# **LEGISLATIVE BILL 997**

Introduced by Day, 49.

#### Committee:

- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to schools; to amend sections 79-214 and
- 2 79-220, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to change provisions
- 3 relating to entrance requirements; to harmonize provisions; and to
- 4 repeal the original sections.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 79-214, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 2 amended to read:
- 3 79-214 (1)(a) Except as provided in subdivision (1)(b) of this
- 4 section, the school board of any school district shall not admit any
- 5 child into the kindergarten of any school of such school district unless
- 6 such child has reached the age of five years on or before July 31 of the
- 7 calendar year in which the school year for which the child is seeking
- 8 admission begins.
- 9 (b) The board shall admit a child who will reach the age of five
- 10 years on or after August 1 and on or before October 15 of such school
- 11 year if the parent or guardian requests such entrance and provides an
- 12 affidavit stating that (i) the child attended kindergarten in another
- 13 jurisdiction in the current school year, (ii) the family anticipates
- 14 relocation to another jurisdiction that would allow admission within the
- 15 current year, or (iii) the child is capable of carrying the work of
- 16 kindergarten which can be demonstrated through a recognized assessment
- 17 procedure approved by the board. Each school board shall, for purposes of
- 18 this subdivision, approve and make available a recognized assessment
- 19 procedure for determining if a child is capable of carrying the work of
- 20 kindergarten. The school board shall update approved procedures as the
- 21 board deems appropriate.
- 22 (2) The school board of each school district shall comply with the
- 23 requirements of subsection (2) of section 43-2007.
- 24 (3)(a) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the school
- 25 board of each school district and shall require evidence of:
- 26  $\underline{\text{(i)}}$  (a) A physical examination by a physician, a physician
- 27 assistant, or an advanced practice registered nurse, practicing under and
- 28 in accordance with his or her respective certification act, within six
- 29 months prior to the entrance of a child into the beginner grade and the
- 30 seventh grade or, in the case of a transfer from out of state, to any
- 31 other grade of the local school;

- 1 (ii) A and (b) a visual evaluation by a physician, a physician
- 2 assistant, an advanced practice registered nurse, or an optometrist
- 3 within six months prior to the entrance of a child into the beginner
- 4 grade or, in the case of a transfer from out of state, to any other grade
- 5 of the local school, which consists of testing for amblyopia, strabismus,
- 6 and internal and external eye health, with testing sufficient to
- 7 determine visual acuity; and
- 8 (iii) For school year 2023-24 and each school year thereafter, a
- 9 screening for autism spectrum disorder by a physician, a physician
- 10 assistant, an advanced practice registered nurse, school nurse, school
- 11 psychiatrist, or other individual trained in the administration of
- 12 <u>screenings for autism spectrum disorder conducted using an evidence-based</u>
- 13 <u>developmental screening tool specifically for autism appropriate to the</u>
- 14 age of the child.
- 15 <u>(b) No</u> , except that no such physical examination, or visual
- 16 evaluation, or screening shall be required of any child whose parent or
- 17 guardian objects in writing.
- 18 <u>(c)</u> The cost of such physical examination, and visual evaluation,
- 19 <u>and screening</u> shall be borne by the parent or guardian of each child who
- 20 is examined.
- 21 Sec. 2. Section 79-220, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 22 amended to read:
- 23 79-220 At the time the parent or guardian of any child is notified
- 24 that such child must have a physical examination, and a visual
- 25 evaluation, and screening for autism spectrum disorder pursuant to
- 26 section 79-214 or immunizations pursuant to section 79-217, the parent or
- 27 guardian shall also be notified in writing of (1) his or her right to
- 28 submit a written statement refusing <u>such</u> a physical examination, a visual
- 29 evaluation, screening or immunization for his or her child and (2) a
- 30 telephone number or other contact information to assist the parent or
- 31 guardian in receiving information regarding free or reduced-cost visual
