1	A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to criminal justice; to amend section
2	81-1414.15, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2021; to change a records
3	retention requirement; to require city and county attorneys and the
4	Attorney General to maintain public Brady and Giglio lists; to
5	provide a duty for the Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and
6	Criminal Justice; and to repeal the original section.
7	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 81-1414.15, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2021, is
 amended to read:

81-1414.15 (1) The chief of police, sheriff, Superintendent of Law Enforcement and Public Safety, or the head administrator of a law enforcement agency or an agency employing a law enforcement officer shall submit a personnel change in status form as approved by the council to the director of the training center within seven calendar days after the date a law enforcement officer is hired by the agency or leaves employment with the agency.

10 (2) Each law enforcement agency or agency employing a law 11 enforcement officer shall maintain a record regarding the reason or 12 reasons for, and circumstances surrounding, a separation of service for 13 each law enforcement officer employed by that agency. Such record shall 14 be retained for five years following a law enforcement officer's 15 separation from the agency.

16 (3) Each law enforcement agency or agency employing law а 17 enforcement officer shall maintain any and all records of officer conduct which could constitute grounds for revocation or suspension of a law 18 enforcement certification by the commission. Such record shall include 19 any and all records of conduct which could constitute grounds for 20 revocation or suspension under subdivision (6) of section 81-1403. Such 21 record, which shall include the name of the law enforcement officer, 22 23 shall <u>be permanently retained and shall not</u> be <u>destroyed</u> retained for the 24 duration of the law enforcement officer's employment with the agency and 25 for ten years following his or her separation from the agency.

(4) The chief of police, sheriff, Superintendent of Law Enforcement and Public Safety, or the head administrator of a law enforcement agency or an agency employing a law enforcement officer shall make a report to the commission of any law enforcement officer who is terminated from employment or allowed to resign in lieu of termination for conduct described in subdivision (6) of section 81-1403. The report shall

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include, but not be limited to, a summary of the allegations pertaining
to the officer and identification of any witnesses relevant to the
allegations, and shall be filed with the commission within thirty
calendar days of the termination or resignation in lieu of termination.

5 (5) Failure to comply with this section shall constitute neglect of 6 duty.

7 Sec. 2. (1) Beginning June 1, 2023, each city and county attorney and the Attorney General shall maintain a Brady and Giglio list in 8 accordance with this section. The list shall identify law enforcement 9 officers who, due to misconduct or otherwise, have impaired their own 10 credibility such that disclosure to the defendant is required under Brady 11 v. Maryland, 373 U.S. 83 (1963), and Giglio v. United States, 405 U.S. 12 150 (1972), and subsequent cases of the Supreme Court of the United 13 States and the Supreme Court of Nebraska. The list shall contain a 14 15 description of the reason disclosure is required.

16 (2) The list required by this section is a public document and shall
17 be posted on the city, county, and state website. The list shall be
18 updated at least monthly.

19 (3) On or before January 1, 2023, the Nebraska Commission on Law 20 Enforcement and Criminal Justice shall adopt and promulgate rules and 21 regulations to carry out this section, including, but not limited to, 22 criteria and processes for determining when disclosure is required and 23 what is required to be disclosed.
