| 18 | SECTION 1. Section 9-19-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1987, |
| 19 | Chapter 254, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read: |
| 20 | "9-19-2. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Department of |
| 21 | Public Safety Act: |
| 22 | A. "department" means the department of public |
| 23 | safety; [and] |
| 24 | B. "public corruption offense" means: |
| 25 | (1) violating the ethical principles of public |
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| 1 | service, as provided in Subsection D of Section 10-16-3 NMSA |
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| 2 | <u>1978;</u> |
| 3 | (2) taking an official act for personal |
| 4 | financial interest, as provided in Section 10-16-4 NMSA 1978; |
| 5 | (3) paying or receiving public money for |
| 6 | services not rendered, as provided in Section 30-23-2 NMSA |
| 7 | <u>1978;</u> |
| 8 | (4) making or permitting false public voucher, |
| 9 | as provided in Section 30-23-3 NMSA 1978; |

| 25 | SECTION 2. Section 9-19-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1987, |
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| 1 | Chapter 254 Section (as emended) is emended to meed |
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| 1 | Chapter 254, Section 4, as amended) is amended to read: |
| 2 | "9-19-4. DEPARTMENT ESTABLISHEDThere is created in the |
| 3 | executive branch the "department of public safety". The |
| 4 | department shall be a cabinet department and shall consist of, |
| 5 | but not be limited to, [five] six program divisions, an |
| 6 | administrative division and an information technology division |
| 7 | as follows: |
| 8 | A. the New Mexico state police division; |
| 9 | B. the special investigations division; |
| 10 | C. the training and recruiting division; |
| 11 | D. the technical support division; |
| 12 | E. the administrative services division; |
| 13 | F. the motor transportation division; [and] |
| 14 | G. the information technology division; and |
| 15 | H. the public corruption investigations and |
| 16 | prosecution division." |
| 17 | SECTION 3. Section 9-19-7 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1987, |
| 18 | Chapter 254, Section 7, as amended) is amended to read: |
| 19 | "9-19-7. ORGANIZATIONAL UNITS OF DEPARTMENTPOWERS AND |
| 20 | DUTIES SPECIFIED BY LAWACCESS TO INFORMATION |
| 21 | A. The organizational units of the department and |
| 22 | the officers of those units specified by law shall have all the |
| 23 | powers and duties enumerated in the specific laws involved. |
| 24 | However, the carrying out of those powers and duties shall be |
| 25 | subject to the direction and supervision of the secretary, who |
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1 shall retain the final decision-making authority and 2 responsibility for the administration of any such laws as 3 provided in Subsection B of Section 9-19-6 NMSA 1978. The department shall have access to all records, data and 4 5 information of other state departments, agencies and institutions, including its own organizational units, not 6 7 specifically held confidential by law.

The New Mexico state police division shall 8 Β. 9 consist of the commissioned officers and civilian personnel, including all communications equipment operators, of the New 10 Mexico state police uniform division and the commissioned 12 officers and civilian personnel of the New Mexico state police criminal division and such other personnel as may be assigned by the secretary or by the governor pursuant to an executive order as authorized in the Department of Public Safety Act. 15

C. The special investigations division shall consist of the enforcement personnel of the department of alcoholic beverage control and such other personnel as may be assigned by the secretary or by the governor pursuant to an executive order as authorized in the Department of Public Safety Act. The division is responsible for the enforcement of the New Mexico Bingo and Raffle Act and the Liquor Control Act.

D. The technical support division shall consist of functions such as communications, crime laboratory and records.

Ε. The training and recruiting division shall

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consist of the personnel of the New Mexico law enforcement academy, the New Mexico state police training division and all other training personnel and functions of the department as the secretary may transfer to this division.

F. The administrative services division shall
consist of the administrative services and services divisions
of the New Mexico state police and those administrative support
personnel of the other existing departments, divisions or
offices as the secretary deems necessary.

G. The public corruption investigations and 10 prosecution division shall consist of functions relating to the 11 12 investigation and prosecution of public corruption offenses in the state. The division shall have the authority to issue 13 subpoenas for use in any pending cause in any administrative 14 proceeding or in any of the courts of the state, and the 15 subpoenas issued by the division may be enforced through any 16 district court of the state. The division may perform other 17 such duties relating to the investigation and prosecution of 18 public corruption as may be assigned by the governor or the 19 20 secretary."

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
