AN ACT

RELATING TO ENDANGERED PERSONS; CREATING A SILVER ALERT PROCEDURE FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY; RECONCILING MULTIPLE AMENDMENTS TO THE SAME SECTION OF LAW IN LAWS 2010.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. A new section of the Missing Persons Information and Reporting Act is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] SILVER ALERT ADVISORY.--

- The department of public safety shall issue a silver alert if, after review and investigation of a missing person report of a person subject to the alert, the department makes an independent determination that the missing person is a person subject to the alert.
- The department shall develop and implement silver alert procedures for the purpose of disseminating, as .191316.3

1	rapidly as possible, information about a person subject to the							
2	alert. The procedures shall include:							
3	(1) notification to the lead station of the

5	(2) notification to other public and private
