- 10 the one hundred eighty days preceding his or her nineteenth birthday; and
- 11 (3) Program means the Transition to Adult Living Success Program
- 12 <u>established pursuant to section 3 of this act.</u>
- 13 Sec. 3. <u>The department shall establish the Transition to Adult</u>
- 14 Living Success Program. The program shall provide independent living
- 15 <u>services to eligible participants, which services shall include, but are</u>
- 16 not limited to, assessment, securing housing, face-to-face life skills
- 17 training, and assistance in furthering education or employment. The
- 18 program shall provide case management for the achievement of the goals in
- 19 <u>a transition plan developed with the eligible participant as part of the</u>
- 20 program until he or she reaches twenty-one years of age.
- 21 Sec. 4. Eligible participants may request funds for critical needs
- 22 relating to food, shelter, health care, clothing, or other needs as
- 23 approved by the caseworker, not to exceed one thousand dollars per year
- 24 per eligible participant. Individuals who are eligible to participate in
- 25 both the Transition to Adult Living Success Program and the bridge to
- 26 <u>independence program pursuant to section 43-4504 may choose to</u>
- 27 participate in either the Transition to Adult Living Success Program and
- 28 the bridge to independence program but may not participate in both
- 29 programs.
- 30 Sec. 5. The department shall collect data regarding the number of
- 31 participants in the Transition to Adult Living Success Program, the

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1 <u>number of critical needs requests approved, and the purposes of the</u>

- 2 <u>requests. The department shall evaluate the program's overall efficiency</u>
- 3 <u>in achieving the goals in the eligible participant's independent living</u>
- 4 <u>transition proposal pursuant to section 43-285 and shall report annually</u>
- 5 <u>to the Legislature. The report shall be submitted electronically.</u>
- 6 Sec. 6. The department may adopt and promulgate rules and
- 7 regulations to carry out the Transition to Adult Living Success Program
- 8 Act. The department may implement the act through a request for proposals
- 9 process.
