1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO: 2 SECTION 1. [NEW MATERIAL] SHORT TITLE.--This act may be cited as the "Patient Safe Staffing Act". 3 SECTION 2. [NEW MATERIAL] DEFINITIONS.--As used in the 4 5 Patient Safe Staffing Act: "committee" means a nursing staffing committee; 6 Α. 7 Β. "critical-access hospital" means a hospital 8 that: 9 (1)has twenty-five or fewer acute care inpatient beds; 10 (2) is located more than thirty-five miles 11 12 from another hospital; (3) maintains an annual average length of stay 13 of ninety-six hours or less for acute care patients; and 14 (4) provides emergency care services twenty-15 four hours a day, seven days a week; 16 "department" means the department of health; C. 17 D. "hospital" means any general or special hospital 18 licensed by the department, whether publicly or privately 19 owned; 20 "nurse" means a registered nurse or a licensed Ε. 21 practical nurse; 22 "patient abandonment" means a nurse's unilateral F. 23 severance of an established nurse-patient relationship without 24 giving reasonable notice in accordance with hospital policy so 25 .212153.1 - 2 -

J. "unlicensed assistive personnel" means a 10 certified nursing assistant, a technician, an aide, a unit 11 12 secretary, an orderly or any other unlicensed personnel who assist in the provision of direct patient care. 13

[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] COMMITTEE REQUIRED.--A hospital SECTION 3. shall have a committee, chaired by the director of nursing, composed as follows:

sixty percent of the members shall be nurses who Α. provide direct patient care during at least fifty percent of their work time but who are not hospital nurse managers or hospital administrators, at least one of whom provides direct care in a nurse specialty unit; and

the other members shall be other qualified Β. persons as determined by the hospital.

[NEW MATERIAL] DUTIES OF COMMITTEE.--A SECTION 4. committee shall:

1 develop a staffing plan for each of the Α. 2 hospital's units;

select outcome indicators for each unit from 3 Β. among the national database of nursing quality indicators, hospital compare, patient satisfaction surveys and such other appropriate standards as determined by the committee;

C. conduct an annual or more frequent review of the staffing plan for each unit to update or modify the staffing plan as determined by the committee; and

conduct an annual or more frequent review of D. outcome indicators for each unit to update or modify the outcome indicators as determined by the committee.

SECTION 5. [NEW MATERIAL] NURSING STAFFING PLAN REQUIREMENTS. -- Each unit's staffing plan shall:

specify the minimum number of nurses and Α. unlicensed assistive personnel required for each shift on the unit based upon the level of intensity of care required by patients and the variability in the number of admissions, discharges and transfers under existing conditions;

Β. take into account that critical access hospitals are regulated by the department of health;

C. ensure that a nurse receives adequate orientation before being assigned to a unit; and

D. specify circumstances, such as a declared state of emergency, under which compliance with the staffing plan may .212153.1 - 4 -

2 SECTION 6. [NEW MATERIAL] NURSING STAFFING LEVELS .--Nursing staffing levels shall take into 3 Α. 4 consideration: 5 recommendations from the hospital's chief (1)6 nursing officer, direct patient care nurses, unlicensed 7 assistive personnel, professional nursing organizations and 8 other appropriate resources as determined by the committee; 9 (2) the characteristics of patients in each 10 unit, including patient acuity as well as variability in the number of discharges, admissions and transfers per shift; 11 12 (3) available medical and health information 13 technology and systems resources; 14 (4) the education, training and experience of nurses who provide direct patient care for the purpose of 15 staffing a unit with an appropriate mix of more-experienced and 16 less-experienced nurses based on patients' needs; 17 (5) the ability to meet the needs of the 18 19 community being served; and 20 (6) such other appropriate factors as determined by the committee. 21 Nursing staffing levels for each unit shall be 22 Β. determined by majority vote of the committee. 23 C. A hospital shall formulate and adopt procedures 24 for flexibility in nursing staffing levels determined by the 25 .212153.1 - 5 -

1 committee during surges and declines in patient census. 2 D. A hospital shall not achieve nursing staffing levels with mandated overtime. 3 [NEW MATERIAL] RIGHT TO REFUSE ASSIGNMENT .--SECTION 7. 4 5 A nurse may refuse an assignment exclusively Α. under the following circumstances: 6 7 (1) the nurse lacks the requisite education, 8 training and experience to ensure patient safety; or 9 (2) the assignment is outside the nurse's 10 scope of practice. Nothing in this section shall be construed to 11 Β. 12 equate a nurse's refusal of an assignment with patient 13 abandonment. 14 SECTION 8. [NEW MATERIAL] HOSPITAL POSTING AND REPORTING OF NURSING STAFFING LEVELS .--15 Within one hour of the start of each shift, a 16 Α. 17 hospital shall conspicuously post a daily report next to posted patient rights in each of its units that contain the: 18 19 (1)actual patient census for each shift in 20 that unit; staffing level for each shift, according 21 (2) to the staffing plan for such unit; and 22 actual staffing level for each shift in 23 (3) that unit. 24 25 Β. C. On a quarterly basis, a hospital shall electronically submit to the department for public disclosure on the department's website, on a date and in a format and form prescribed by the department, an accurate report containing the:

(1) information required in Subsection A of this section for each day of the previous quarter; and

9 (2) number of daily admissions, discharges and10 transfers for each shift of each unit.

SECTION 9. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] DUTIES OF DEPARTMENT.--The department shall:

A. prescribe the format, form and due date for a hospital's quarterly submission of the report required of a hospital pursuant to Subsection C of Section 8 of the Patient Safe Staffing Act. The department shall require information contained in each hospital's quarterly reports to be reported in a uniform and clearly understandable format that permits consumers of hospital services to make meaningful comparisons of nursing staffing levels;

B. promptly publish each quarterly report required of a hospital pursuant to Subsection C of Section 8 of the Patient Safe Staffing Act on its internet website for public inspection;

C. perform an audit if the information contained in .212153.1

underscored material = new [bracketed material] = delete a quarterly report required of a hospital pursuant to Subsection C of Section 8 of the Patient Safe Staffing Act gives rise to a reasonable suspicion that there is a discrepancy in the report or that an inappropriate staffing level has occurred;

D. enforce a hospital's compliance with the 6 7 provisions of the Patient Safe Staffing Act and with any related rules promulgated by the department to implement the 8 9 provisions of that act through the imposition of penalties and corrective action, which information shall also be published on 10 the department's website proximate to the quarterly reports 11 12 required pursuant to Subsection C of Section 8 of the Patient Safe Staffing Act; 13

E. create a process pursuant to which:

(1) aggrieved persons may file complaints forviolations of the provisions of the Patient Safe Staffing Act;

(2) the department investigates the factsalleged in these complaints; and

(3) the department issues a report and takes appropriate action to ensure that a hospital is in compliance with the provisions of the Patient Safe Staffing Act and department rules and any related orders; and

F. promulgate such rules as are necessary to implement and enforce the provisions of the Patient Safe Staffing Act.

1 SECTION 10. [NEW MATERIAL] WHISTLEBLOWER PROTECTION .-- A 2 hospital shall not discriminate or retaliate in any manner 3 against an employee as a result of a grievance or complaint 4 initiated by the employee relating to: 5 a committee or plan; Α. the posting or reporting of, or the failure to 6 Β. 7 post or report, daily nursing staffing level information 8 required by the Patient Safe Staffing Act; and 9 C. the exercise of the right to refuse an 10 assignment pursuant to the Patient Safe Staffing Act. 11 SECTION 11. [NEW MATERIAL] ACTIONS FOR VIOLATIONS--12 INJUNCTIVE RELIEF .-- Whenever it appears that the department is 13 not enforcing the provisions of the Patient Safe Staffing Act 14 or any department rule promulgated pursuant to that act, the attorney general or a party aggrieved or potentially aggrieved 15 by that violation may file suit in the district court of any 16 17 county for injunctive relief to enforce the provisions of the 18 Patient Safe Staffing Act or department rules. 19 SECTION 12. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] NON-EXCLUSIVITY OF OTHER 20 RIGHTS AND REMEDIES.--The rights and remedies provided for in the Patient Safe Staffing Act are not exclusive and shall be in 21 addition to any other rights or remedies provided for in any 22 other law or available under common law. 23 - 9 -24 25
