- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 71-801, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,

- 2 2020, is amended to read:
- 3 71-801 Sections 71-801 to 71-830 and sections 2 to 6 of this act
- 4 shall be known and may be cited as the Nebraska Behavioral Health
- 5 Services Act.
- 6 Sec. 2. Sections 2 to 6 of this act shall be known and may be cited
- 7 <u>as the Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic Act.</u>
- 8 Sec. 3. The intent of the Legislature is to increase access to
- 9 mental health and substance use treatment and expand capacity to address
- 10 <u>increased need, including the opioid overdose crisis, and establish</u>
- 11 <u>innovative community partnerships with law enforcement, schools, and</u>
- 12 <u>hospitals to improve care, reduce recidivism, and address health</u>
- 13 <u>disparities.</u>
- 14 Sec. 4. For purposes of the Certified Community Behavioral Health
- 15 Clinic Act:
- 16 (1) Certified community behavioral health clinic means any mental
- 17 health substance use treatment center as defined in section 71-423
- 18 <u>licensed by the department that meets the federal certification criteria</u>
- 19 of the federal Protecting Access to Medicare Act of 2014 and provides the
- 20 <u>following services as defined by the department:</u>
- 21 (a) Outpatient mental health and substance use services;
- 22 (b) Crisis response and hotline services;
- 23 (c) Screening, assessment, and diagnosis, including risk
- 24 <u>assessments;</u>
- 25 (d) Person-centered treatment planning;
- 26 (e) Primary care screening and monitoring of key indicators of
- 27 health risks;
- (f) Targeted case management;
- 29 (g) Psychiatric rehabilitation services;
- 30 (h) Peer support and family supports;
- 31 (i) Medication-assisted treatment;

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- 1 (j) Assertive community treatment; and
- 2 (k) Community-based mental health care for military service members
- 3 and veterans; and
- 4 (2) Prospective payment system means a daily or monthly medicaid
- 5 payment methodology that allows providers to be reimbursed based on
- 6 <u>anticipated costs of providing required services to persons enrolled in</u>
- 7 medicaid.
- 8 Sec. 5. Each certified community behavioral health clinic shall
- 9 <u>make translation services or interpreters available as necessary to</u>
- 10 provide services under this act.
- 11 Sec. 6. (1) The department shall develop a prospective payment
- 12 <u>system under the medical assistance program for funding certified</u>
- 13 <u>community behavioral health clinics</u>. Such system shall permit either
- 14 <u>daily or monthly payment rates.</u>
- 15 (2) The department shall submit to the federal Centers for Medicare
- 16 <u>and Medicaid Services any approval request necessary for a medicaid state</u>
- 17 plan amendment to implement this section.
- 18 (3) Subject to such approval, such prospective payment system shall
- 19 <u>be implemented before January 1, 2023.</u>
- 20 Sec. 7. <u>The department shall adopt and promulgate rules and</u>
- 21 <u>regulations to implement sections 2 to 5 of this act.</u>
- 22 Sec. 8. Original section 71-801, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 23 Supplement, 2020, is repealed.
- 24 Sec. 9. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
- 25 passed and approved according to law.
