- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to labor; to amend section 48-234, Reissue
- 2 Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to change a provision relating to the
- 3 rights of an adoptive parent to a leave of absence; and to repeal
- 4 the original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 48-234, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 2 amended to read:
- 3 48-234 (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section,
- 4 whenever an employer, including a governmental agency, permits an
- 5 employee to take a leave of absence upon the birth of the employee's
- 6 child, an adoptive parent, following the commencement of the parent-child
- 7 relationship, is entitled to the same leave upon the same terms.
- 8 (2) The adoptive parent leave of absence is not required if the
- 9 child being adopted is a special needs child over eighteen years of age,
- 10 a child who is over eight years of age and is not a special needs child,
- 11 a stepchild being adopted by his or her stepparent, a foster child being
- 12 adopted by his or her foster parent, or a child who was originally under
- 13 a voluntary placement for purposes other than adoption without assistance
- 14 from an attorney, physician, or other individual or agency which later
- 15 results in a petition for the adoption of the child by the person with
- 16 whom the voluntary placement was made.
- 17 (3) For purposes of this section, commencement of the parent-child
- 18 relationship means when the child is placed with the employee for the
- 19 purposes of adoption.
- 20 (4) Whenever an employer, including a governmental agency, refuses
- 21 to extend a child-care leave of absence to an adoptive parent in
- 22 violation of this section, an aggrieved adoptive parent may bring an
- 23 action for equitable relief and damages. In all actions brought pursuant
- 24 to this section, reasonable attorney's fees, as determined by the court,
- 25 shall be awarded to the prevailing party if the prevailing party is the
- 26 adoptive parent.
- 27 Sec. 2. Original section 48-234, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 28 Nebraska, is repealed.
