PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

Introduced by Wayne, 13. Read first time January 16, 2024 Committee:

THE MEMBERS OF THE ONE HUNDRED EIGHTH LEGISLATURE OF NEBRASKA,
SECOND SESSION, RESOLVE THAT:

3 Section 1. At the general election in November 2024, the following 4 proposed amendment to the Constitution of Nebraska shall be submitted to 5 the electors of the State of Nebraska for approval or rejection:

To amend Article IV, section 13:

7 IV-13 The Legislature shall provide by law for the establishment of a Board of Parole and the qualifications of its members. Said board, or a 8 majority thereof, shall have power to grant paroles after conviction and 9 judgment, under such conditions as may be prescribed by law, for any 10 offenses committed against the criminal laws of this state except treason 11 and cases of impeachment. The Governor, Attorney General and Secretary of 12 13 State, sitting as a board, shall have power to remit fines and forfeitures and to grant respites, reprieves, pardons, or commutations in 14 all cases of conviction for offenses against the laws of the state, 15 except treason and cases of impeachment. The Board of Parole may advise 16 the Governor, Attorney General and Secretary of State on the merits of 17 any application for remission, respite, reprieve, pardon or commutation 18 but such advice shall not be binding on them. The Governor shall have 19 power to suspend the execution of the sentence imposed for treason until 20 21 the case can be reported to the Legislature at its next session, when the Legislature shall either grant a pardon, or commute the sentence or 22 direct the execution, or grant a further reprieve. 23
