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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	SECTION 1. A new section of the Health Care Purchasing
18	Act is enacted to read:
19	"[ <u>NEW MATERIAL</u> ] COVERAGE FOR AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDER

21	A. Group health coverage, including any form of
22	self-insurance, offered, issued or renewed under the Health
23	Care Purchasing Act shall provide coverage for an eligible
24	individual who is nineteen years of age or younger, or an
25	eligible individual who is twenty-two years of age or younger

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1 and is enrolled in high school, for: 2 (1) well-baby and well-child screening for 3 diagnosing the presence of autism spectrum disorder; and (2) treatment of autism spectrum disorder 4 5 through speech therapy, occupational therapy, physical therapy and applied behavioral analysis. 6 7 Β. Coverage required pursuant to Subsection A of this section: 8 9 (1)shall be limited to treatment that is prescribed by the insured's treating physician in accordance 10 with a treatment plan; 11 12 (2) shall not be denied on the basis that the services are habilitative or rehabilitative in nature; 13 14 (3) may be subject to other general exclusions of the group health coverage, including coordination of 15 benefits, participating provider requirements, restrictions on 16 services provided by family or household members and 17 utilization review of health care services, including the 18 review of medical necessity, case management and other managed 19 20 care provisions; and (4) may be limited to exclude coverage for 21 services received under the federal Individuals with 22 Disabilities Education Improvement Act of 2004 and related 23 state laws that place responsibility on state and local school 24 boards for providing specialized education and related services 25 .190964.1

C. The coverage required pursuant to Subsection A
of this section shall not be subject to deductibles or
coinsurance provisions that are less favorable to a covered
individual than the deductibles or coinsurance provisions that
apply to physical illnesses that are generally covered under
the group health coverage, except as otherwise provided in
Subsection B of this section.

D. A group health plan shall not deny or refuse health coverage for medically necessary services or refuse to contract with, renew, reissue or otherwise terminate or restrict health coverage for an individual because the individual is diagnosed as having autism spectrum disorder.

E. The treatment plan required pursuant to Subsection B of this section shall include all elements necessary for the group health coverage to pay claims appropriately. These elements include, but are not limited to:

(1) the diagnosis;

(2) the proposed treatment by types;
(3) the frequency and duration of treatment;
(4) the anticipated outcomes stated as goals;
(5) the frequency with which the treatment
plan will be updated; and

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the signature of the treating physician.

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This section shall not be construed as limiting F. benefits and coverage otherwise available to an insured under group health coverage.

The provisions of this section shall not apply G. to policies intended to supplement major medical group-type coverages such as medicare supplement, long-term care, disability income, specified disease, accident-only, hospital indemnity or other limited-benefit health insurance policies.

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Η. As used in this section:

"autism spectrum disorder" means a (1) condition that meets the diagnostic criteria for the pervasive 12 developmental disorders published in the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, fourth edition, text 13 14 revision, also known as DSM-IV-TR, published by the American psychiatric association, including autistic disorder; 15 Asperger's disorder; pervasive development disorder not 16 otherwise specified; Rett's disorder; and childhood 17 disintegrative disorder; 18

"habilitative or rehabilitative services" (2)means treatment programs that are necessary to develop, maintain and restore to the maximum extent practicable the functioning of an individual; and

"high school" means a school providing (3) instruction for any of the grades nine through twelve."

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
