## **LEGISLATIVE BILL 933**

#### Committee:

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to utility service; to amend sections 70-1605
- 2 and 70-1606, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to change
- 3 provisions relating to discontinuance of utility service; and to
- 4 repeal the original sections.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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- 1 Section 1. Section 70-1605, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 2 amended to read:
- 3 70-1605 No public or private utility company, other than a municipal
- 4 utility owned and operated by a village, furnishing water, natural gas,
- 5 or electricity at retail in this state shall discontinue service to any
- 6 domestic subscriber for nonpayment of any past-due account unless the
- 7 utility company first gives notice to any subscriber whose service is
- 8 proposed to be terminated. Such notice shall be given in person, by
- 9 first-class mail, or by electronic delivery, except that electronic
- 10 delivery shall only be used if the subscriber has specifically elected to
- 11 receive such notices by electronic delivery. If notice is given by first-
- 12 class mail or electronic delivery, such notice shall be conspicuously
- 13 marked as to its importance. Service shall not be discontinued for at
- 14 least seven days after notice is sent or given. Holidays and weekends
- 15 shall be excluded from the seven days. A public or private utility
- 16 company shall not charge a fee for the discontinuance or reconnection of
- 17 <u>utility service that exceeds the reasonable costs of providing such</u>
- 18 service.
- 19 Sec. 2. Section 70-1606, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 20 amended to read:
- 21 70-1606 (1) The notice required by section 70-1605 shall contain
- 22 the following information:
- 23 (a) (1) The reason for the proposed disconnection;
- (b) (2) A statement of intention to disconnect unless the domestic
- 25 subscriber either pays the bill or reaches an agreement with the utility
- 26 regarding payment of the bill;
- 27  $\underline{\text{(c)}}$  The date upon which service will be disconnected if the
- 28 domestic subscriber does not take appropriate action;
- 29  $\underline{\text{(d)}}$  (4) The name, address, and telephone number of the utility's
- 30 employee or department to whom the domestic subscriber may address any
- 31 inquiry or complaint;

- 1 (e) (5) The domestic subscriber's right, prior to the disconnection
- 2 date, to request a conference regarding any dispute over such proposed
- 3 disconnection;
- 4 (f) (6) A statement that the utility may not disconnect service
- 5 pending the conclusion of the conference;
- 6 (g) (7) A statement to the effect that disconnection shall may be
- 7 postponed or prevented upon presentation of a duly licensed physician's,
- 8 physician assistant's, or advanced practice registered nurse's
- 9 certificate, which shall certify that a domestic subscriber or resident
- 10 within such subscriber's household has an existing illness or handicap
- 11 which would cause such subscriber or resident to suffer an immediate and
- 12 serious health hazard by the disconnection of the utility's service to
- 13 that household. Such certificate shall be filed with the utility within
- 14 five days of receiving notice under this section, excluding holidays and
- 15 <u>weekends</u>, and will prevent the disconnection of the utility's service for
- 16 a period of <u>at least sixty</u> thirty days from such filing. Only one
- 17 postponement of disconnection shall be required allowed under this
- 18 subdivision for each incidence of nonpayment of any past-due account;
- 19  $\frac{\text{(h)}}{\text{(8)}}$  The cost that will be borne by the domestic subscriber for
- 20 restoration of service;
- 21 (i) (9) A statement that the domestic subscriber may arrange with
- 22 the utility for an installment payment plan;
- 23 (j) <del>(10)</del> A statement to the effect that those domestic subscribers
- 24 who are welfare recipients may qualify for assistance in payment of their
- 25 utility bill and that they should contact their caseworker in that
- 26 regard; and
- 27  $\frac{(k)}{(11)}$  Any additional information not inconsistent with this
- 28 section which has received prior approval from the board of directors or
- 29 administrative board of any utility.
- 30 (2) A public or private utility company, other than a municipal
- 31 <u>utility owned and operated by a village, shall make the service</u>

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- 1 <u>termination information required under subdivisions (d), (e), (f), (g),</u>
- 2 (i), (j), and (k) of subsection (1) of this section readily accessible to
- 3 the public on the web site of the utility company and available by mail
- 4 <u>upon request.</u>
